CASE 24-T-0677 - Petition of New York State Electric & Gas Corporation for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need, Pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law, for the Jennison Transmission Solution Project.

NOTICE OF JOINT PROPOSAL AND
OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

(Issued November 24, 2025)

On November 7, 2025, a Joint Proposal was filed by New York State Electric & Gas Corporation (NYSEG). The Joint Proposal was signed by all active parties to this case (meaning, NYSEG and trial staff of the New York State Department of Public Service, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets, and the New York State Department of Transportation). The Joint Proposal contains the terms, conditions, practices, and guidelines recommended by the signatory parties for inclusion in a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (Certificate). The Certificate, if granted, would authorize NYSEG to reconstruct, own, and operate the Jennison Transmission Solution Project (Project).

As stated in the Joint Proposal, the Project involves the rebuild and relocation of the Jennison Substation in the Town of Bainbridge. The Project includes re-routing several transmission and sub-transmission lines from the substation's present location to its new location and rebuilding NYSEG's 115 kilovolt (kV) electric transmission Line 946 primarily within existing right-of-way (ROW) through the Towns of Norwich, Guilford, and Bainbridge in Chenango County, from the proposed Jennison Substation to NYSEG's East Norwich Substation in the

Town of Norwich. The Project also includes connecting the rebuilt line to the North Pond Substation in the Town of Guilford and rebuilding NYSEG's 115 kV electric transmission Line 949 entirely within the existing ROW through the Town of Bainbridge in Chenango County and the Towns of Sidney, Franklin, and Hamden in Delaware County, from the proposed Jennison Substation to the "Eastern Terminus."¹ In addition, portions of existing Lines 946 and 949 and of six other transmission and sub-transmission lines that currently connect to the existing Jennison Substation will be relocated/rebuilt to connect to the proposed Jennison Substation. The total length of new 115 kV transmission lines that will be constructed as part of this Project is about 47.5 miles.
