A.L.J. KERSEY: I call case 23-G-0627 proceeding on motion of the commission as to the rates, charges, rules and regulations of National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation for gas service.

Good afternoon. My name is Tara Kersey. I'm an Administrative Law Judge for the Department of Public Service. With me today is Chief Administrative Law Judge Dakin Lecakes, also from the Department of Public Service. Together we are responsible for presiding over the hearings in this case and the development of a complete record in this proceeding. Assisting us today are employees from the Department Office of Consumer Services.

We're all here today for a public statement hearing that was noticed on December 6th, 2023. National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation or N.F.G. filed amendments to its gas tariff schedules on October 31st, 2023, proposing to increase its annual gas delivery revenues by approximately \$88.8 million, which would result in an estimated total monthly bill increase of approximately \$11.31 for the average residential heating customer and approximately \$16.65 for the average small commercial

1/24/2024 - National Fuel & Gas, Corp. - 23-G-0627 customer. Under the New York State law, the Public Service Commission must consider a utilities proposal and may adopt or reject it in whole, or in part, or modify it.

This hearing is being held so you can provide your comments on N.F.G.'s proposal for the commission's consideration. We are holding this hearing so that you can provide your comments on this proposal. The Commission has six members, the Chairperson, Rory Christian and five Commissioners, Diane Burman, James Alesi, John Howard, David Valesky, and John Maggiore. Any statements made today will become part of the case record. We have a court reporter joining us who will be preparing a transcript of the hearing, which will be included in the official record of this proceeding. When it is ready, the transcript will be available for view on the Department of Public Services' website.

This hearing is not an evidentiary hearing or a question-and-answer session, but a forum to hear comments from you. This is also not the only opportunity for comment. If you do not wish to speak at today's hearing, but you would like your views included in the record, there are a variety of other

You can do so by submitting comments on the department's website, by email, regular mail, or by phone. Regardless of how the comments are submitted, they will be given equal consideration.

Comments may be submitted and will be considered through the pendency of this proceeding. If you would like to make a statement here today, please fill out a registration card. They're available at the back at the table with our Department of Public Service outreach staff. I will call speakers up one by one by using the cards. Please speak slowly and clearly so that the court reporter can accurately capture your statement for the record. Finally, before we begin, I would like to remind everyone there will be differing viewpoints, but this event is being held so that we can hear from everyone who would like to make a statement on the record.

We appreciate your attention and your understanding. Thank you. Our first speaker is Ralph Galanti.

RALPH GALANTI: Thank you, Your Honors

1/24/2024 - National Fuel & Gas, Corp. - 23-G-0627 for this opportunity to speak today. My name is Ralph Galanti. I work at National Fuel. I am a member of I.B.E.W. Local 2199, where I'm the vice president. I would like to make some personal comments regarding the rate case today. I am against the permanent closing of the three customer assistance centers, also known as walk-in offices. For many of the reasons already -- already stated by members of Local 2199.

Customers are still going to these offices trying to get in, even though they have been closed since March of 2020 and there have been record daily deposits in the drop boxes that are outside these offices. I believe looking at the cost benefit ratio that these offices provide a valuable service to those in disadvantaged areas who do not have vehicles, internet access, checking accounts, or credit cards. I am also -- I am against expanding the Emergency Heating Repair and Replacement program or E.H.R.R. to renters. This is a valuable program and I am all for increasing the availability to qualified homeowners.

But as a rate payer, I do not want to see my payments going to subsidize absentee

1/24/2024 - National Fuel & Gas, Corp. - 23-G-0627 landlords. Renters are covered by law for these situations and have code enforcement and the court system to remedy the situation. I am for the rate increase that National Fuel is looking for. Even with the wage increases in our collective bargain agreement, most members of Local 2199 have seen a 10 percent cut in their buying power due to inflation since the pandemic started. The rest of our members have stayed even with inflation.

National Fuel members currently are the lowest paid in New York State among utility workers. National Fuel prides itself on being number one in customer service-related metrics in New York State, and this is because of Local 2199 members. But I believe that National Fuel is having difficulty attracting and keeping qualified candidates with the current rate of pay. Thank you very much for this opportunity to speak.

A.L.J. KERSEY: Thank you for your comments. Our next speaker is Bridge Rauch.

BRIDGE RAUCH: Good afternoon. My name is Bridge Rauch. I'm a west side resident in the city of Buffalo. I'm personally opposed to the rate increase but you have -- setting aside the rate

National Fuel, when they make these, you know, needs
-- when they say that they need to make these rate increases to make invest -- investments in infrastructure, I really encourage P.S.C. to be looking at, you know, what -- what are their plans for the long term?

Like, are they actually moving towards decarbonization and a just transition to, you know, like help, you know, union workers and like, you know, low income folks make that transition or are they working to perpetuate the current system as built, you know, and that -- that as if they continue to rely upon those, these rate increases and, you know, building out the system further and further as people shift away from the use of natural gas in favor of, you know, things like you know -- in favor of other systems like heat pumps and such, you know, like that those -- those costs are going to come down on the lowest pay, like the -- the folks who are like the lowest paid and like, those are the folks with the least resources. And you know, like, it's like it's not going to be good for anybody except for the

C.E.O.s at the top of National Fuel. So I would

strongly encourage the P.S.C. to, you know, what -
regardless of how you rule on this case, please like,

think of it within that context of this long-term

plan. And you know, like that National Fuel needs to

be working towards a decarbonizing economy and, you

know, towards that goal of reaching our climate

leadership and community protection net goals. So

thank you.

A.L.J. KERSEY: Thank you so much. Thank you.

A.L.J. LECAKES: Let's go off the record for a second.

A.L.J. KERSEY: I want to remind members of the public that they may submit public comments throughout these proceedings by the other means described earlier and in the notice of public statement hearing issued on September 20th, 2023.
