The undersigned elected officials thank the NY Public Service Commission (PSC) for initiating this ground-breaking proceeding. A managed, equitable, affordable transition from fossil fuels to renewable energy is in the best interests of our constituents and all New Yorkers. It is incumbent upon the PSC to enact a well-researched, comprehensive plan to align New York's gas utilities with the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA). We must ensure all people in New York have the energy needed for heating, hot water, and cooking, and that access to renewable options for these services is provided in a timely, orderly, and affordable manner.

We whole-heartedly support this proceeding. In the aftermath of chaotic gas moratoria declared in 2019 by some utilities, the State must require utilities to plan better for the future, and this planning must take climate goals into account. Such chaotic situations impose an extra cost to local governments and residents.

We ask the PSC to use this proceeding to impose measurable emissions reduction requirements on gas utilities to achieve the goals of the CLCPA. Climate change is rapidly exceeding worst case predictions; aggressive goals and benchmarks for energy transition are needed to get ahead of the escalating speed of the climate emergency.

Additionally, the following outcomes are needed to ensure the gas planning proceeding is successful:

NYSERDA must provide guidance and resources to cities and towns for responsible development. New construction is one of the drivers of gas expansion, but it is often more economical for new buildings to go "all electric" with energy efficiency, heat pumps, and induction stoves, rather than investing in outdated fossil fuel combustion technologies. Local municipalities and cities need planning resources to help their local residents and businesses avoid costly retrofits, stranded assets, and crises due to gas moratoria.

Require steps to ensure affordability and resilience of the electric grid. As heating costs shift from the gas bill to the electric bill, the Commission must work to make electricity more affordable to customers, especially those struggling already to pay their bills.

Require gas and electric utilities to plan comprehensively together so that as customers are shifted to renewable thermal energy for heating and cooking, there is a renewable-based electricity supply to provide the power for those uses.

As we move to fully electric heating and cooking, consequences of outages will become more severe. Direct the utilities to invest more in electric grid resilience and reliability, such as buried power lines in areas with high outages, distributed electricity generation, and renewably powered microgrids.

We look forward to working with you to help our communities transition from fossil fuels. A comprehensive planning process, resources for municipalities to support this transition, and a focus on affordability will ensure that we can avoid chaotic gas moratoria and ensure an orderly transition to renewable heating.
