Charter's Filing Pursuant to Provision 19 of the Build-out Settlement Agreement

Dear Secretary Burgess:

Provision 19¹ of the Settlement Agreement executed by DPS Staff, Commission and Charter Communications, Inc. ("Charter") requires that "within 30 days, Charter shall amend its Deployment Plan and identify all known State or municipal agencies from which it will need permits through the next year of the Deployment Plan, to be **updated annually**, and set forth a plan for obtaining those respective permits." On July 19, 2017, Charter filed a list of permits that identified all known state and municipal agencies through the following year of its Deployment Plan (collectively the "Permit List").²

Charter hereby provides its updated Permit List for 2018. Because the Permit List contains confidential and trade secret information regarding Charter's Deployment Plan, Charter is filing only a redacted version with the Secretary.³ An unredacted and confidential version of the
