CASE 25-T-0679 Petition of New York State Electric & Gas Corporation for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need, Pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law, for the Livingston Transmission Enhancement Project.

NOTICE REQUESTING COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCING
VIRTUAL PUBLIC STATEMENT HEARING

(Issued January 27, 2026)

On October 30, 2025, New York State Electric & Gas Corporation (NYSEG) filed an application pursuant to Public Service Law Article VII (Application) for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need seeking authorization for the proposed rebuild of approximately 18 miles of an existing 115 kilovolt transmission line beginning at the South Perry Substation in the Town of Castile in Wyoming County and running southeast to the Meyer Substation in the Town of North Dansville in Livingston County (the Project).¹

NYSEG may need to acquire additional temporary or permanent property rights for the Project to: (i) allow for the off-right-of-way (ROW) access of construction vehicles and equipment during construction; (ii) facilitate the storage of materials, equipment, vehicles, job trailers, and other similar uses (e.g., staging areas, laydown yards, and marshalling yards); (iii) enhance NYSEG's rights on existing ROW (including the permanent removal of structures therefrom); and (iv) acquire additional rights outside of the existing ROW to selectively

remove trees if they pose a risk. Full details of the proposed Project are outlined in the application.

Under New York State Law, the Public Service Commission (Commission) may adopt or reject NYSEG's proposal, in whole or in part, or modify it. In doing so, the Commission will consider input from those participating in this proceeding and the public.

Any person wishing to provide a public statement on the record during the virtual public statement hearing must register to do so by 4:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 3, 2026, in accordance with the instructions set forth below.

To register and provide a statement electronically:

Participants who would like to provide a statement and will log in to the hearing electronically must register by the date and time indicated above by visiting <https://dps.ny.gov/calendar>, where they should (1) click on the "View DPS Calendar Listings" option, (2) scroll to and click on the NYSEG Livingston Transmission Enhancement Project Art. VII Public Hearing on March 4, 2026, (3) click the "Register"

button, and (4) provide all requested information. After registration is complete, registrants will receive a confirmation email with instructions on how to join the event.

When logging in to participate in the hearing on the appropriate date and time, participants will be asked to "select audio system." It is recommended that participants select "call me" or "call using computer." The "call me" option will require the participant to enter their phone number.

To register and provide a statement by phone:

Any participant who is not able to log in to the virtual hearing electronically may participate by phone. Call-in participants wishing to make a statement at the hearing must register to do so by the date and time indicated above by calling **1-800-342-3330**, following the prompts to the appropriate hearing, and then providing their first name and last name, address, and phone number.

On the date and time of the hearing, dial **1-929-251-9612** and enter the access code and phone-in password, listed above.

To listen to the hearing without making a statement:

Any interested person may listen to the hearing by calling **1-929-251-9612** and entering the access code and phone-in password listed above.

All participants will be muted upon entry into the hearing. Each person who registered to speak will be called upon to make a statement. The ALJ will continue the hearing until everyone wishing to speak has been heard or other reasonable arrangements to submit comments have been made. Reasonable time limits may be set for each speaker as necessary to afford the speakers an opportunity to be heard. It is requested that lengthy comments be submitted in writing and summarized for oral presentation. A verbatim transcript of the

hearing will be made and posted to the Department of Public Service's (Department) website.

Written comments submitted in accordance with this Notice will be posted on the Department's website and may be accessed by searching the case number, as described above, and clicking on the "Public Comments" tab. However, as noted above, untimely comments may not be considered by the Commission.
