Under the "Effect on Communications" section 2.11, we state the following:</p> <p>"Off-Air TV Analysis; Identify and map any off-air TV stations in a 150 kilometer radius of the Project site. Define the communities serve. Detailed technical data would be provided for each station followed by an impact assessment and engineering recommendations for mitigation, if necessary."</p> <p>Later in the section we continue to state the following:</p> <p>"If issues arise during operation of the Project, the operator will resolve those issues on an individual basis.
