CASE 12-T-0574 - Petition of Minard Run Oil Company to Amend its Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to Relocate 2,800 Feet of Pipeline in the Town of Seneca Falls, Seneca County.

NOTICE SOLICITING COMMENTS

(Issued February 11, 2013)

On August 16, 1984, the Public Service Commission granted a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (Certificate) to Union Drilling, Inc.,¹ authorizing, subject to conditions, the construction of an approximately 9.95 mile 8-inch natural gas transmission pipeline in Seneca County. In a petition filed December 20, 2012, pursuant to Section 121(3) of the Public Service Law (PSL), Minard Run Oil Company requests that the Certificate be amended to authorize the relocation of approximately 2,800 feet of the pipeline due to the expansion of Seneca Meadows Landfill, in the Town of Seneca Falls. The new 2,550 foot section of 8-inch pipeline will be located in a new-right-of-way east of Seneca Meadows, along Route 414, in the Town of Seneca Falls. Construction is planned for spring 2013.
