Re: Case 22-E-0236 - Proceeding to Establish Alternatives to Traditional Demand-Based Rate Structures for Commercial Electric Vehicle Charging.

Dear Paul Colbert:

I received your September 10, 2024 letter filed on behalf of the Joint Utilities,<sup>1</sup> requesting 14-day extensions to comply with Ordering Clauses 1, 10, 11, and 12 of the Commission's *Order Establishing Load Management Technology Incentive Programs*, issued August 19, 2024, in the above-referenced proceeding. Ordering Clauses 1, 10, and 11 require the Joint Utilities to establish Load Management Technology Incentive Programs (LMTIPs) and to make the programs available for customer participation, by October 18, 2024, while Ordering Clause 12 requires the filing of Implementation Plans by September 18, 2024.

You state that despite having made significant progress toward establishing a shared LMTIP design, technology eligibility criteria, and program requirements, additional time is needed to fully prepare the Implementation Plans and LMTIPs for customer enrollment. Accordingly, extensions until October 2, and November 1, 2024, respectively, are requested to (1) complete the LMTIP Implementation Plans and (2) to open the LMTIPs for participant enrollment and develop program marketing materials. You state that these extensions will enable the Joint Utilities to complete the coordination required to write their Implementation Plans and prepare for program implementation.

Based on the information you have provided, an extension until October 2, 2024, is granted to the Joint Utilities to comply with Ordering Clause 12, and an extension until November 1, 2024, is granted to the Joint Utilities to comply with Ordering Clauses 1, 10, and 11. These extensions are granted to promote the fair, orderly, and efficient conduct of these proceedings, and this ruling will be posted on the Department's website.
