NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF INTERVENOR FUNDING
AND SCHEDULE FOR SUBMITTING FUNDING REQUESTS

(Issued January 29, 2026)

On August 8, 2025, New York State Electric & Gas Corporation (NYSEG) filed an application pursuant to Public Service Law (PSL) Article VII for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need for authorization to rebuild its existing 230-kilovolt Line 67. Line 67 runs for approximately 11 miles from the Stolle Road Substation in the Town of Elma, Erie County, to the High Sheldon Substation in the Town of Sheldon, Wyoming County. NYSEG proposes to primarily rebuild the existing transmission line within the existing 225-foot to 500-foot right-of-way (ROW) but proposes to expand the ROW by about 90 feet, which is offset to the northeast of the centerline of the existing line, for a portion of the rebuild.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that funds are available to municipal and other parties to allow such parties to contribute to the development of a complete record leading to an informed decision in this case and foster broad public participation. NYSEG submitted the required intervenor fee of \$100,000 to be used to defray expenses for expert witness, consultant, administrative, and legal fees (other than in connection with judicial review). Pursuant to PSL §122(5)(b), at least 50 percent of the funds must be reserved for awards to municipal parties.

Eligible municipal and other parties intending to request intervenor funding must file their requests by **4:30 p.m. on February 13, 2026**. Parties requesting funding must complete the request form that is available by going to <https://dps.ny.gov/article-vii-major-electric-and-gas-transmission-facilities> and clicking on "Request for Intervenor Funds for use in PSL Article VII Proceeding."

Applicants for intervenor funding must be parties to this case. To request party status, please go to www.dps.ny.gov, click on "File Search" (located under the heading "Commission Files"), enter "25-T-0470" in the "Search by Case Number" field, click on the "Request for Party Status" button in the upper right-hand corner of the screen, and follow the instructions.

All requests for intervenor funds must be submitted to Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Erika Bergen at Erika.bergen@dps.ny.gov and must also be filed with the Hon. Michelle L. Phillips, Secretary, at secretary@dps.ny.gov by 4:30 p.m. on the due date.

Persons without email access may send their funding request to ALJ Bergen and Secretary Phillips by first-class mail at the New York State Department of Public Service, Three Empire State Plaza, Albany, New York 12223-1350, such that the requests are received by the due date; however, filing electronically is strongly encouraged.

A copy of each funding request must be served simultaneously on everyone who is on the party list for this proceeding by email, if possible, or by first-class mail.
