Dear Property Owner:

As you may know, Upstate NY Power Corporation (UNYPC) has submitted an application to the New York State Public Service Commission (PSC) to construct a 230 kV electric transmission line that is proposed to be routed through the Towns of Hounsfield, Henderson, Ellisburg, Pulaski, Richland, and Mexico. We are writing to you because you have been identified as an owner of real property which may be affected if our application is approved. Your property has been identified as being within the vicinity of the proposed transmission line route or one or more alternate routes. As part of the proposed project, UPNYPC proposes to acquire or condemn a new right-of-way by the power of eminent domain; there is some possibility that your property may be affected.

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with some basic information about the proposed project, the process for approving major transmission lines in New York State and, most importantly, how you can access more information about the proposed project and become involved in the process.

Project Overview

On January 13, 2009, UNYPC submitted an application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need to the PSC. Pursuant to Article VII of the New York State Public Service Law, a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need must be granted prior to the construction of any major transmission facility in New York State. The PSC reviews such applications and has the authority to grant or deny applications. UNYPC proposes to construct approximately 50.6 miles of 230 kV transmission line between the collector substation of a wind-powered electric generation facility on Galloo Island (Hounsfield Wind Farm) located on the eastern end of Lake Ontario, in the Town of Hounsfield, to a new interconnection substation in the Town of Mexico, where the line will connect to the regional power grid. Approximately 41.7 miles of the proposed route is over land and approximately 9 miles are under the lakebed of Lake Ontario.
