Re: Orange and Rockland Utilities Inc. Electric and Gas rate Filing- Case 14-E-0493 and 14-G-0494.

Dear Secretary Burgess;

Orange and Rockland Utilities has submitted for filing revisions to its Schedule for Electric Service, PSC No.3-Electricity and its Schedule for Gas Service PSC No.4-Gas.

Orange and Rockland Utilities seeks an increase in revenues for electric delivery of \$33.4 million resulting in an overall customer bill increase of 5.2 percent including projected supply costs. Delivery charge amounts to an actual increase of 11.5% in electricity rates.

Orange and Rockland utilities seeks an increase in revenues for gas delivery of \$40.7 million resulting in an overall customer bill increase of approximately 16.8 percent including projected supply costs. However, the actual increase would amount to 35.1%.

Orange & Rockland Utilities already have rates among the highest in the United States. These increases would have a severe impact on local residents and local governments as well as large and small businesses in the area. Residents would be effected by high energy prices as well as higher

property taxes caused by the rate increases. It would place a tremendous burden on the homeowners as well as the large and small businesses. Local governments would be effected by the higher cost of the electricity thereby possibly causing an increase in property taxes which would exceed the 2% tax cap imposed by the state. High utility costs hurts businesses already in the area and dissuades others from moving to the region.

The PSC should open an investigation to see if the present rates could be reduced by possibly improving 0 & R employee efficiency and other business practices. A rate reduction would have a great impact on the economy of this area and would be conducive to attracting new business to the area.

The FERC has already instituted unnecessary rate increases by the change in the capacity zones amounting to between 5 and 10 percent effective this past May 1st.

I am requesting that the requested increases be denied.
