CASE 24-T-0120 - Petition of Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need, Pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law, for the 345 kV Underground Service Transmission Laterals between the Expanded Clay Substation and Micron Technology Fabrication Areas.

NOTICE SOLICITING COMMENTS

(Issued September 2, 2025)

On March 21, 2025, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid (National Grid) filed a Joint Proposal, appendices, and affidavits in support of the Public Service Commission (Commission) issuing National Grid a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need (Certificate) pursuant to Public Service Law Article VII to construct, operate, and maintain service laterals to the Micron Technology Fabrication Areas. Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. §1341(a)(1), notice is provided that, on May 21, 2025, National Grid filed an Application for a Clean Water Act §401 Water Quality Certification. National Grid will require a Section 401 Water Quality Certification if the Commission issues National Grid a Certificate for the proposed transmission facility.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that interested parties are invited to submit written comments regarding National Grid's Application for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification. Comments should reference "Case 24-T-0120" and be submitted, by **September 30, 2025**, by going to www.dps.ny.gov, clicking on "File Search" (located under the heading "Commission Files"), entering "24-T-0120" in the "Search by Case Number" field, and then clicking on

the "Post Comments" box located at the top of the page. Those unable to file electronically may mail their comments to the Honorable Michelle L. Comments submitted in accordance with this Notice will be posted on the Department's website, but comments received after the September 30, 2025 deadline may not be considered by the Commission.
