New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG") hereby submits this filing in compliance with Ordering Clause No. 16 of the New York State Public Service Commission's <u>Order Amending A</u> <u>Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and Requiring System Improvements</u>, issued and effective July 29, 2014 (the "Order").

We recommend that potential onsite and offsite impacts of the proposed project on these species or communities be addressed as part of any environmental assessment or review conducted as part of the planning, permitting and approval process, such as reviews conducted under SEQR. Field surveys of the project site may be necessary to determine the status of a species at the site, particularly for sites that are currently undeveloped and may still contain suitable habitat. Final requirements of the project to avoid, minimize, or mitigate potential impacts are determined by the lead permitting agency or the government body approving the project.

The following animals, while not listed by New York State as Endangered or Threatened, are of conservation concern to the state, and are considered rare by the New York Natural Heritage Program.
