Response

To the extent that the Company makes investments in enhanced functionality that allow our customers to manage their energy and demand usage, all customers will contribute to that enhanced functionality cost. It has not yet been determined how those costs would be allocated over the delivery charges in the customer bill and the Company does not have a specific proposal at this time.
