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ALJ PHILLIPS: Good afternoon. I would 1 2 like to go on the record so we can start pretty 3 close to our start time. (Time noted: 3:02 p.m.) 4 ALJ PHILLIPS: Calling case number 5 6 17-E-0459, Proceeding on Motion of the 7 Commission as to the Rates, Charges, Rules and Regulations of Central Hudson Gas & Electric 8 Corporation for Electric Services, and case 9 number 17-G-0460, Proceeding on Motion of the 10 11 Commission as to the Rates, Charges, Rules and Regulations for Central Hudson Gas & Electric 12 Corporation for Gas Service. 13 My name is Michelle Phillips. 14 15 I'm one of the administrative law judges assigned to this proceeding. With me today is 16 administrative law judge, Erika Bergen, and 17 Commissioner Gregg Sayre. 18 19 Commission Sayre is one of the five PSC Commissioners who will ultimately decide what 20 Central Hudson's rates and conditions will be. 21 Would you like to address the audience, 22 23 Commissioner Sayre? 24 COMMISSIONER SAYRE: Thank you very much 25 for coming out this afternoon. I know you have

1	places that you would probably rather be other
2	than in a meeting room talking about rate
3	cases. So, you must be taking it seriously and
4	I promise to take what you have to say
5	seriously.
б	ALJ PHILLIPS: I would like to echo what
7	Commissioner Sayre said, and thank you so much
8	for coming out this afternoon.
9	We are here today to listen to your
10	comments, and I will summarize and report your
11	comments to those commissioners who were not
12	able to be here today.
13	For purposes of this public statement
14	hearing, we've asked that you fill out a card
15	if you wish to speak. Then using the speaker
16	card I will call you up to the front so that
17	your statement can be transcribed by the court
18	reporter. That's the reason why we are using
19	the microphone. So, I will ask that you please
20	do use the microphone, and speak clearly and
21	state your name.
22	Also, I would like to ask if anyone has
23	any electronic devices that might beep, or
24	jingle, or make any sound, if you could please
25	silence those now.

It's a fairly straight forward process, 1 2 but are there any questions about this process before we begin? 3 4 (No response.) ALJ PHILLIPS: So, hearing none, at this 5 6 time I would like to call Assembly District 7 Member, Frank Skartados. MR. SKARTADOS: Yes, good afternoon. 8 ALJ PHILLIPS: Good afternoon. 9 MR. SKARTADOS: So, we're here today to 10 11 present our thoughts, as you said, on the 12 request made by Central Hudson for rate increases to New York State Department of 13 Public Service. 14 15 Now, I met with Central Hudson representatives over these issue, and I am 16 17 familiar with the reasons, and honestly who can disagree with the requests? 18 19 The infrastructure, which delivers our electricity must be able to stand up to severe 20 weather conditions. The grid must be hardened 21 against cyber attacks. And new equipment 22 23 should be installed to reduce power 24 interruptions. 25 But I'm here to ask, at what cost to the

public should Central Hudson be allowed to proceed?

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For those who have serious economic challenges, what cost do they have to pay when they don't have enough money to pay rent, or to buy something more than cheap, unhealthy food?

7 What cost should the average two-child 8 family have to pay when there's hardly enough 9 money left after property taxes, school taxes, 10 sales taxes, food, clothing and savings, saving 11 up for a college education? It becomes very 12 unobtainable.

And at what cost should a single mom with one child have to pay for Central Hudson's improvements when her modest income, as a fast food server, can barely cover healthcare, childcare and the cost to operate a car to get to work?

19These rate increases are somewhat frequent20and their effect is cumulative. The cost of21energy has declined but the cost of delivery22continues to grow. That is, the cost of23delivery outpaces the cost of the product24itself.

So, I'm here to say that there must be

1	fairness between Central Hudson's needs and the			
2	needs of the people they serve. And that			
3	fairness must be weighted carefully by the			
4	members of the New York Sate Department of			
5	Public Services.			
6	It begins by strengthening oversight of			
7	utilities and extends to finding other ways to			
8	finance necessary infrastructure up-grades that			
9	do not further burden those who cannot afford			
10	to pay.			
11	And when you think about it, you can't say			
12	that Central Hudson, or any utilities, is			
13	helping the people of New York when they are			
14	taking money from the pockets of people who			
15	cannot afford basic human needs.			
16	Thank you. I appreciate your time.			
17	ALJ PHILLIPS: Thank you. The next			
18	speaker card is for John Pfeiffer.			
19	MR. PFEIFFER: I see a time a generation			
20	from now where they will look back on us and			
21	say, they burned fossil fuels? How primitive.			
22	They'll look back like we look back on doctors			
23	that used leeches to cure diseases. It's not a			
24	good idea.			
25	There's a heavy cost of action that we're			

1	considering here, potentially. But I think the			
2	cost of in-action could be far greater. So, if			
3	we don't do something to reduce the use of			
4	fossil fuels we're going to be in trouble. We			
5	already are in trouble.			
6	So, I agree totally with the idea of			
7	beneficial electrification. People moving			
8	towards electricity to running heat pumps and			
9	electric vehicles to get away fossil fuels.			
10	So, I'm in favor of raising rates on any			
11	type of fossil fuel, a carbon tax if that is			
12	possible, but I think the idea of raising			
13	electric rates will not work to incentivize			
14	people to move towards the type of beneficial			
15	electrification such as and heat pumps and			
16	such. So that's it.			
17	ALJ PHILLIPS: Thank you very much.			
18	Thus far, those were the only two cards			
19	that I have. We, however, will stay here until			
20	four o'clock in case anyone else shows up and			
21	wishes to make a statement for the record.			
22	In the mean time we will go off the record			
23	and return, if need be, for other members of			
24	the public who show up.			
25	I want to thank you for coming out. Our			

next public information session will being in 1 2 the same room at six p.m. followed by the next public statement hearing at seven p.m. 3 Thank you. We are off the record. 4 5 (Time noted 3:26 p.m.) 6 ALJ PHILLIPS: We are back on the record. 7 8 (Time noted 4:04 p.m.) ALJ PHILLIPS: I would like to note that 9 it's a little bit after four o'clock and we 10 11 have stayed here to see if anyone else would 12 show up to make a statement and no one has. 13 Therefore, we are adjourning this afternoon's 14 public statement hearing. The next public 15 statement hearing will commence at seven o'clock this evening in the same room. Thank 16 17 you. We are off the record. 18 19 (Time noted: 4:07 p.m.) 20 21 22 23 24 25
