Dear Ms. Helmer:

I am writing in response to your June 29, 2018 letter requesting a list of the additional 3,044 addresses in Albany, Buffalo, Mt. Vernon, Rochester, Syracuse and Schenectady that the Commission determined were not eligible as new passings in its Order dated June 14, 2018 in Case 15-M-0388.<sup>1</sup> On June 29, 2018, Charter requested a list of these additional 3,044 addresses in order to fully review the June 14, 2018 Order.

<sup>1</sup> In an Order to Show Cause issued on March 19, 2018 in the same case, the Commission proposed to disqualify 1,052 addresses in these six upstate cities as a result of a Staff field audit. The 3,044 addresses referred to here are incremental to the 1,052, for a total of 4,096 addresses in Albany, Buffalo, Mt. Vernon, Rochester, Syracuse and Schenectady that the Commission has now disqualified as eligible passings.

Please find attached an excel spreadsheet containing the 4,096 addresses from the six upstate cities the Commission disqualified as eligible passings in its June Order, which includes the 3,044 addresses requested by Charter.
