NOTICE OF COMPLETION OF FINAL GENERIC
SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

(Issued May 23, 2016)

NOTICE is hereby given that the New York State Public Service Commission (Commission), as lead agency, has issued a Final Generic Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (Final GSEIS) in connection with proposed actions by the Commission regarding establishing a Clean Energy Standard (CES), and including establishing within the CES a support mechanism to sustain the operations of nuclear energy electric generating facilities as major sources of emissions-free electricity. The address of the lead agency is Three Empire State Plaza, Albany, NY 12223-1350. The Final GSEIS has been prepared in accordance with Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law [State

Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA)]. The proposed actions are "unlisted actions" as classified pursuant to SEQRA and would be located throughout the geographic area of the State of New York.

Copies of the Final GSEIS are available to the public at the Commission's Albany office at Three Empire State Plaza, Albany, NY 12223-1350 (Central Files, 14th Floor) and at the Commission's New York City Office at 90 Church Street, New York, NY 10007-2919 (Central Files, 4th Floor). The proposed actions by the Commission supplement other actions already being considered to align electric utility practices and the regulatory paradigm with technological advances in information management and power generation and distribution, a policy initiative referred to as the "Reforming the Energy Vision" or REV program, and the institution of a Clean Energy Fund program. The proposed supplemental actions by the Commission involve the design and implementation of programs to:

- (a) achieve a goal that 50 percent of all electric energy consumed in New York by 2030 be supplied by renewable resources;
- (b) support the construction of new electric generating facilities in New York State utilizing renewable resources;
- (c) prevent premature closure of certain nuclear energy electric generating facilities; and
- (d) promote the progress of REV market objectives.

The Final SGEIS has been prepared in order to analyze potential environmental impacts associated with establishing a Clean Energy Standard (CES), and including establishing within

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the CES a support mechanism to sustain the operations of nuclear energy electric generating facilities as major sources of emissions-free electricity.
