Can You Dig It?

Spring has sprung, which probably means yard work is in your future.

Hitting a gas line with your shovel or other equipment can seriously injure you. Before digging, call 811 two to 10 days ahead of time (it's the law), so utilities can mark the location of lines for free. Some pipelines are marked with the name and phone of the pipeline operator.

Know the signs of a gas leak?

Smell—an unpleasant odor like rotten eggs

Sight—a white cloud, mist, fog, or bubbles in standing water

Sound—roaring, hissing, or whistling



If you smell gas inside, leave immediately and take others with you. If the odor is faint, open a window before leaving.

If you're outside, move away from where you think there could be a leak.

DO NOT use a phone; light a match; start a car, or turn on or off lights, flashlights, appliances, or anything else that could create a spark and cause the gas to explode.

Once you're safely away from the area, call 911 or 1-800-75-CONED (1-800-752-6633). National Grid customers call 1-718-643-4050.

Don't assume someone else has already called. You can report leaks anonymously.

Don't Get Scammed

We would never call, email, or visit your home or business to:

- Demand payment via a pre-paid debit card
- Or ask for your personal information

Don't pay over the phone unless you are certain you are using Con Edison's automated system. Scammers also demanded payments for bail, taxes, ransom, and hospital bills.

Suspect a scammer? Call **1-800-75-CONED** to verify that the caller or visitor is from Con Edison.

Don't forget to report scams to your local police department.

Protect Yourself Against This Deadly Gas

Carbon monoxide (CO) is odorless, colorless, and it can be deadly.

Know the signs of CO poisoning—head-aches, shortness of breath, dizziness, nausea, and fatigue.

Leave the area immediately and call 911 if you suspect CO poisoning.

Once a year, replace the batteries on your CO detector, and clean heating systems, vents, chimneys,

Is Your Building's Gas Service Safe?

Each year, Con Edison conducts free inspections of gas service at schools, hospitals, nursing homes, and other structures defined as buildings of public assembly. Qualifying institutions are licensed by New York State for the care of children, and factories that employ 75 or more people. Buildings of public assembly also includes buildings that have a capacity of 75 or greater where the public is regularly admitted. Office or apartment buildings not normally used by more than 75 people are excluded from the BOPA definition, and therefore, not eligible for the free inspection. If you think your building qualifies, call 1-888-544-5476.

Spot Steam?

Immediately call 1-800-75-CONED (1-800-752-6633). Visible steam is caused by water falling on a steam pipe, a manhole cover, or a steam leak, and we need to check it out.

Life-Support Equipment and Medical Emergencies

If you or someone you know uses lifesupport equipment or has a medicalemergency condition, we need to be able to contact them during storms and other emergencies. Call 1-800-75-CONED (1-800-752-6633) or log into conEd.com and choose the Enroll in Special Services option to complete our online form. If you choose to call, please have your 15-digit account number available.

Life-support equipment includes:

- Tank-type respirators (iron lung)
- Cuirasses-type (chest) respirators
- Rocking bed respirators
- Electrically operated respirators
- Apnea monitors (infant monitor)
- Dialysis equipment (kidney machine)

Both life support equipment and medical-emergency conditions require certification, which you can initiate by asking your doctor or local board of health to call 1-718-222-7593. Each year, we send a letter asking those enrolled to recertify so that our records remain current.

Using Your A/C Can Get Expensive

Sweltering weather is on the way. From June 1 to September 30, the first 250 kilowatt-hours you use will be billed at your normal delivery rate. But you'll be charged a higher rate for each kilowatt-hour over 250.
