call case 23-E-0727, complaint of MarieAnn and Richard Cherry and others concerning LED street lights in the Village of Cambridge. Good evening and welcome. name is Tara Kersey, and I am an Administrative Law Judge with the New York State Department of Public Service, and I have been assigned to preside over this

Joining me this afternoon are employees from the Department's Office of Consumer Services, who will be providing technical and operational assistance.

We are here today for a Public Statement Hearing that was noticed on March 26th, 2024. hearing is intended to allow public comment on a petition filed on December 13th, 2021 by 52 customers of Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation doing business as National Grid, and we'll refer to them herein as National Grid or the Company.

Pursuant to Public Service Law Section

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1 4/17/2024 - MarieAnn & Richard Cherry, et al - 23-E-0727 72, the petitioner shall have an opportunity to be 2 3 heard in respect to the matters complained of. December 2019 and January 2020, National Grid converted 4 the street lighting fixtures in the Village of 5 Cambridge in Washington County from high pressure 6 sodium fixtures to light emitting diode fixtures. The 7 petition argues that these light emitting diode or LED 8 fixtures in the village are harmful to a village 9 resident with epilepsy, and requests that the Public 10 Service Commission require National Grid to remove the 11 LED fixtures and replace them with conventional 12 lighting, to lower the fixtures to less than 20 feet, 13 and to otherwise eliminate or minimize the impact of 14 such lighting on the residents, excuse me, in the 15 village. On January 23rd, 2024, Department of Public 16 Service staff filed its Department of Public Service 17 Staff Report pursuant to Public Service Law Section 71, 18 which we will refer to herein as the staff report 19 regarding the petition. The staff report examines the 20 regulatory requirements regarding LED street lighting 2.1 and the requirements of the company's tariff. 22 staff report explains that the LED fixtures installed 23 at the Village of Cambridge's request comply with state 24 and federal regulations, and National Grid's actions 25

The New York State Public Service Commission consists of seven members, the chair, Rory Christian, and Commissioners Alesi, Valesky, Maggiore, Bright, and Sheehan. The hearing is not a question and answer session, but a forum to hear comments from the public. This, however, is not the only opportunity for comment. You can submit comments through the Department's website, by regular mail or by telephone. All comments will be given equal consideration regardless of how they are submitted.

Cambridge, New York. With respect, Your Honor, the Commission has missed the point. LED light contains properties that work against a person's natural light processing abilities. This causes problems for some of us more than others, and it should be obvious that it's unfair, wrong, and even dangerous to put LEDs into public street lamps. It's doubly unfair and wrong to force LEDs onto everybody and then make them pay out in money, pain, injury, discomfort, loss of health, and degraded quality of life. These are some of the effects that our petition cited, and which the Commission duly noted in stating its intention to investigate. We did our part by alerting Public Services, and then we waited three years with the harmful effects continuing unabated, only to have the Commission recommend denying us relief based on an off

National Grid, and the trustees didn't give customer constituents any choice before taking away perfectly good useful to all H.P.S. street lighting and installing LEDs that the Department of Energy and industry standard setting entities admit are radically new technology that can cause dangerous and catastrophic reactions and aren't suitable or acceptable for unusually sensitive individuals. We are telling you at Public Services that National Grid's LED street lights are hurting us, and that we want it to We are asking for meaningful, urgent and in my stop. case, life-protecting action because local government and National Grid won't take the harm to us seriously or do anything about it.

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Please note the five H.P.S. lights reinstalled in Cambridge in 2021 returned less than two percent of the village's street lit area to epilepsy safe lighting and those bulbs are only temporary. Public Services claims that its mission is to ensure safe service for its residential customers, and this commitment must apply to all New Yorkers, regardless of anyone's medical susceptibilities. I believe Public Service's own stated mission makes it the Commission's ethical, professional and legal responsibility to

The Commission must cease 3 standing by and leaving us to struggle through sleep-4 disturbed nights, to drive home squinting, flinching 5 and shielding our eyes or to endure any more 6 streetlight-caused brain seizures that could stop our 7 hearts and kill us on the spot. For the Commission to 8 know of our distress but do nothing could easily be 9 seen as negligent and deliberately indifferent, and 10 therefore a form of official misconduct. We are 11 reporting real world adverse health events occurring as 12 symptomatologically, medical fact and happening because 13 we can't get away from the LED lights lining our 14 streets and sidewalks and intruding into our homes. We 15 are reporting cause and effect reactions to the 16 powerfully disruptive and intriguing properties of LED 17 Please remember, pain is a sign of damage and 18 symptoms of sickness mean something has gone wrong with 19 a person's healthy, normal homeostasis. 20

Public Services may deny our petition, but Public Services can't deny established, documented medical facts. National Grid itself doesn't deny that LED light is medically affecting us. National Grid even refers to therapeutic LEDs as proof of benefit,

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but that argument actually speaks against population
scale LED usage. As I reminded National Grid in 2020,
radiation can treat cancer, but no oncologist
irradiates an entire neighborhood just to treat a
single patient. The LED industry too characterizes LED
biomodulation of humans in the lit space as delivering
the dose, but dosing a person without their consent is
a crime, so is injuring someone or making them sick.
For some of us, LED light is like either poison or a
knock out drug. Any device causing pain, injury,
impairment, illness and brain seizures is by definition
unsafe and unfit for general use.

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Public Services can't allow unsafe devices to be used on the New York public, yet maintain its integrity as a Commission serving the public good. And as for National Grid and local trustees, treating customer constituents badly is bad business and bad governance. Tariffs and regulations do not override any law-abiding person's fundamental right to be out on public streets and sidewalks without being harmed by public infrastructure and without interference from a utility company and how they conduct their lives. The Commission will please closely review precautionary and universal design principles and the law regarding human

I asked Public Services to please immediately 6 transfer our citizen reports of LED caused harm to 7 appropriate New York State public health and public 8 safety authorities, and to New York State Attorney 9 General, Letitia James. Even during the day it's difficult to run 4 5 errands or do anything. How can I grocery shop, drive to see my family and friends? How do I visit the 6 doctor or dentist? There are LEDs everywhere and there 7 are strobing pedestrian crossings and emergency 8 vehicles with strobes. Daily, I'm in a fight or flight 9 situation where my life is on the line. I can die from 10 a grand mal seizure due to these LED lights. We reach 11 out to ask for a change or ask for accommodation and 12 just simply be heard. But we're brushed aside as if 13 we're inferior and a nuisance. We do not want special 14 rights. We want equal rights. It's not just a few of 15 us suffering from LEDs. The numbers are increasing. 16 More people have come out explaining how they're 17 suffering from these LEDs and developing migraines, 18 seizures, temporary blindness, et cetera. I was under 19 the impression that we have the freedom of choice when 20 it comes to purchasing anything in this country, toilet 2.1 tissue, food, what car or house to buy. But now we're 22 being forced to use LEDs. But the situation can be 23 remedied by not tweaking these toxic LED lights. 24

Simply just go back to incandescent bulbs.

If you want energy saving lights, tweak the incandescent lights. Thank you. A.L.J. KERSEY: Thank you for your comments, Ms. O'Leary. Our next speaker is Linda Anderson. 

MS. ANDERSON: Hello?

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A.L.J. KERSEY: Ms. Anderson?

MS. ANDERSON: Yes. Can you hear me?

A.L.J. KERSEY: Yes, you may speak

MS. ANDERSON: Okay. My name is Linda

Anderson. Research shows that badly directed and unnecessarily strong lights cause pollution that is equivalent to the carbon dioxide emissions of nearly 20 million cars. Since 2017, lighting has increased by two percent globally each year. This from the book The Darkness Manifesto by Johan Eklöf. We're losing birds, trees, insects. Light pollution is affecting the circadian rhythm of all beings on Earth. Some countries, like France, are actively addressing these concerns head on. Since 2021, France regulates their lights from brightness and color temperature to the time of day, and coverings of their street lighting.

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4/17/2024 - MarieAnn & Richard Cherry, et al - 23-E-0727 Light pollution is the easiest environmental problem to Today, LED lights pose a bigger and new problem over light -- of over lighting. Here in Cambridge, LED lights threaten the health of my neighbor, Marie Cherry. She has epilepsy, and LED lights have caused her greater and more frequent seizures that put her life at risk. For years, her concerns and fears have been met largely by silence and inaction, and to help her does not involve rocket science, like the easiest way to deal with light pollution. The easiest thing to help her is to literally change the lights. Such a simple gesture is not only a kind thing to do, but could prove lifesaving. You are the Public Service Commission of New York State. Please help ensure the safety of my neighbor. I also urge New York State to be proactive and take a long term look at what other countries are doing to curb this growing problem. I will just add that I suffer migraines and that due to LED lights, I believe that my migraines have increased. Thank you.

A.L.J. KERSEY: Thank you for your comments, Ms. Anderson. Our next speaker is Jamie Troese. Jamie?

MR. WHITE: Your Honor. Yeah, sorry

MS. TROESE: My name is Jamie Troese, T-R-O-E-S-E. As someone with a varied background, including being a mother, wife, forester, dance teacher, and working in the public sector, I bring a wealth of experience to the conversations about LED lighting safety. With a master's degree in forestry and several publications under my belt, I am well equipped to contribute to this important discussion.

Neurologically, my body cannot tolerate any form of LED lighting. While some LEDs may be more tolerable than others, the issue isn't about the color of the light or its brightness, also known as lumens. Any exposure to LED lighting triggers some form of a reaction in me. At its worst, LED lighting will induce a seizure symptom or at the very least, it will lead to debilitating migraines. It impairs my ability to concentrate and function professionally, causing intense pain behind my eyes and straight through my I constantly experience pain over my eyebrows, head. accompanied by auras and (unintelligible). In extreme cases, exposure to LED headlights and LED street lights has actually resulted in seizure convulsions even in front of my daughter. Stopped by doctors.

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1 4/17/2024 - MarieAnn & Richard Cherry, et al - 23-E-0727 sensitivity has reached a point where I can't go 2 3 anywhere without the risk of triggering a migraine or worse. And this just continues to force me to rely on 4 others, including my husband, for transportation. 5 perfectly capable of driving if not exposed to LED 6 lighting, whether it be headlights or street lights. 7 Unfortunately, my symptoms have worsened over the years 8 due to prolonged and frequent exposure to LEDs, 9 particularly as we had to return to the offices post 10 pandemic. The widespread installation of LEDs in 11 various settings, from homes and businesses to street 12 lamps and public as well as medical buildings, have 13 created a significant neurological barrier for me, just 14 like it has for MarieAnn. After struggling to find a 15 clinic that actually took my condition seriously, I 16 finally found one where my concerns were met with 17 understanding and empathy. I was reassured when I saw 18 this doctor that I am not alone in experiencing these 19 debilitating reactions caused by LED lighting. Over 20 the course of a comprehensive three- to five-day stay 2.1 in a well-known epilepsy center conducted at their 22 facilities by doctors, nurses and staff who all 23 witnessed first-hand the adverse reaction that only LED 24 lighting triggers in my body. During the testing 25

We held up a incandescent light bulb, a incredibly bright halogen work light, as 4 well as a Maglite Zion lighting, and the staff 5 witnessed firsthand the adverse reactions that only a 6 LED lighting triggers in my body. The reactions were 7 so intense after being exposed to the L.E.Ds that it 8 was beyond undeniable that LEDs were the only trigger 9 for my migraines and seizures. The collective 10 observation of the medical team at this well-known 11 facility validated these experiences and underscored 12 the urgent need for further investigations into the 13 effects of LED lighting on individuals with 14 sensitivities like mine and MarieAnn's. This 15 validation proved not only a sense of relief, but also 16 a renewed hope for finding effective strategies to 17 manage my condition. In my small town, venturing into 18 town has been a huge ordeal. I resort to draping a 19 Carhartt jacket over my head in an attempt to have 2.0 relief while my husband drives me. I have even 2.1 considered the extreme measure of wearing a welding 22 mask to shield myself from the relentless assault of 23 LED street lamps, headlights, and personal lights. 24 intensity of these lights has become so unbearable that 25

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I have force -- I have been forced to abandon trips

uptown altogether, and the situation extends beyond a

mere inconvenience.

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I find myself unable to visit stores, conduct business, support local businesses, or even attend medical appointments. My world has shrunk to the confines of my home, where even glimpses outside on a bright, sunny day are fraught with anxiety, as I can never be certain that lights aren't piercing through. This loss of visual freedom has transformed my life into a daily struggle like it has MarieAnn, a relentless battle against the very essence of modern illumination caused by LEDs. LEDs pose safety concerns for individuals like myself due to their potential trigger of severe neurological reactions like MarieAnn's seizures, my seizures, and my photosensitive migraines, along with others that are speaking today. Even after seeking medical attention and undergoing testing, the adverse effects persist, leading to this loss of visual freedom that has a profound impact on overall quality of life. The widespread installation of LED lightings in various environments exacerbates these challenges and highlights the urgent need for further research and mitigation to assess all of the

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A.L.J. KERSEY: Thank you, Ms. Troese.

Our next speaker is John Lincoln.

MR. LINCOLN: And my name is John Lincoln. I'm the -- a trustee of an organization in the U.K. a Scottish charity called LightAware. We are concerned with the health effects of lighting and in particular, LEDs. I conducted a large study into LED street lighting a few years ago, and I put the subsequent report onto your website. So I wouldn't wish to go through that in detail, but I do have some thoughts about why this has become such an issue, particularly why you see such light-sensitive people such as MarieAnn, Jamie, Cherry treated with such skepticism. I know a lot of people who are light sensitive, like MarieAnn, they're intelligent, articulate people. They're lawyers, doctors, social workers and journalists, and they're being ignored. what hope is there for progress for them? I think part of the reason, and as you've seen tonight, is that most sufferers are actually women. And women's symptoms are often ignored by male G.P.s, male physicians, and particularly by road lighting engineers, who are in the

1 4/17/2024 - MarieAnn & Richard Cherry, et al - 23-E-0727 U.K. anyway, tend to be male. I also find that people 2 3 become defensive unwilling to listen when I explain how LEDs make people ill. The logic of their thought 4 processes seem to be LEDs and low energy can help to 5 save the planet, so how could they possibly harm 6 I'm fine with them. Perhaps these people have people? 7 just been difficult. Maybe they were climate change 8 deniers or just plain weird. It can't be true. 9 type of process that they're going through is known as 10 cognitive dissonance to psychologists. And 11 unfortunately, I've found plenty of evidence of this 12 even when I articulated in a straightforward way, 13 people ask, are you sure it's the lights? How can 14 light make people ill? What's the mechanism? The 15 outcome is that people with significant, well 16 documented health problems are socially excluded by the 17 ubiquitous installation of LED street lighting. Also 18 from other municipal buildings, health premises, 19 education shops, supermarkets and everything. Sadly, 20 disbelieving people has a long, depressing track record 2.1 in the U.K. in particular abuse in children's homes and 22 the grooming of young people. This belief becomes an 23 excuse for inaction in the face of suffering. 24 have a claim to be treated with dignity and dignity 25

4/17/2024 - MarieAnn & Richard Cherry, et al - 23-E-0727 demands a mutuality of respect. We have a claim to have our own self-worth by the very humanity we share with one another. Disbelieving what light sensitive people say about their condition denies their humanity. I believe that a justice society is one that respects, protects, and promotes the inherent dignity of each and every member. Whatever affects one person directly will affect us all indirectly. It becomes damaging to us all if we exclude members of society simply because they have an inconvenient reaction to LED lighting.

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Just to explain briefly about cognitive dissonance, it's about when two actions arrive, the ideas are not linked psychologically consistent.

People -- people will do all in their power to change them until they become consistent. Their discomfort is triggered when a person's belief that LEDs are good -- are a good thing clashes with new information either make people like MarieAnn ill. People either selectively downplay the information that conflicts with their existing beliefs, and that's known as confirmation bias, or they downplay the importance of their health concerns or attribute them to other factors. Unfortunately for people with light sensitivity, cognitive dissonance is challenging to

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2	overcome as it requires a willingness from the other
3	people that we're trying to explain this to, to
4	acknowledge and examine conflicting information
5	objectively. And that's very difficult. Thank you
6	very much for listening to me.

And then please feel free to proceed. 16 you, thank you, thank you, I appreciate it. 17 MS. NAIONE: My name is Sylvana Naione, 18 N-A-I-O-N-E. My first name is spelled S-Y-L-V-A-N-A. 19 I am a resident in the Village of Cambridge, New York, 20 and the LED street lights caused me to have migraines. 2.1 If I'm exposed to one for a couple of minutes, my eyes 22 begin to hurt and water, and if I can't get away within 23 the next few minutes, I develop a full-blown migraine, 24 complete with throbbing pain behind my eyes, spots in 25

Migraines can last for 2 3 many hours, and I have missed days of work because of migraines from the street lights. I did not have this 4 problem with the old non LED lights. I am deeply 5 distressed and frustrated that Public Services New York 6 recommends leaving the situation unchanged. I am being 7 hurt by the LED street lights and I am not alone. 8 Watching a loved one have a seizure while you stand by 9 helpless to stop it is a truly terrifying experience, 10 and one which I've had all too many times as a direct 11 result of the introduction of the LED street lights in 12 Cambridge. So I suffer doubly from these street 13 lights, both in the form of my own physical pain and in 14 the form of fear for those I love being injured. 15 People are being hurt by these lights. Just because we 16 are seen as being in the minority doesn't make it 17 acceptable. If public schools decided it would save 18 money to serve peanut butter in cafeterias, putting any 19 student with a nut allergy at risk, the state would 20 never permit it. This is no different. A public 2.1 entity decided to introduce a new technology to save 22 money, one that harms a number of the very people who 23 are supposed to be served by that public entity. 24 all regulations are being followed and people are still 25

3	inadequate and need to be changed. What matters is
4	that people be safe in their community. I ask again
5	that the village and National Grid restore the previous

The Soft Lights Foundation is a 501(C)(3) 2 3 nonprofit that advocates for the protection of individuals who cannot neurologically tolerate the 4 visible radiation emitted by light emitting diode 5 products. I am commenting on case 23-E-0727 and the 6 petition to the New York State Public Service 7 Commission to remove the LED street lights that were 8 installed in the Village of Cambridge, New York. 9 are at least four federal agencies that are involved in 10 the approval process for LED street lights. These 11 agencies are the Department of Energy, the Federal 12 Highway Administration, the U.S. Access Board, and the 13 Food and Drug Administration. The D.O.E. and the 14 F.H.W.A. have both promoted the use of LED street 15 However, both D.O.E. and F.H.W.A. have lights. 16 deferred in writing to the Food and Drug Administration 17 for the publication of performance standards for LED 18 street lights, which will ensure that the visible 19 radiation emitted by LED street lights is safe for all 20 members of the public. Yet, F.D.A. has not published 2.1 the congressionally required performance standards for 22 LED street lights as required by 21 U.S.C. 360 ii, and 23 National Grid has not received approval from the F.D.A. 24 for authorization to sell, install, or operate LED 25

In addition, the U.S. Access Board, 2 3 which is responsible for publishing guidelines to ensure equal access to municipal streets and sidewalks 4 for individuals with disabilities has not published any 5 guidelines for LED street lights, and has also deferred 6 to the F.D.A. for the publication of health and safety 7 performance standards. National Grid has never 8 completed the approval process for all four federal 9 agencies before deciding to sell, install, and operate 10 LED street lights. If this were a permitting process, 11 it's as if National Grid only received two out of the 12 required four permits before moving ahead with the LED 13 street light project. It is now well established that 14 LED street lights are hazardous. They are dangerous 15 and they are discriminatory. National Grid's tariff 16 with the New York State Public Service Commission 17 requires that the National Grid provide services that 18 are safe. LED street lights are unsafe because the 19 visible radiation they emit has been documented to 20 cause acute responses such as seizures, migraines, and 2.1 the long-term impacts of exposure to LED radiation 22 include significant increases in risk of mood 23 disorders, diabetes, heart disease, eye disease, 24 cancer, and early mortality.

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Because LED street lights are unsafe, National Grid is violating their tariff agreement, which requires National Grid to provide safe services. As per 38 C.F.R. 35.151(b)1, any alteration to a service after 1992 requires that the service be readily accessible and usable by individuals with disabilities after the alteration. The switch to LED street lights is an alteration, and yet, due to the low quality of the light emitted by LED street lights, the street and sidewalk services are no longer readily accessible or usable by certain individuals with disabilities. National Grid's alteration of switching to LED street lights is in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act. This hurdle of providing a readily accessible and usable service when using LED street lights is nearly impossible to overcome by National Grid, as LED street lights have a known discriminatory barrier. Given this information, the Soft Lights Foundation recommends that the New York State Public Service Commission approve the citizen petition to remove the discriminatory LED street lights in the Village of Cambridge, New York. Thank you.

MS. WHITTEMORE: Okay. Hello. is Kelsey Whittemore, W-H-I-T-T-E-M-O-R-E. And I am a friend of the family. I've been -- I've known MarieAnn for, gosh, 15, 16 years now, and I work at a local hospital where I live. And over that time, I've seen someone who was independent, working, a member of the community slowly be relegated to her home. Working in a hospital, I've seen seizures. I've seen, you know, certain behavioral health issues. I've registered patients who have had seizures trying to cross the road when the pedestrian light flashes. It doesn't quite hit as hard as seeing someone you care deeply about have a seizure due to something that's supposed to protect us. Knowing that she is now unsafe, even in her own home if the curtain moves, this light that is more and more research is showing to cause damage across the board. But the town and -- that's right,

They're not 2 3 doing anything to protect the general public. And I'm seeing more and more cases come in. I work 4 5 registration, I see patients come in. I'm one of the first faces they see, and I can see what they're coming 6 in for. And if I see them coming in for a migraine, I 7 say, "Hey, you know, LEDs give me migraines. How could 8 they help you?" They're like, "Oh, I can't. 9 with LEDs." And I had two. I had a young child last 10 year. She had a seizure, and they were hoping it was a 11 one off. And I mentioned LEDs to the parents because I 12 knew her previous experience. And MarieAnn, well, hey, 13 this causes seizures for one of my friends and they 14 kind of brushed me off because of course they -- their 15 -- the other kid just had a seizure, but when I saw 16 them a month later, the kid was still having seizures 17 and they were looking for incandescent bulbs. This is 18 such an easy problem to fix. All we have to do is 19 switch out the bulbs and we protect not just MarieAnn, 20 but any child that might have this afflicted on them. 2.1 Thank you. 22

I have also seen other members of that community now struggling with their day-to-day lives because of the impact of these lights. The installation was done without regard for the community, without regard for the people in that community, and without regard for the public at all. These lights are damaging not just as a trigger for those of us with photosensitivity and epileptics. They are also longterm degrading to the neural processes of everyone who comes in contact with them. Over long periods of time exposure to LED light will cause neurological problems
