The New York State Public Service Commission seeks public comments regarding Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corporation's July 29, 2005 request to increase its annual electric and gas revenues. According to Central Hudson's July 2005 filing with the Commission, the proposed rate revisions are designed to produce an overall increase of about \$52.8 million or 13% in annual electric revenues and about \$18.1 million or 15% in annual gas revenues. The proposed increases have been suspended through June 26, 2006. The company's request may be approved, modified, or rejected by the Commission, in whole or in part.

Draft Title V Permit Renewal 1 was originally published within the Environmental Notice Bulletin November 9, 2005. This revised Renewal 1 incorporate changes discussed with USEPA January 19, 2006, February 13, 2006 and February 14, 2006. Revisions include:

1. The PSD cap under 201-7 has been replaced with a general Title V permit condition under 201-6.5. The annual maximum landfill gas combustion has been reduced from 1,300 x 10^6 cubic feet to 900 x 10^6 cubic feet. This general condition under 201-6.5 also requires the operation of two gas meters. One meter shall record total flow from the landfill proper. The second gas meter shall record bypass gas combusted within the enclosed flares. See permit condition 25.

2. The frequency to perform testing demonstrating compliance with NOx RACT has been revised to clearly indicate "upon permit renewal". See conditions 41 and 42.

3. A condition to conduct performance testing to demonstrate NMOC control efficiency of the two enclosed flares has been added to the permit. Testing frequency established as upon permit renewal. See permit condition 31.

4. The Permit Review Report basis for monitoring section has been enhanced to include additional description of landfill gas control procedures.

5. Condition 39 has been changed to include operating temperature range of the chiller.

6. Condition 28 has been revised by deleting the last sentence of the first paragraph. Reference to NMOC destruction efficiency is inappropriate in the context of a gas treatment system.

The Alturi Landfill & LFGTE Facility consists of five emission units. Title V Facility Permit Renewal 1 defines three of the five facility emission units which are applicable to the landfill gas to energy site. Drug agents target Afghanistan's opium

Kabul, Afghanistan - Springtime is on the way and already hundreds of farmers are tending pale green shoots of Afghanistan's chief crop and economic mainstay: opium poppies.

It looks to be a bumper year. Some 320,000 acres are currently blanketed in rows of dandelion-like sprouts that eventually produce almost 90 percent of the world's heroin.

But drug agents are counterattacking. An army of 500 tractor-driving Afghans hopes to plow the plants under before producers grow powerful enough to corrupt the country's fledgling government.

"There's going to be a continuous effort in spring and summer," U.S. Army Lt. Gen. Karl Eikenberry, the top American commander in Afghanistan, said in an interview yesterday.

When the Taliban ran Afghanistan, its leader enforced a ban on poppy growing under threat of jail, and cultivation dropped to practically nothing in 2000.

The dramatic increase in poppy cultivation since U.S. forces ousted the Taliban from power in late 2001 has caused alarm in the West, particularly Europe, the destination of most of the drugs.

Getting farmers to stop growing the flowers is complicated by a guerrilla war and some of the world's starkest poverty.

San Bernardino, Calif. - A sheriff's deputy who was videotaped shooting an unarmed Iraq War veteran after a car chase will be charged with attempted voluntary manslaughter, authorities said yesterday.

The decision to charge Deputy Ivory J. Webb, 45, was announced by San Bernardino County District Attorney Michael A. Ramos.

Sheriff Gary Penrod said Webb will remain on paid administrative leave during the investigation into the shooting of Air Force Senior Airman Elio Carrion, 21. If convicted, Webb could face up to 18½ years in prison.

Fontana, Calif. - A group of boys who posed as a 15-year-old girl for an Internet prank ended up helping police arrest a 48-year-old man who tried to meet the fictitious teenager for sex, authorities said. The five boys had created a fake profile of a girl on MySpace.com to cheer up a friend who had recently broken up with his girlfriend.

But soon, a man began sending messages to the "girl." The man also sent his picture and arranged to meet her at a public park. The boys went to the park and, when the man arrived, they called police.

Michael Ramos, 48, of Fontana, was booked into West Valley Detention Center for investigation of felony attempted lewd and lascivious conduct with a child and for an outstanding warrant.



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**Dubai-owned
company quits
claim to ports**

Washington - Bowing to ferocious opposition in Congress, a Dubai-owned company signaled surrender yesterday in its quest to take over operations at U.S. ports. "DP World will transfer fully the U.S. operations ... to a United States entity," the firm's top executive, H. Edward Bilkey, said in an announcement that capped weeks of controversy.

Relieved Republicans in Congress said the firm had pledged full divestiture, a decision that one senator said had been approved personally by the prime minister of the United Arab Emirates.

The announcement appeared to indicate an end to a politically tinged controversy that brought President Bush and Republicans in Congress to the brink of an election-year veto battle on a terrorism-related issue.

A leading congressional critic of the ports deal, Rep. Peter King, applauded the decision but said he and others would wait to see the details. "It would have to be an American company with no links to DP World, and that would be a tremendous victory and very gratifying," said the New York Republican, chairman of the House Homeland Security Committee.

"This should make the issue go away," said Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist, R-Tenn., one of several GOP leaders to tell President Bush earlier in the day that Congress was set to ignore his veto threat and scuttle the deal.

Sen. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y., a chief critic of the deal, reacted cautiously. "This is obviously a promising development, but the devil's in the details," he said. "Those of us who feel strongly about this issue believe that the U.S. part of the British company should have no connection to the United Arab Emirates or DP World."

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**On the waterfront:
Who's running it?**

New York - Justice Department lawyers warned eight months ago that a nefarious element had infiltrated important East Coast ports, but they weren't talking about terrorists or Arab shipping companies.

They were talking about the mafia. In a civil suit filed in July, prosecutors in Brooklyn accused the International Longshoremen's Association, the 65,000-member union that supplies labor to ports from Florida to Maine, of being a "vehicle for organized crime" on the waterfront.

Packed with tales of corruption, embezzling and extortion, the complaint accused union executives of being associates of the Genovese and Gambino crime families.

The U.S. attorney's office asked a judge to seize control of the union, remove its officers and "put an end to the conspiracy among union officials, organized crime figures and others that has plagued some of the nation's most important ports for decades."
