



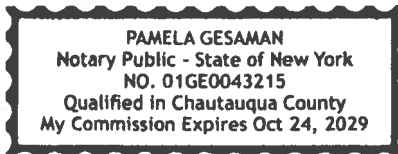

NOTICE TO ELECTRIC USERS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Board of Public Utilities, City of Jamestown, New York, that on July 1, 2025, it issued and filed with the Public Service Commission of the State of New York revised leaves to its Schedule for Electric Service, P.S.C. No. 7 – Electric to become effective as of January 1, 2026. The new rates, which are intended to provide a rate increase of approximately 8.08% based on retail sales revenue, are as follows:

RATES AND CHARGES: Changes in rates and charges are proposed as follows:
