KERSEY: We have a number of 6 speakers that we -- we have a number of speakers that 7 we need to get to, and so we're going to be starting 8 with the speakers that we had -- were not able to 9 speak at the afternoon session. 10 We also need to end at 09:30 p.m., so 11 we are going to be keeping this -- keeping your -- if 12 you could keep your comments to three minutes, that 13 would be great. Ladies and gentlemen, please come to 14 order. 15 On the record, I call case 22-T-0346, 16 application of Empire Offshore Wind, L.L.C., for a 17 certificate of environmental compatibility and public 18 need for the construction of approximately 12 miles 19 of transmission lines from the boundary of New York 20 State territorial waters to a point of 21 interconnection in the town of Hempstead, Nassau 22 County. 23 Good evening and welcome. We are here 24 today for a public statement hearing that was noticed

on September 20th, 2023. This public statement

Offshore Wind Transport Corporation's proposal to construct, operate, and maintain the New York portion of the transmission facilities required to interconnect Empire Offshore Wind's proposed Empire Wind II offshore wind generating facility to be located within the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management to a point of interconnection with the New York State transmission systems located at an expansion of the Barrett 138 kilovolt substation located at Oceanside in the town of Hempstead, New York.

My name is Tara Kersey. I am an Administrative Law Judge for the Department of Public Service. With me today is Ashley Moreno, also an Administrative Law Judge at the Department of Public Service. Together we are responsible for presiding over the hearings in this case and the development of a complete record.

We may also make recommendations to the New York State Public Service Commission, which is the ultimate decision maker in this case. Empire Offshore Wind, L.L.C. and E.W. Offshore Wind

Transport Corporation's proposal is being reviewed

On a moving forward base, I will -- I will refer to the companies as the applicants. Prior to any construction, applicants must first obtain a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need from the Public Service Commission for the New York portion of the transmission facility.

When the case is eventually brought before the Commission for decision, the Commission may adopt, reject or modify the applicant's proposal. The Commission will make its decision in this proceeding, including the statements here today based — the Commission's decision — the Commission, I'm sorry, will make its decision based on the entire record developed in this proceeding, including the statements made here today.

I will also note that the offshore wind facility is not being reviewed as part of this proceeding. The offshore wind facility is being reviewed and considered by the federal government.

Only the New York portion of the transmission facility is being considered in this proceeding by the Commission.

We are holding this hearing so that

10/11/2023 - Empire Offshore Wind, LLC - 22-T-0346 you can provide your comments. We are here to -- we are here to hear from you on this proposal for the Public Service Commission's consideration. The Commission consists of seven members, the Chairperson Rory Christian and Commissioners Diane Burman, James Alesi, Tracey Edwards, John Howard, David Valesky and John Maggiore.

Now I'll explain the process that we are going to follow this evening. As stated, the purpose of tonight's hearing is to provide you with an opportunity to tell the Commission your thoughts on the applicant's transmission proposal.

The statements that you make today, as I had stated earlier, will become part of the case record. We have a court reporter with us today who will prepare a transcript of the hearing, which will be included in the -- in the official record of this proceeding so that your comments can be considered by all members of the Commission.

When it is ready, the transcript will be available for view on the Department of Public Service website. This hearing is not an evidentiary hearing or a Q&A session, but a forum to hear comments from you.

They are available at the back of the table with our Department of Public Service outreach staff. We will call the speakers up one by one using the card.

Please speak slowly and clearly so that the court reporter can accurately capture your statement for the record. To the extent that you have a lengthy written statement, please summarize your statement orally or submit the full record — the full written statement by email or mail.

Please do not interrupt the speakers, and please make sure to silence your cell phones.

Our first speaker is Paul Bennett, followed by Steven Morola. Okay, our next speaker is Dave Dennenberg.

Our speaker is Joseph Naham, to be followed by Peter Gollon.

MR. NAHAM: It was good morning, and now I'll say good evening. Hello, Your Honors and Commissioners. Thank you for holding this hearing and providing the opportunity to hear neighbors' opinions. My name is Joseph Ross Naham, and I am the co-chair of the Long Beach Environmental Advisory Board.

We meet monthly, and our meetings are

10/11/2023 - Empire Offshore Wind, LLC - 22-T-0346 always open to the public, but no one else attends. We finally presented to the city council 10 months ago, and we presented many proposals, and when Equinor came up, there was only support.

Five months later, Equinor met with the Long Beach Environmental Advisory Board, and that -- and at that time, the city council did not join. We were broadsided when our paid elected officials decided to brush the E.A.V.B. aside and wrote out a message opposing this beneficial project without any hint, let alone a heads up.

It's hard not to feel like window treatment, volunteering our time like I am tonight on behalf of my community's well-being. I am fourth generation Long Beach, as is my wife, and we remember when Hurricane Sandy inundated our community.

We lost -- we lost everything, as tens of thousands also had. We saw the seven-story mounds of trash that were collected by the National Guard and held on the Superblock and at Nickerson Beach and many other temporary dumps.

Those items and waste materials didn't help other animals in our ecosystem. It was sheetrock, carpet, furniture, appliances, and massive

10/11/2023 - Empire Offshore Wind, LLC - 22-T-0346 amounts of human commodities. From a bird's eye view, it was a sight that was inevitable.

My wife and I tried to do due diligence. The tax base was gone and two schools were offline. We saw more container ships lined up offshore than ever, more than 9/11, and all the ports in New York and New Jersey harbors were inundated.

The ships didn't dock. The container ships were chemical tankers, oil tankers, and human commodity container ships, items that would give our communities anywhere from a few moments to a few years' worth of satisfaction, but would end up in landfills or the emissions would impact our planet for hundreds to millions of years from now.

No matter where we lived, we wished to be active, leave this planet in the same or better -- leave it in the same or better conditions than when we entered it. I attended meetings that the city and the State hosted with a focus on resilience and engineering where they had engineers and architects from the Netherlands who showed and tried -- tested true innovations which they had implemented and resolved their needs to adapt to the constant flooding.

But the only thing that this community
has worked overwhelmingly hard for on a bioethical
objective has been moving barely treated sewage from
one location to another.

When we look at all the challenges that our community is facing, reduced vendors accepting recycling, the flaw is that this challenge is due to humans demanding electricity.

And the city in which this hearing is taking place was once five separate islands separated by seven inlets for hundreds of thousands of years and it wasn't until the late 19th century when humans decided to dredge the -- and fill five of those inlets and make a man-made island.

That was before cars were even a thought. We had horses and trains and this city never had a comprehensive development plan. We can't consciously impact neighboring wetlands anymore to lay a conduit there.

There are similar lines running from Roslyn to East Garden City, another further out east on the island, but I believe both of these cables are D.C. cables so A.C. might be a compromise that they could use. The site that the electrical substation

10/11/2023 - Empire Offshore Wind, LLC - 22-T-0346 is proposed is 200 feet plus right across from the site of the former Long Beach incinerator which hasn't been touched for decades.

Our city has a population of 33,000 and the population blows up to 80,000 in the summer and in 2028 all motor vehicle manufacturers will be fully transitioned to electrical vehicles. The city currently doesn't even have any public electrical charge stations.

We have an R.P. for one site by the city hall. That is clearly underwhelming to what demand will be, especially for visitors making large out-of-state trips to visit people who live in apartments without available parking.

Because our snowflake Council members are dodging 65 million dollars in city funding which ultimately would be leaving an anti-tax -- an anti-wind tax of 3,600 dollars per household. I want that to sit in. I want cleaner oceans, healthier children, independence from dangerous fossil fuels and recycling use.

We could recycle the wind blades and make them into roofs for bus shelters or telephone poles. Conduit would be high voltage so it runs with

2 less frequency and less resistance than low voltage
3 so there isn't vibration coming off of it.
4 As you heard, it's just 16 N.G.s. It

As you heard, it's just 16 N.G.s. It will power over 700,000 homes with clean energy that will be here forever even if the shoreline moves north in 38 years. I want the beneficial offshore -- offshore wind turbines and science is my hero.

A.L.J. KERSEY: Thank you.

A.L.J. MORENO: Thank you so much.

And just for clarification, the noise you were
hearing, we -- we are using a timer. We asked folks
earlier to try to stick to three minutes and we have
so many speakers that we're going to have to insist
on it now.

So when you hear that noise, it means your three minutes are up. Again, if you have a lengthier statement, we're very happy to hear from you. If you would put it in writing or if you have a written statement here today that's lengthy, we're happy to accept that and put it into the record but we're going to need people to stay to the three minute timeframe. Thank you.

MR. GOLLON: Good evening. My name is

Peter Gollon and I've been a Huntington resident for

40 years. My background is nuclear physics and I've

learned as a -- as a scientist to distinguish fact

from fiction. When the facts that I encounter differ

from what I have previously believed, I revise my

opinions. That's how science progresses. I urge the

audience to do the same.

I was also a LIPA trustee for five years and it's clear from what I know that while the energy from the offshore wind project will land here, a good bit of it will get exported north and a fair amount will stay here to power Long Island to replace what's currently generated at Barrett.

A.L.J. MORENO: Again, everyone who is registered will have a turn. Please do not interrupt the speakers.

MR. GOLLON: I know you're here not to pass judgment on the offshore component but only on the cable, but it's worth mentioning because other people may have brought it up that the industrialization of the ocean, you can see that now.

The lineup of ship after ship after ship is very close. It's very hard to see something that's 11 miles offshore whereas I can see the

Barrett plant right here. The complaint about rising costs of offshore wind, well natural gas prices fluctuate as well and every rate payer here bears that penalty.

There are some comments made about inadequacy of batteries. That technology will evolve. They're not buying them today. Similarly, about what to do about recycling wind turbine blades, we'll have 50 years or 25 years to figure that out. It will progress.

What -- what I would suggest is that everybody here acknowledge that we need the offshore wind and we need the proposal that is before us here is that it has to be landed somewhere. The question that you must consider is where to land it and how it -- how it should progress to the high voltage transmission lines.

My suggestion which I don't think anybody will like is that somebody from Equinor, somebody who likes to preserve the wetlands, somebody who lives locally and maybe somebody from the general anti-climate change community be locked in a room and fed stale bread until they come up with a routing that satisfies them all. Thank you.

Our next 4 speaker is Arthur Schnee followed by Helen Alessi. 5 Our next speaker is George O'Neill followed by Ellen Feldman. 6 7 MS. ALESSI: Good evening. Thank you so much for coming here. I remember the first time I 8 9 thought, oh my gosh, these Judges need to come here to understand and see what this place is like and 10 11 what is happening. 12 I am here as the director of Long 13 Beach Latino Civic Association representing over 14 1,000 members and growing in Long Beach, Island Park 15 and Oceanside. In Long Beach, Hispanics are 15% of 16 35,000 people and in Island Park, it is 40% of that 17 community. 18 I am also a 20-year resident of Long 19 Beach and have since moved to Island Park during the 20 pandemic so that my children and grandchildren from 21 the Bronx could move in with us over that summer. 22 The wind turbine cable will be running 23 right behind my home in Island Park. So you can see 24 why this is especially important to me personally.

We all want to know and understand this project more

The Latino and Hispanic community is only now becoming aware of this project. While the New York State Public Service Commission and NYSERDA and Equinor are making efforts to put information in Spanish, this is a process that takes time and a more intensive effort to engage all parts of the three communities about this project which will impact us so deeply.

Long Beach Latino Civic Association is an environmental justice organization and while we would like to see the reduction of carbon footprint, we especially feel that these are communities that have historical and current relevance for this project.

We support the continuation of outreach to all diverse communities that make up the beautiful communities of Long Beach, Island Park, and Oceanside.

Lastly, I want to thank the two interpreters who have been doing an exceptional job this entire proceeding. I would like to take a moment to try to say that quickly in Spanish so that there are folks who are here could understand it.

It's quite insulting that birds rank above humans in the process in trying to get something off the ground. Now I'm going to just read off very quickly an article that maybe not everybody found. This is in the news in English, it's actually a Norwegian report. Norway's state oil company Equinor continued to be dragged through the mud this week as its scandalous losses on U.S. operations blah, blah, blah.

I'll go down to say oil minister Tina

Brew had already summoned Equinor's chief executive

and the leader of Equinor's board to her office on

Monday afternoon. I can go on and on. They're not
happy with them.

It goes on to say that they were disgusted with how they treat -- how Equinor treated

But they're not good actors. They
just left and made a lot of people upset. And I tend
to not like when on any side when people are
disrespectful to each other. But there's a lot of
people passionate with these cables running right
through. But I'm going to now talk about New York
State.

So excuse me for one second, I just went to the wrong thing. I can't believe I just did this one, I'm so upset that people took so long before.

New York State has a mandate essentially that what they want is for us to go to renewable energies. There's also a mandate to actually care about the minority population in the -- in the State of New York. 55%, Helen just said, is

Hispanic. We're not even talking about AfricanAmerican communities like Ms. Lake spoke about before

Because you cannot dump a project that is exploratory in nature in terms of the health impact in a minority community and not think that the U.S. Justice Department is not going to say what happened. It's happening in Louisiana, it's happening everywhere across this country.

So I think Equinor didn't do their homework because New York State doesn't like when you drop a project that could negatively impact minorities and you hope that no one finds out about it until it's too late.

I expect more from New York State, I chose to live here, I'm getting a little tired, New York State, because we -- we care more about birds and we care less about whales and humans and we need to get back on track. Thank you very much for your

I'm Marj Issapour, I 7 do not live in Long Beach, I live on Long Island, I do bring my kids to Long Beach and Marvel is their 8 9 favorite ice cream place, so I do care about Long 10 Beach. 11 But I'm an educator, I'm a professor 12 at Farmingdale State College and have been working in 13 renewable energy and education in renewable energy 14 since 2007 officially. So I'm here to kind of talk 15 about -- I sat here, I had a written statement but I 16 kind of trashed it after listening to everyone who 17 was getting very emotional about their families. 18 I actually had prepared a paper to 19 talk about E.M.F. and I realized I'm going to just 20 trash that piece and I want to talk to you guys about 21 -- I'm an electrical engineer by the way, by 22 training. Now, E.M.F.s can be hazardous to health. 23 If I was a union worker, an I.B.E.W. 24 person that was running high voltage cables and was

exposed to them every day, and I was three months

When we bury these six -- first of all, the shielding actually masks a lot of the E.M.F., right? And also, burying them six feet underground is equivalent of having something 50 or 60 feet above ground. So burying them underground is actually extra shielding than actually having the high voltage cables around the highways.

But I'm going to just trash all that because there was a lot of other misinformation that people were putting out here about whales and everything else and their children and their grandchildren. I want everyone who's here to consider your -- the life of your grandchildren when the temperature of earth raises 1.4 more degrees. There will be nothing left.

So we're standing here arguing over -and by the way, the only -- the only comment that I
heard that made sense and I could sit down and
actually think about it is rerouting. Nothing else.
Everything else that was brought up here very
emotionally about the health of the families and the
children, it's all misinformation.

And because I'm in education, I would encourage not only Equinor but all other developers who've gone through this and are going through this in other municipalities to get ahead of that and put some really more information in terms of one-to-one education for people who are advocates against these things.

That's all I can recommend. Other than that, I do urge you to please do not delay this project. There are two accomplices -- major accomplices against our -- that are actually contributing to our climate change.

One is the amount of fossil fuel we are burning worldwide and not just in U.S. and not just in Europe, right? Worldwide, it's burning fuel to create electricity, which are electricity consumptions going up in the world.

And number two is transportation in U.S., right? Once you get transportation and electricity generation under control, you have some hope for the future. I'm not here to scare you. I'm here to say it is scary. It's going to be scary for our grandchildren if we keep business as usual.

And that's all I'm going to say. If

It's today's -- just look on your phones or whatever, where you get your stock news, E.Q.N.R., you're signing this a contract, okay, where you're -- you're building for Austria, gas. I mean, what can I tell you?

I predict, and you could write this, you know, and I probably won't be alive, so the rest of you are going to have to pay for it, okay? But this is going to cost the government a ton of money, and in the end, it's not going to be worth it. Thank you.

In regards to 17 costs and alternatives, I want to point out the chosen cable route is in fact the shortest route, 18 19 contrary to what the permit manager said. 20 The more appropriate route would be 21 the water route, Jones Beach or through Shell Creek, 22 but that would be more expensive. So they're taking 23 the easiest route, which is the shortest route. 24 Impacts of the substation in Island Park is going --

the close proximity to homes, residential homes, is

10/11/2023 - Empire Offshore Wind, LLC - 22-T-0346 definitely a concern. The noise pollution, the fire safety issues, because it's unstaffed, it's very concerning.

The permit manager also talked about the Empire Wind One project, which is revitalizing Brooklyn with their new redeveloped Brooklyn Marine Terminal, but we're not getting a revitalization in our town. We're getting industrialized.

The substation area was acquired. It used to be a very popular waterfront venue. Now Island Park is going to be industrialized on both sides with the Barrett plant, POP substation, wind turbines in Long Beach, and additional P.O.I. at the Leotis site for the Hampton Road substation P.O.I.

Permit manager also mentioned six feet cable burial. That's not going to be enough because six feet was the Block Island's cable burial depth and those are all exposed and the -- the cost is going to get passed on to those poor residents. It's not fair.

I want to talk about due diligence as well. It's important to do our due diligence on the applicant because this is a very, very critical project. The planning for one, choosing a cable

The applicant's Beacon Wind project runs their cable 200 plus miles up the coast of Montauk all the way to Astoria simply to avoid the North Shore of Long Island. They say it in their planning documents that making a cable landfall on the North Shore would be too disruptive to residential communities.

Sinkholes have become -unfortunately, we've just -- we've had a series of
them. Our grounds are not stable. We had one in
Lido Beach earlier this summer, an additional one in
Oceanside, West Hempstead, Baldwin and just earlier
this week, another one in Oceanside.

I want to mention due diligence again. Can we choose an applicant that hasn't had an S.E.C. violation for alleged bribery to Iranian officials to obtain projects? Can we find an applicant who didn't have an incident in Ohio with a fracking project that'd gone wrong, contaminated the Opossum Creek?

And I met my husband Tim right here in Long Beach.

We raised our boys here to care for their neighbors and to be good stewards of this planet. My husband and I both run home businesses and I also commute twice a week to the city. We persevered through Hurricane Sandy because our neighbors stepped up and we helped each other because that's the kind of neighborhood this is. We all do things for each other and we care about each other.

Very few people in this room know this, but I got cancer in 2019 and our family has persevered once again. 25 treatments of radiation, watching my skin burn off of my body so I know what that is.

In 2023, I received a letter

I'm happy for Equinor because they say that New York allows 200 milligauss of E.M.F. in the — in the environment, but New York also allows yellow dye, smoking, alcohol, bioengineered food and vaping in our State.

I also just learned that 63 milligauss will be right on my sidewalk where I walk my dog where we cross the street to go to the beaches. I also park my car across the street and I understand that if I leave my car and finish my phone call, I will be ingesting cumulative E.M.F. radiation.

I learned along the way, I learned everything -- everything I possibly could about this project and I learned how E.M.F. affects humans. I learned that E.M.F. is cumulative and I found a

This terrifies me, not just for myself, but for my future grandchildren, I was planning on growing up here. I learned that the turbine blades are made with epoxy and resin and that they contain bisphenol A.

Bisphenol A is a toxic substance that attacks the endocrine system. It causes cancer and all kinds of issues with your body. These turbines will be spinning their blades at 200 miles per hour and because of the sea -- because of the sea spray, they will have what's called leading edge erosion.

Now this bisphenol A will get into the air and also the ocean. The fish will eat the bisphenol A and we eat the fish. The water will be picked up by the clouds in rainwater and it will be sprayed onto our aquifer and go into our drinking water.

Water filters cannot dissipate these bisphenol A's, but you know what can? Your stomach

The route of this cable just does not make sense. Of all the wind turbine projects being developed and contemplated all around Long Island,

Empire Wind has the most megawatts, the most

Those other projects, Beacon Wind,

hundreds of miles underwater to power complexes, or
through a State county park, or a very small scale
project that ran through a very small beach community
where the houses are well set off the road.

The route of the cable does not make sense unless the developer, Equinor, is looking to minimize their costs by selecting the cheapest route for the cable with no regard to the Long Beach citizens and the impacted communities.

By selecting this current route through a highly populated, highly trafficked area on a barrier island with water mains, gas lines, sewer lines, sharing the subsurface under the roadway with the potential of sinkholes, Equinor has made the decision to maximize the impact of the project on the citizens of Long Beach and our community.

This is after the City of Long Beach and the City Council have already refused to sell or

And I'd like to also point out that there were two different slides. The first gentleman said that they were going to be buried six feet, and then on future slides it says three to four feet, so which is it?

As an Island Park resident and a South Shore resident my whole life with a home very close to the proposed substation, the danger the proposed substation and high voltage cables running through densely residential areas has an impact on our health, environment, safety, and property values.

It will harm the environment, oceans, more than making any movement towards climate change. In island -- in Island Park there are only two main roads as evacuation routes. If there is a fire, terrorism to the substation, there is no on-site surveillance. Why?

It is the only evacuation route for the most of the populated area of Long Beach where

So like I said, I am here to make a public announcement that I -- I agree that the levels of danger to my financial, physical, mental and emotional health are not being considered. That ocean out there is access to my God, that's what I look at, that's what I sit at, and that's what I pray.

I don't go to a church, I don't go anywhere else. I live here for a reason. That's access to my spiritual health. In an environment and the world that's going on right now that we're talking about how serious mental health is, I am far from alone.

On 9/11, my family came down and sat on that beach, we were not alone, we were surrounded by residents who find peace, and solace, and hope, and faith on that beach. What they're asking to do is come here and violate my personal space, I paid --

As stated in this article, they develop -- as they stated, they develop -- they plan on developing this whole lease area, the whole lease area, right.

This is a following of the excerpt from this, which I'm happy to give to you as public record. It states that Equinor Wind has now submitted the lease, blah, blah, in which it proposes only a one nautical mile setback.

It justifies its proposal by quoting

The cruise lines, the fisheries, the tugboats, the tugboats want five mile nautical miles because they can't stop those boats. And when one of those boats crashes into one of those turbines, everything's going to hell, and it's going to burn and we can't put it out.

And those fumes and all those chemicals, that stuff's getting in our air and our water. And the other thing nobody's talking about is

piling up somewhere and we already know how toxic
they are. But my main reason for being here is about

miles out, I mean, that will destroy everything we've

this community, it will lessen our property values.

They make a sound, especially when there's that many of them going across the horizon, that will be audible from our beaches, and God only knows, from our homes.

This is from Newsday and Newsday has been supporting wind energy forever and ever, and

A good plan makes sense on several fronts, this plan makes little sense on any front. Evidence exits that this power line could affect the health of our citizens, especially those that live along the route, or attend the grade school that exists along that route.

Equinor and others can cite this study or that study that asserts that this cable presents no danger, while those against the installment of this cable can present their own studies that assert that, in fact, this cable is dangerous.

DALTON: 18 not comfortable speaking publicly and I'm extremely 19 nervous but I feel that this is so important that I 20 have to say something. 21 A.L.J. MORENO: Uh-huh. 22 MS. DALTON: Like many, like most 23 people here, I am opposed to it. I -- I also -- I live in Island Park. I've lived in Island Park for 24 25 just over 20 years. I am a mom, first and foremost,

So besides which there are many first responders in Long Beach, there are very many, most of them were down at 9/11. We were told that the air was safe and we still went in, and for that I -- I battled my -- I had my fight with cancer also.

So needless to say, when I heard that a substation was going to be within steps of my house, I was concerned, I have one son who had a history of seizures, he's better, I don't want him going -- getting cancer. I have another son who is autistic, he is doing much better.

But again, as a mother, you want to protect your kids. As a retired law enforcement, I want to protect -- I've protected strangers and I did what I had to do. Now, I'm asking the Commission to protect us, we are up against -- I feel like it's a David and Goliath situation but I went to Bridgewater and I talked to a scientist, right.

And I asked him, do you have cables running through your backyard? He wouldn't answer me. And I looked, do you have a wind turbine in your backyard? He wouldn't answer. Actually, from my

There was a professor from Farmingdale earlier, she said she likes Long Beach, she comes here for ice cream, that's very nice. My kids went to Long Beach High School. My kids have been on the track team, Long Beach, because we're connected, that we're this connected.

That if you wanted your kids to go to this school, or sports activity, I have friends, I spend more time in Long Beach than I do in Island Park, actually. But it's my choice obviously, I chose to live here. After 9/11, I wanted a safe place for my kids to live, right?

I tried to do what I had to do to protect them. I don't want it taken away, I don't want it taken away where I have to now choose their health and move somewhere else and run the risk of moving again because I don't know what I'm going to move to.

I don't want a cable that they're saying it's going to be one minute its five feet, then the next minute it's three feet down, which is it?

I know in my backyard if we dig down, three feet we hit water, okay. We are constantly being flooded, we just -- just a couple of days ago water in our -- in our garage, I was the lucky one, that's all I had, a little bit of water.

Other people have water in their basements, you know, we're constantly going through this, we're used to doing the battle, we're used to building up again, right. But we cannot fight this battle if you're going to put that much power running through our residents.

They said before they have never done this before, they have never run through a residential neighborhood, then why do this here -- why do this here? Not only that, but that substation is unmanned and I know from security reasons, the guy from Brooklyn who's supposed to respond, we will all burn before they come.

The fire department is not trained to deal with how to handle -- how to put out that fire. They have not been trained, they don't have the equipment to fight the battle. So you are tied -- their hands are tied. They can't help us if they wanted to.

If they have construction for three to five years or more, that's our only way out with the flooding. So basically, approving this plan is saying, good luck, find your own way out. MS. HAUT: Okay. It just feels like a discussion over wording, that's my comment. It does not feel like a negotiation, that's my feeling.

A.L.J. MORENO: Okay.

MS. HAUT: The U.S.A. is in a race to install offshore wind because of renewable goals put in place on a national and State level. We all want to wean off of fossil fuel but the collateral damage of the offshore wind expansion to meet the goals are not being fully considered.

We know offshore wind will not reduce energy bills and will cause tremendous disruption to our community. And although we're being told that the ocean impacts are manageable, nobody will know for sure for many years to come.

With so many wind farms in the -- in

Unfortunately, current studies only look at the impact of one individual wind farm. Where are the studies that show the impact of all the wind farms in totality on our water quality, sea life, boating, safety, and fishing industry?

In Equinor's filings, the cable were routed to come to Long Beach. I live in Lido Beach and I asked Equinor at their Allegria community meeting, what would happen if you can't go to Long Beach and you need to use one of the alternate sites, such as Lido Beach.

They said they would need to start the regulatory process from the beginning. I am alarmed that more recent filings now show the cable is slated to go to Long Beach or Lido Beach. How did this happen? Does this mean that if they use what was formerly called an alternative site like Lido Beach, that now they don't have to start over the regulatory approval and they get fast tracked?

Will Lido Beach get the full opportunity to consider the impacts of the cable?

All local communities are so afraid of the cable

In Equinor's alternative cable route study, they never looked at running its cable line to Jones Beach and continuing north up the Ocean parkway avoiding high density areas. Instead, they merely looked at Jones Beach and then a shortcut west through Freeport and determined that it was unfair to burden Freeport because it's an underserved area.

Also, Equinor should have included in their alternate route study using Anabaric Juno Express Cable that goes to Jones Beach. This proposed shared cable could serve Equinor as well as additional future wind farms for an overall safer, more economical solution on the whole.

Lastly, Equinor's alternative route study overlooked the simplest of cable solutions, which would be to use the cable line all -- already being laid down for the Equinor wind project going to Brooklyn. Why lay two cables when you could lay one?

We are not Europe. Europe does not get hurricanes like what we do and it is unknown if these wind turbines can withstand anything above a Cat 3. What happens if the wind farm is destroyed?

If you recall, the very first question to the applicant from a gentleman sitting right over there on the left-hand side that they were asked after giving their prepared slideshow was about the claim that Equinor made regarding the total amount of electrical capability -- capacity, excuse me, to be carried by the cables running through the streets, through our communities on their way to the first substation.

It was put to the Equinor's spokesman who had just before he gave his presentation,

The question that was asked of him was because he made the point that the line was only going to carry 345 kilo -- kilowatts of power. So would that in fact make the total amount of power going to the substation 690 and he said, and we can get the court reporter note, okay, and then, there was some back and forth when the man insisted that he was right, okay.

Silence. Question. Silence. He finally asked his technical expert after five minutes of silence and repeating the same answer. He finally got the tech guy from Equinor to stand up and basically say, yes, you are correct. The total amount of voltage going into the first substation is 690, simple math.

So that leaves me with a question here. Is this a mistake of the head or is this the mistake of the heart? If the expert himself is not quite sure about the power going to the substation, then he is not technically qualified, his company is

And if he was -- and he was -- and if he was trying to deceive us, okay, by not telling us the truth and hoping that his stalling and his non-answering would just basically go away, then they're not qualified by virtue of their business integrity to run this project.

So Equinor is either too ignorant to operate or too far below the board to be entrusted with a complex project of this magnitude with the inherent possible catastrophic consequences and should be disqualified on that basis alone.

We've heard about Equinor's business dealings before. They're well documented. Okay.

This is who we're choosing to jump into bed with?

In closing, I would like to say that, while I understand the need for bureaucratic agencies within the government to process the routine, mundane day-to-day business of government, there are just some things that are too consequential to be cited -- to be decided in this kind of a forum with too many unanswered questions and with such life changing consequences.

So for these and many other reasons,

My recent experiments with climate impacts last -- a couple of weeks ago, we -- we had hundreds of years of rainfall amounts, we broke the record for the third time in recent years. We had massive smoke from Canada. Bunch of wildfires worldwide, massive hurricanes, massive heat waves killed millions of people across the planet in -- in five continents.

What -- what are you concerned -- what
-- my concern about losing if we don't change -- if
we don't take any action. I was at the United
Nations a month -- a month ago speaking with world
leaders from 200 countries to come up with a solution
to end the fossil fuel sources to end the climate
crisis right now and put clean sources of clean

I do not repeat any of the anti-wind dis -- disinformation even to, you know, if you will, just highlight and reinforce the fake narrative that forces us to play on their terms which are not real the truth and all possessions are on the side of them.

Of course, there are questions about the economic viability of this project. Recent Newsday articles have highlighted that. So perhaps this is all moot because with no project, there is no cables but we'll assume that the -- that the turbines are present.

The siting of the cable is obviously being run through, you know, highly dense residential communities. There are alternatives, however, that seem, you know, more reasonable perhaps in Jones Beach or through a wetland or, you know, several miles underwater out of -- out of -- out of you know, out of the way to the inland grid facility therein.

So I'll just suggest then since they're pretty obvious when you look at the map. One is Long Beach Road. Okay. There is -- I think there's no residential -- there's no residential dwellings on Long Beach Road, North of Park Avenue.

So we have political problems perhaps, but the Long Beach Road option seems the most viable, although it is a county road and the county is -- has different leadership, perhaps than in the Governor's office in terms of their commitment to wind energy.

The other issue I have with this project, is people are talking -- the people that are speaking in support of this project, are talking about the Barrett plant going away.

This project does not include the

Barrett plant being decommissioned. It's not part of
the environmental review. It's not part of the scope
of work for Equinor. And therefore, if this project
were to be built, you're going to have an active and
operational wind farm and you're going to have an

25	since 2015 we have worked to promote renewable

I'm here to voice my support for the Empire Wind project and its application for interconnection. We need as much renewable energy to plug into our grid as possible as quickly as possible. I travel out here to give testimony because the decisions made here affect all of us across the State, not just the residents of Long Beach.

I'm here because the current energy system is -- is not working. That system includes offshore oil drilling, leaky pipelines, fracked gas looters, and dirty power plants all along our rivers.

Right now the air is consistently more polluted in areas around every gas fired power plant in our region. Air pollution has real impacts. We see it in the higher rates of asthma and other respiratory diseases, and in neighborhoods like Astoria.

For years my organization has been working to close these polluting gas fired power plants and replace the energy they generate with renewables. That goal is finally in sight with the

Offshore wind is especially useful for helping us close the most polluting peaker plants because offshore wind generates some of the highest levels of energy during the afternoons and evenings when the demand for energy for electricity is highest.

But meanwhile, as we're waiting for renewable energy projects to be approved, built and connected, organizations like mine have to continually fend off attempts from gas utilities like National Grid to repower -- quote, unquote, repower, old gas turbines and build new pipelines, compressor stations, liquefied natural gas tanks and vaporizers, which they always propose to build in disadvantaged communities.

When we found out that the Beacon Wind Project will plug into the N.Y.C. power grid in Astoria, we celebrated, knowing it would become easier to eventually shut down the gas fired power plants that are still there.

We felt similarly about Empire Wind
One plugging into the Gowanus substation. By
plugging into Long Island's power grid Empire Wind

Not only do they want 240 of these things but the integrated plan calls for about 2,500 on the East Coast, similar amounts on the West Coast, the Gulf of Mexico, of things that have been half rejected now in Germany, where they're going back to coal, they're using brown coal.

And these things are the Empire State Building. They're as big as the Empire State Building and approximately half of that. It is a really big deal that we don't have a firehouse that's going to be able to deal with a situation like this. There's only one egress out of that building. And it's only one road, it's a small access road. It is not deep enough and safe enough for trucks to get through.

We're in a flood zone, they're talking about building this high or 15 feet high. So they can mitigate our flood zone because they're looking to build on three feet above the flood zone but if there's four feet of water, the road itself is impassable.

We aren't -- they're not going to be able to -- nobody's going to be able to get to them. I was here during Sandy. The Coast Guard came in on their boat onto the landing of the railroad station and that's how they were harboring people in and out

These guys are talking about flooding and global warming, okay, but we're still talking about the flood level going up higher. So all this stuff that they're talking about building, National Grids, people working in 2022 says they're not -- nobody should be building anything electrical that's under -- above -- under three feet below sea level or above sea level.

And they also talk about those -those docks. They have to be put four feet
underwater, but like I mean, underground, but like
you just heard other people say when you dig three
feet into our yard, there's water.

So they're talking about building these concrete bunkers that are supposed to be 25 feet wide because of the -- the distance of the cable to make sure that the rebound of the electricity that they generate doesn't continue to capitulate, you know, multiply, that's the easier word, right? And then, make it worse because they're talking about the load of those -- those wires.

What's coming in could be a much higher voltage and when that goes in, that's when they have to start to like power down or power it up and stuff like that. risk factor and they never spoke, not once about what the conductor is that's going to cool those wires.

Now, those are supposed to be fan, watered with all different kinds of applications, though, there's a -- starts with a W.

Sorry. Wisconsin. Wisconsin

Powerplant. They have a whole line on -- on how

these things are supposed to be put in the ground and
cooled because they generate heat and they never once
talked about the heat factor, and what that's going
to do to the, you know, like the -- the viability of
the cable. So there's a lot of things they're not
telling us, I'm sorry, thank you.
