Dear Sir,

I am a life long resident of Erie County and a middle class senior with a company pension and social security income. I was a 40year old veteran of the fossil fuel industry (National Fuel Gas Buffalo, New York) upon my retirement in 1996.

Being an amateur environmentalist and avid outdoorsman (fishing) with backpack hikes into some remote Adirondack Lakes I found out decades ago the negative effects of acid rain on our waters. According to the information from the N.Y.S.D.E.C. There are over 200 lakes and ponds in the Adirondack alone that are basically sterile from acid rain fall-out. Of all the fossil fuels coal fired electric generating plants are a major contributor to this fall-out Although clearer burning natural gas is still in good supply, it is a finite resource.

Recognizing the growing development of renewable energy in New York, I was one of 40 speakers that gave favorable comments about developing wind energy at a Renewable Portfolio Standard Meeting held in Buffalo 3 years ago.

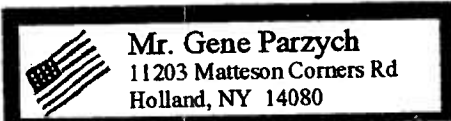
By chance my Sardinia, Erie County residence and property (119 acres) are located on the highest and possibly windiest point of land in Erie County (1960' above sea level). Myself and other adjoining property owners consisting of about 2500 acres are under 5 year wind measurement agreements with a wind farm developer. The wind measurement agreement we have with the developer is now moot. Due to the vociferousness of a "not in my back yard" minority, combined with the quite apathy of the general public that favor renewables but are no-shows at Town Board Meetings and Hearings pertaining to wind energy. It has lead the developer to put the project on hold.

The political and financial turmoil in Erie County has led me to purchase acreage in adjoining Wyoming County, about 20 miles from my present address. The town of Eagle's political leaders and my new neighbors have embraced the wind farm concept through favorable contractible financial and environmental agreements, with Noble Environmental Power. Comparing my contract with Noble then researching it against other wind development companies contractual offers across the United States I find it to be a very equitable agreement.

This letter is not to be construed as a testimonial for Noble Environmental Power or any other wind developer beyond the fact we share a common bond for the development of renewable wind energy.

Going forward my personal legacy is knowing the development of the wind resource over my property can generate electric energy presently and for future generations.

I have owned and operated a dairy farm in the Town of Eagle for over 30 years. I have recently contracted with Noble Environmental Power for the siting of a wind turbine, power transmission line, and a substation on my farm. I and my wife are very enthusiastic about the windpark project. Farmers in our area are economically stressed, and the economic benefits of the windpark are very important to the agricultural sector. Property taxes are a huge burden to farms, and the windpark will have a very positive impact on town taxes. Farmers constantly are looking for aspects of their farms that can generate revenue, and the wind is one of our natural resources that has been largely untapped. Having worked outdoors for many years, I do not find any environmental drawbacks to the windpark, and believe they are very compatible with the preservation of our environment. For my farm, the siting of the roads servicing the windpark will be very beneficial. It will enable our access to certain fields that were previously inaccessible during certain seasons.

There are also many benefits to the community from this windpark. Previously the community was divided over the possible siting of a landfill in the community, but the windpark has healed that division and residents are enthusiastic about a project that everyone agrees will be better than a landfill. The project will create local jobs, and give a boost to local contractors during the construction phase.

Every source of clean and renewable energy needs to be explored, and while the wind will not solve the problem alone, it can make a significant contribution to our energy needs. Every individual source of electricity that is added to the national grid should




