Introductory Remarks



IP Closure Task Force

- Task Force established by statute in 2017
- Addressed economic, employment impacts of plant closure
- Organized public forum for engagement with Indian Point site owner and federal regulatory bodies
- Issued an independent site reuse/redevelopment study
- Facilitated proposals for \$15 million Community and Environmental Fund
 - Labor trainings and equipment
 - School monitoring and assessment
 - Van Cortlandt Manor Gateway Project

- Hudson River biological monitoring
- Sewer infrastructure upgrades

 Identified and coordinated State resources for affected workforce and taxing jurisdictions



Closure Task Force: Cessation Fund

Electric Generation Facility Cessation Mitigation Program

- Managed by <u>Empire State Development</u>
- Applicants: At least 20% decline in PILOT revenue
- Provides up to 80% of lost revenue
- Grant declines 10% per year
- Seven-year program

Augmented specifically for IP taxing jurisdictions

- + \$15 million in FY 17/18 Budget
- + \$24 million authorized in FY 18/19 Budget
- + \$112.5 million through State Energy Plan / NYSERDA legacy clean energy funds

- New PILOT for decommissioned nuclear facility: <u>2020 S. 8204 | A. 10107</u>
 <u>Chapter 386</u>
- DOS support for 2018 Westchester County <u>Shared Services Plan</u>
- Advocacy for Federal <u>STRANDED Act</u> Compensation for localities for storing nuclear waste
- 2018 <u>Redevelopment Study</u> paid for by DPS
- DPS supported PILOT agreement negotiations



Decommissioning Oversight Board

- Established by Department of Public Service in 2021
- The DOB provides venue for information exchange, oversight coordination, and public engagement
- Our goal is to help ensure that decommissioning is SAFE, PROMPT, AND THOROUGH
 - These were the key public interest principles that guided the agreement to approve the sale of the plant to Holtec
 - Agreement signed by State, AG, Westchester County, Cortlandt, Buchanan,
 Riverkeeper and others
- Our success is built on mutual respect and communication
 - All questions are answered; When facts show gaps, we seek to fill them



Filling Oversight Gaps


- Comments to NRC opposing license exemptions




















Values here are consistent with historical readings shared during prior DOB meetings.



DPS Oversight Activities

- Agency staff (including State Inspector) reviewed NRC inspection reports and Holtec filings with the NRC:
 - 2024 Annual Radioactive Effluent Release Report.
 - 1st and 2nd Quarter Inspection Results.
 - Non-Cited violation associated with Hot Work activities (Q1).
 - Holtec Corporate NRC inspection report.
 - Received 5 apparent violations.
 - Attended NRC information conference (virtually).



DPS Oversight Activities

- State regulators have been present at Holtec monthly project meetings, and Holtec has provided the information required under the Joint Proposal at each meeting.
- Notable on-site observations:
 - Demolition activities:
 - U2 Transformers
 - Power Conversion Equipment Building.
 - U3 Security Building Demolition.
 - U1 and U2 Containment walkdowns.



DEC Oversight Activities: Consent Order

Remedial Investigation Scoping Work Plan

Approved by DEC on August 11, 2022 and updated by Holtec on May 9, 2024.

Remedial Investigation (RI) Work Plans

- Investigations will be conducted in a series of RI Work Plans.
- Approved work plans will be announced via fact sheet distributed to the public.

AOC 118 - LaFarge

- DEC approved the draft Remedial Investigation Work Plan for the IPEC Lafarge / Former Spectra Construction Area (AOC 118) on October 23, 2023.
- Holtec completed field work in May 2024.
- Holtec submitted the Remedial Investigation Report for AOC 118 to DEC.
- DEC provided comments and is currently reviewing the response and Holtec's revisions to the Remedial Investigation Report.
- No other RI work plans have been submitted to DEC.



Decommissioning

DEC Oversight Activities – Facility Permits

- SPDES # NY0004472 Governs Discharges from Main Facility
 - Expired on April 30, 2022. Holtec submitted a timely renewal application. Facility continues to have coverage under the existing SPDES permit pursuant to the State Administrative Procedure Law.
- SPDES #NY0250414 Governs stormwater discharges from the Unit 2 transformer moat
 - Expired on March 31, 2023. Holtec submitted a timely renewal application. Facility continues to have coverage under the existing SPDES permit pursuant to the State Administrative Procedure Law.
 - After requests from the public, DEC held processing of this application in order to combine both SPDES permits.
- DEC has reviewed the permit application.
- DEC is awaiting a court decision on the Save the Hudson litigation before providing a Draft SPDES Permit for public review and comment.

DEC Regulations: 6 NYCRR Part 601 Water Withdrawal Permitting, Reporting and Registration

- DEC proposed updates to Part 601 to improve regulation clarity, consistency, and efficiency based on valuable input from the regulated community, industry groups, Department staff, and other stakeholders.
 - 6 NYCRR §601.9(i) contains an existing permitting exemption for direct withdrawals from the Atlantic Ocean or Long Island Sound. DEC proposed a regulatory revision to expand this exemption to saline waters classified in Chapter X, Subchapter B. This includes the lower Hudson River, up to the northern boundary of Westchester and Rockland counties.
- Comment period ended on January 23, 2025.
- DEC is reviewing the comments.
