School and Community Monitoring



Monitoring Working Group Background

- The School Monitoring Working Group (Working Group) was established at the first meeting of the DOB in June 2021.
- Goals:
 - Develop a better understanding of potential environmental and health risks that decommissioning could present to Buchanan-Verplanck Elementary School;
 - Assess monitoring best practices; and
 - Issue recommendations to the Hendrick Hudson School District.
- Working Group has met regularly to discuss and learn about monitoring protocols.



Existing Monitoring and Safeguards

- All demolition work is subject to:
 - Local demolition permits requiring dust mitigation;
 - State environmental regulations;
 - Strict workforce safety standards:
 - Testing for presence of asbestos, lead, other contaminants before structures taken down;
 - Contaminants trigger specific disposal, monitoring, and worker safety standards
 - Workforce safety standards serve as first and most accurate line of detection for school and community.
 - On-site NYS inspector monitoring work.



Existing Monitoring and Safeguards

- Network of radiological monitors:
 - On-site;
 - On workers; and
 - 16 around the site perimeter, including two near the BV school.
- On-site dust control measures and off-site dust complaint reporting and investigation procedures are required through Village demolition permits.
 - Fugitive demolition dust must not leave site.
- Identical/Comparable measures are in place to prevent hazards to workers and the public that are used at seven other nuclear plants during decommissioning activities.



Technical Advice from Experts

- On-site continuous air monitors in immediate vicinity of demolition activity offer the most timely and beneficial information to protect the community:
 - Provide early warning and near real-time results.
- Monitoring beyond fence line may not be as useful:
 - Greater potential for interference from background readings.
 - More difficult to determine source.
 - Account for long-range transport of pollutants to the monitors.



Heavy Demolition

- What is it?: The demolition of concrete buildings with thick walls, specifically the spent fuel pool buildings, turbine buildings, and domes
- <u>Timing</u>: Late 2023 at the earliest, after:
 - All spent fuel transferred to dry cask storage and
 - Vessel segmentation within the containment domes under water and under negative pressure is complete.



Recommendations and Next Steps

The Working Group recommended that a request for proposals (RFP) be issued to procure environmental consulting services to develop a CAMP with primary focus on fence-line monitors. RFP was issued January 9, 2023 and is viewable at www.dps.ny.gov/indianpoint

Regulatory Framework



Regulatory Framework

The Clean Water Act (CWA)

- Establishes the basic structure for regulating discharges of pollutants into the waters of the United States and regulating quality standards for surface waters.
- Implemented by United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

Delegation of Authority to States

- Allows state agencies to administer regulatory programs promulgated by EPA.
- Includes issuance and enforcement of permits.
- NY implements the CWA through the SPDES Program, which has been approved by EPA.



Jurisdiction over Wastewater Discharges from Indian Point

New York State

- Holtec operates pursuant to a NY SPDES Permit.
- SPDES permit governs non-radiological discharges from the facility.
- Current Status: The Indian Point SPDES Permit for Main Facility discharges expired on April 30, 2022. Holtec submitted a timely renewal application and facility continues to have coverage under the existing SPDES permit pursuant to the State Administrative Procedure Act.
- SPDES Permit Renewal Process:
 - NYSDEC will conduct a full technical review to determine if changes to the SPDES permit are necessary.
 - As part of this process, Holtec must submit to DEC comprehensive data, including identifying and characterizing the non-radiological waste stream.
 - DEC will review this information to determine appropriate effluent parameters and limits.
 - Once the application has been deemed complete, a draft SPDES permit will be noticed for public comment.



Jurisdiction over Wastewater Discharges from Indian Point

Federal

- Radiological discharges from the facility are under the auspices of NRC/EPA.
- Discharges must meet federal regulations, for example, 10 CFR 20, 40 CFR Part 190.

DPS Gas Pipeline Safety Report

December 2022 Sink Hole Event

- Staff was on site shortly after alerted
- Staff confirmed site was secure
- Staff observed remedial actions and testing
- Staff found no condition warranting altered operation
- Staff continues discussions with operator as investigation continues




