## Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. - New Gas Rates Effective May 1, 2022

Under a three-year rate plan adopted by the New York State Public Service Commission ("PSC") in its order issued April 14, 2022, Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. ("O&R") will put into effect on May 1, 2022, new gas rates for year one of the rate plan. The new gas rates will remain in effect until December 31, 2022. O&R will put into effect rates for years two and three of the rate plan on January 1, 2023 and January 1, 2024, respectively.

The effect of the new gas rates on selected monthly residential bills is shown in the following table. The bill amounts and the impact of the new rates on general service customers indicated below, include gas supply costs and other applicable rate adjustments adopted by the PSC in its order approving the three-year rate plan.

The impacts to general service non-residential customers range from an increase of approximately 1.0% to an increase of approximately 3.8% depending on the customer's usage characteristics. Actual customer bill impacts will vary depending upon whether the gas supply is purchased from O&R or from an Energy Service Company ("ESCO"), and on the customer's gas usage.

In addition to the new rates that are effective May 1, 2022, the Company has made the following major changes to its Schedule for Gas Service, P.S.C. No. 4 - GAS: (1) updated the billing and payment processing charge to \$1.50; (2) changed the discounts applicable to customers served under Rider E – Excelsior Jobs Program; (3) revised the charge for the first 100 Ccf or less of monthly usage under SC No. 8, Interruptible Transportation and Supplemental Sales and a revision to the Base Charge cap; (4) revised the Monthly Gas Adjustment to provide mechanisms to recover and/or credit customers for Non-Pipeline Alternatives project costs, the Late Payment Charge reconciliation, and the COVID Uncollectible Expense Variance; (5) revised the Revenue Decoupling Mechanism ("RDM") to update the RDM targets, change the thresholds associated with interim RDM adjustments, and change the time required between filing an RDM Adjustment Statement and the effective date of the Statement; (6) changed the reconciliation of credit and collections costs and revenues associated with retail access customers whose energy service companies participate in the Company's purchase of receivables program; (7) reset the definition of normal heating degree days in the weather normalization adjustment; (8) revised the gas entitlements for residential heating customers; and (9) filed a Delivery Revenue Surcharge to collect shortfalls in non-competitive delivery service revenues from January 1, 2022 through April 30, 2022 resulting from the extension of the suspension period.



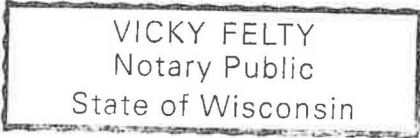

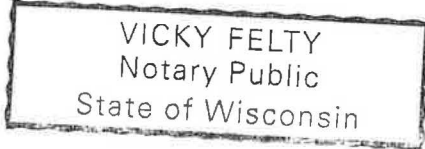
