RULING ON SCHEDULE

(Issued October 9, 2024)

ERIKA BERGEN, DAKIN LECAKES, and NICHOLAS PLANTY,  
Administrative Law Judges:

The Ruling on Schedule and Settlement Judge issued August 28, 2024 set forth the schedule for the filing of the Joint Proposal, statements, replies, and the commencement of the evidentiary hearing. On September 30, 2024, Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. (Company) filed an Update on Joint Proposal that stated, in relevant part, “[b]ecause of technical differences in the models . . . it took significantly longer to reconcile sales forecast models for price-out than expected, which delayed the ability of key stakeholders to receive final authorization to file the Joint Proposal by the September 30 deadline.” The Company thus submitted that good cause existed to allow the parties to file the Joint Proposal after September 30.

On October 7, 2024, in an e-mail to us and the parties, Counsel for the Department of Public Service (DPS) requested a schedule extension. No party objected, and the Company filed a motion to extend the suspension date to April 29, 2025, to accommodate DPS’s proposed schedule.

After considering the foregoing and the proposed schedule, we believe that the following litigation schedule is in the best interest of all parties:

October 25, 2024	Filing of Statements in Support or Opposition
November 1, 2024	Filing of Replies
November 7, 2024	Commencement of Evidentiary Hearing <sup>1</sup>

The filing of the Joint Proposal shall include a summary.

A separate ruling regarding hearing processes will be issued.
