I am writing to express my deep concern regarding the potential undermining of Suffolk County Article 7 law, which was enacted to protect Long Island's sole source of drinking water.

For 17 years now, Article 7 has never been challenged, altered or compromised by any political party or industry special interest. It has stood as a dependable and necessary safeguard for the protection and long-term viability of our federally designated sole source aquifer, the first and only of its kind in our nation. Regrettably, it has come to my attention that PPL Global, an outside, privately-owned merchant power plant company, is seeking a waiver for Suffolk County Article 7 which would permit them to store bulk reserves of hazardous chemicals and back up fuel over this sensitive drinking water supply. This request is not only outrageous, but insulting to the millions of residents who rely on clean, safe drinking water every day and depend on Article 7 to protect this resource now and into the future.

Any consideration of a waiver for PPL to store such dangerous materials is a direct violation of Article 7 and should not be granted under any circumstances. In addition, should this waiver be granted, the county would be setting a dangerous precedent for similar requests from outside interests who wish to exercise similar intentions. Unfortunately, New York State Article X siting law has the power to override this important county law, and the threat of this power has now become dangerously real. The Suffolk County Health Department must exercise its right to defend Article 7 Law to New York State siting officials and uphold this mandate for the future benefit of its residents and our shared environment.

I urge you to stand firm against any request from PPL, or any other applicants, to store toxic chemicals above our precious drinking water supplies. This law was enacted to serve a very critical and indispensable purpose, and should never be compromised or undermined in any manner, for any reason. We trust that the Suffolk County Health Department and its affiliate counterparts will do their part to ensure the future viability and safety of our region's precious drinking water supplies.

Your e-mail of February 18, 2002 to Governor Pitaki was forwarded to me for a further response. I am sorry to hear that you are afraid of the proposed power plant, but I am glad you let us know how you feel. I hope you will not be afraid any more, however, because it is way to early for anyone to say if the proposed plant will be built or not and if, so, under what conditions. There are Federal and State Laws that require a careful review process that takes about one year to complete. We are only near the very beginning of that process. The process is aimed at learning what all of the impacts of the proposed plant would likely be, both positive and negative, whether the negative impacts would be reasonably minimized, whether all state and local laws would be met, whether the requirements of certain federal laws concerning water and air impacts would be met, and whether the proposed facility would be in the public interest overall. Whether the proposed facility would cause cancer is just one example of many issues typically analyzed in this review process. I know this from experience because I am one of the two Judges assigned to over see the review process and to make sure it is fair and efficient. The seven State officials that make up the Siting Board and the Department of Environmental Conservation Commissioner will make the final decisions in this case only act after a very careful review of all the information gathered in the review process. Once they make their decisions, they will issue a document that discusses the issues they considered, states their decisions on those issues, and explains all their reasoning. I hope you are willing to wait for that process to run its course before even thinking about being afraid of this plant again. Have a nice day and Happy St. Patrick's Day. Gerald L. 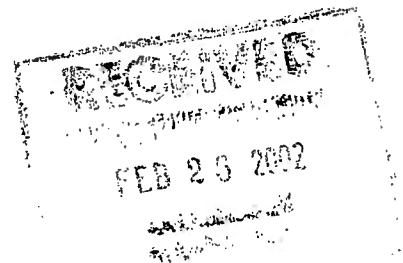

As you are aware, Kings Park Energy (a.k.a. PP&L Global), a Pennsylvania based company, has proposed to build a major merchant power generation facility on Town Line Road in Kings Park, NY. This power plant, if built, will be amidst several large, densely populated residential neighborhoods in Kings Park, Commack, Fort Salonga, Smithtown, East Northport, Northport and Dix Hills. It will be located within close proximity to many schools, the V.A. Hospital and a nursing home for the elderly.

The site is also located in a federal government classified deep recharge area for a sole source aquifer, which is the only source of drinking water for all the people on Long Island. This deep recharge area is very sensitive and is strictly protected by Article 7 of the Suffolk County Sanitary Code. Kings Park Energy is seeking to violate Article 7 by storing bulk quantities of hazardous materials such as petroleum distillate and ammonia on-site.

It should be noted that the communities that surround the proposed site already bear the burden of several major sources of environmental blight. These are: the Northport power plant, the Huntington waste incinerator, the Huntington and Smithtown landfills and the medical waste incinerator at St. Catherine's Medical Center. Thanks for you letter and the attachment. I can understand how you would be frustrated given the emotionally intense circumstances you describe. While I can certainly empathize with you, I am not in a position to require that neighbors treat each other respectfully in their daily lives (except when they are in one of the hearings in this case) or to require people to get all the pertinent information before reaching final conclusions about the effects of the proposed plant. I can assure you , however, that the Article X process is designed so those making the ultimate decisions about whether or not the plant will be built will have all the best information available to base their decisions on. If an objective evaluation of the facts and a fair application of law and policy is what you are looking for, you might want to consider whether it is still worth it for you to expend so much emotional capital trying to convince the PTA or your neighbors about why your way of seeing things is better than theirs. Dear Judge Lynch,

I am writing to inform you of how "ugly" things have gotten here in East Northport thanks to the Townline Association.

My PTA had the vote to stand for or against the power plant last night. I had previously asked the PTA management (my own PTA president, as well as the PTA council) to postpone the vote until we had more time to review the Article X application. They did not feel that was necessary.

Before the vote last night I stood in front of approximately 50 PTA members and read a letter which I will attach. It simply stated that I have discovered the Townline Association to be spreading false information and that the fears in our community may be unfounded.

My own next door neighbor (our kids play together regularly) tried to interrupt me and even shouted "Go home Jennifer" while I was speaking. I just saw her, and she told me she will no longer allow her children to play with mine "Because you want a power plant in our backyard!" She then told me to "Get lost!"

A friend of mine who sat behind a man named Jeff Heller, an attorney member of Townline Association, heard him say to the woman next to him "This woman is getting paid alot of money to do this." He said this while I was reading my letter out loud to the PTA members. This is the same man I spoke to 2 weeks ago for 2 hours on the phone, asking him to back up the Townline's claims that our water will be contaminated, the air polluted, etc. He was unable to back up anything he said then, and he said to me in that conversation, "If I didn't know any better, I'd think your pockets were being stuffed". Since then many of my friends have heard rumors that I am being bribed to ask the questions I ask.

I hope to find a lawyer here to help me sue for slander. I don't know how difficult it is to prove, but now I have an eyewitness, her name is Nicol Legakis, and she is another mother looking for the facts. It is amazing to me that an attorney could so openly accuse me of taking a bribe, when it is totally untrue.

Please guide my concerns in the right direction. I want to be able to ask my questions about this plant without having my name slandered. This makes no sense to me.

Dear Dr. Brosnan, PTA Council, PTA leadership and PTA members,

I am writing to request that the PTA postpone its plan for a PTA vote FOR or AGAINST the Kings Park Energy project. The Article X application was filed by the company on January 22, 2002. We have been asked to vote on March 12, 2002. The application contains volumes of pertinent information that is impossible to evaluate in just one and one half months. We are all busy mothers. Many of us have additional jobs outside the home. This is perhaps the single most important issue this PTA will ever face. We should take our time making an informed vote on the matter.

I am also concerned that the Town Line Association has been making unfounded accusations that the company will be exposing our children to tainted water, increased air pollution, and that the company will be operating on oil at their will, not gas as they state in their application. I am referring specifically to the document titled "Kings Park Energy: Benefits to our Community" distributed at the "emergency meeting" held on February 13, 2002.

I have been asking every one of my immediate neighbors and PTA members to tell me what they know about the project. Unfortunately, the majority of people I speak to have not attended any meetings given by Kings Park Energy or the Townline Association. Two of my immediate neighbors went to Townline's last meeting and gave me the brochure that was distributed. This is the document I found so alarming. That is when I began looking for FACTS,

I have made many phone calls to people in various agencies (see list of contacts on Page 2) and my research has reassured me that PPL has no desire to come here and place me in any danger. To the contrary, their application states that they will help to reduce pollution by displacing the need for power produced by the old LILCO plant in Northport. They do not claim to be putting LILCO out of business, just reducing their amount of energy production by competing with them (the whole point of deregulation). I do not yet know how I would vote on this. I have many, many questions that I need answered. I wish this whole thing never started. To pretend it will just "go away" is irresponsible.

I have expressed my concerns directly to the Townline Association via a 2 hour conversation with Jeff Heller, a member of Townline Association who is an attorney. I also emailed my concerns to Alan Leon, president of Towline Association, on March 3.

I implore the PTA to consider forming a committee dedicated to gathering non biased, factual information to distribute to our members so that we can be well informed as to the progress of the 12-month review process that begins after the application is deemed complete by the State. I am willing to try to organize such a committee. We have already missed out on any opportunity to influence the planning of the project. Let us not make the same mistake during the review phase. We owe it to our children to become more aware of the facts and feel comfortable with where we are living.

I urge all members to start reading the Article X application. It is very clearly separated into specific areas of concern. Water supply, air pollution, noise pollution, truck traffic, oil backup are all addressed. The website is www.pplkingspark.com. You will find the document there.

We cannot sit back and hope this project will just disappear. I want to be well aware of all the issues, so that if the project is approved, I can live here without fear. Don't you?
