ORDER DETERMINING PENALTY AND DIRECTING PAYMENT

Background

At the April 20, 2016 Session, the Commission approved  
a Consent Order agreement with Hancock Contracting & Design to  
resolve an enforcement action for an alleged violation of 16  
NYCRR §753-3.1(a)(1). The terms of the Consent Order agreement  
called for the penalty to be reduced from \$2,500 to \$1,000,  
which Hancock Contracting & Design has already remitted. It  
also required Hancock Contracting & Design to complete a

training session given by New York 811, and to provide to Staff a copy of a sign-in sheet verifying that the training was completed. Finally, the Consent Order stipulated that Hancock Contracting & Design admitted to the violation of 16 NYCRR §753-3.1(a)(1) as cited.

To date, Hancock Contracting & Design has not provided verification that it has completed the agreed upon training, nor has it responded to a reminder letter sent by the Secretary on July 9, 2016. That reminder letter stated that, if no reply was received from Hancock Contracting & Design, this matter would be reported to the Commission for further action. No reply was received and thus Hancock Contracting & Design has failed to comply with the terms of the Consent Order agreement. Therefore, we find that Hancock Contracting & Design did commit a violation of 16 NYCRR §753-3.1(a)(1), and order that it either remit the remaining \$1,500 or provide verification that it completed the training as provided in the Consent Order agreement.

#### Determination

We find that Pisa Contracting, Inc. d/b/a Hancock Contracting & Design did commit a violation of 16 NYCRR §753-3.1(a)(1), which resulted in damage to a 1½-inch natural gas service.

#### The Commission orders:

1. A penalty of \$2,500 is determined against Pisa Contracting, Inc. d/b/a Hancock Contracting & Design pursuant to §119-b(8) of the Public Service Law.
2. Pisa Contracting, Inc. d/b/a Hancock Contracting & Design is directed to either complete a training session with New York 811 to satisfy the requirements of the Consent Order,

or to remit, by certified check payable to the "Department of Public Service," the remaining sum of \$1,500 in payment of the penalty determined. The remaining \$1,500 sum is subject to Section 18 of the State Finance Law and shall be deposited into the underground facilities safety training account. The check shall be addressed to:

3. If the completed training or check is not received within 30 days after issuance of this Order, Staff is authorized to refer the case to the New York State Department of Law with a request that an action to collect the determined penalty be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction.

4. The proceeding is continued, pending compliance with ordering clause 2, following which it should be closed.
