Dear Acting Secretary Cohen,

Often in communication pictures speak louder than words. I am including with this letter those actual pictures I took of the Orangeville Stony Creek Energy LLC substation in Orangeville. On June 6, 2013 we had a rain event. Very often, because Orangeville is a wetland area, rain will cause flooding, soil movement and erosion. June 6<sup>th</sup> and June 7<sup>th</sup> was no different. We had a call that at Turbine 41 road site the culvers were not replaced by Invenergy during construction and water was running into Norm Vetter's yard, taking our his vegetable garden and sending water into his well. His neighbor had a flood issue from this road and construction site as well.

I was called to notify the DEC, Charles Rosenburg. Chuck called Mr. Murray of the DEC water management. The emergency SWPP Team was called. In my pictures you will see the water running over barriers next to wetlands and **dark soil** pooling and run off.

The reason I mention the dark soil is because the photos sent to you by Invenergy on turbine site 43 and the substation are not of Orangeville. The soil is sandy colored and the pictures are very doctored up. In their pictures they want you to believe everything is beautiful and going as planned. That is far from the truth. I will copy in the photos taken on June 6, 2013 and June 7, 2013 by myself, Linda Mason and my husband Ron Lomanto.

Please look carefully. The photos of the Substation show a sludge pond, water generator pump, ponding and water drainage in most of the Centerline Rd. Orangeville location. Notice our soil is not sand colored. It is dark rich soil much of it representing the wetland quality of the land in Orangeville.

I find this a sad depiction of what was once a beautiful area with glorious homes valued in the hundreds of thousand dollars. Our homes are for sale but they are not selling since the wind farm construction. My home is for sale, it is a wonderful location in a wooded are. My realtor says it is a very beautiful home, but no one is looking now. No one wants to live in and Industrial Wind Farm. I guess my investment is now a loss and I will have to let the bank have it. I can no longer count on my ninety year home owner's investment to help me in my retirement. I do not know what I will do. My ears are bothering me from the Sheldon Wind Farm. The infrasound has begun to aggravate my ears and my sleep, the Sheldon Industrial Wind Farm has six wind turbines one mile from my house and the Orangeville/Sheldon Energy LLC Industrial Wind Farm will give me four more turbines at 4000 feet from my house. The sound, the infrasound and the sleepless nights has changed my life forever. I am a

musician and now my hearing may be at risk. I did not want an Industrial Wind Farm in my back yard or in my neighborhood. I did not ask for this. My neighbors and I are in tears, we are in desperate states because of the Industrial Wind Farm we are force to live in. I myself have lost a serious part of my life investment and now am looking at leaving my nineteen year home to live somewhere, somewhere that I do not have to look at, hear or be affected by these atrocious, obsolete Turbines.

I am sure none of the Commission lives in an Industrial Wind Farm. I am not even sure if you have come to stay for an extended period of time to witness the terrible view, noise, vibration and infrasound. You can stay at my house if you want to experience the construction noise. Soon we will hear pounding of the pile drivers and then we can look forward to continuous sound and vibration.
