go with the child wherever they roam in the classroom. Children could clean and sanitize their own shield, and face shields wouldn't disrupt ventilation in the room, another important factor in mitigating COVID-19 risk.

In Wool's opinion, barriers also "degrade the quality of the instructional experience."

"The kids can't hear the teacher," he said. "They can't see over the barriers. So what you end up doing is you suddenly sort of create the environment where you have an in-person zoom session, which, to me, is defeating the purpose."

State officials told Wool they would consider his suggestions. But in the absence of a response, Harrison decided to purchase barriers.

"My hand was kind of forced, because I'm not going to keep my kids home," Wool said. "I would still opt to not use the barriers if that option became viable. I would probably end up buying face shields for every student."

### Staff vaccinations build hope

White Plains Superintendent Jo-

seph Ricca, president of the Lower Hudson Council of School Superintendents, said he did not think it was likely that the state would allow three-foot distancing without barriers.

Ricca said it would help schools if the state Health Department would update its quarantine requirements for teachers. Districts around the region have been plagued by staff shortages, as a single COVID case can send many teachers home for two weeks.

This challenge could be alleviated, he said, if state guidelines reflected the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, which says that fully vaccinated individuals who are asymptomatic, for three months after their second shot, don't need to quarantine after a contact.

"Many school districts in our area are actively seeking ways to get more children back into the classroom more often," he said. "Really, the big advantage has been access to vaccination."

The ongoing vaccination of school staff has created new momentum for schools to try to bring more students back and move toward a full reopening, Ricca said. That urgency has been rippling through New York in past weeks, with elected officials joining parent voices calling for a full reopening.

package to help working people since the New Deal and it's going to affect just about every aspect of life in New York," Schumer said.

Schumer's work in getting his fractious conference to support the package drew praise from Biden.

"I served in the Senate, as you all know, for many years," Biden said Saturday of Schumer.

"I've never seen anyone work as skillfully, as ably, as patiently with determination to deliver such a consequential piece of legislation that was so urgently needed as the American Rescue Plan."

Here's what is in the stimulus package for New York:

### Unemployment benefits and child care assistance

Roughly \$22 billion in enhanced unemployment insurance benefits of \$300 a week through Sept. 6, on top of the state payments, is expected.

It also extends the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance program for the self-employed, gig workers, freelancers and others in non-traditional employment.

Another huge boost for middle-class families: \$7 billion to New York to expand the child tax credit this year from \$2,000 per child to as much as \$3,600, phasing out at more than \$150,000 a year in income for households and allowing people to get the money paid out over the course of the year.

About 3.6 million New Yorkers would be eligible for the expanded tax credit, Schumer's office said.

There would also be \$786 million to expand the Earned Income Tax Credit by making it available to low-income people without children and averaging \$543 to \$1,502 depending on income. It would benefit about 910,000 workers in New York.

The state would also get \$1 billion to help poor families with food programs.

There is also help for renters.

About \$1 billion of the \$30 billion would go to New York to help low-income households and the unemployed afford rent and utilities.

New York would also get \$575 million in mortgage and utility assistance for struggling homeowners.

### State and local aid

State and local governments, with diminishing revenue from the pandemic, has been desperately seeking a federal bailout, and it wasn't included in the the two previous federal stimulus packages.

But with Democrats in charge, they were able to push through \$350 billion for states.

New York will be a prime beneficiary, getting nearly \$24 billion, behind only California and Texas in total amount, a USA TODAY review found.

The state will get \$12.6 billion to help cover its \$15 billion budget gap over the next two years. The money needs to go to COVID expenses or infrastructure improvements.

Gov. Andrew Cuomo still wouldn't rule out tax increases to help cover the

rest of the deficit, but said the huge infusion of federal aid will limit the need to make cuts and raise revenue.

"This budget is going to raise two big questions," Cuomo said Sunday. "It's going to raise the question of taxes: How much do you need to raise in tax revenue given the federal bill, and what are the smartest and best ways to raise revenue?"

### Other money for governments:

- \$6 billion for cities, including \$206 million to Rochester and \$19 million each to Poughkeepsie.

- \$4 billion for counties, including \$57 million for Dutchess and \$887 million for Westchester.

- \$825 million for small cities, towns and villages

- \$358 million for a New York State Broadband Investment Program.

### Other aid:

- \$9 billion for schools
- \$7 billion for New York City transit, including \$6.5 million to the Metropolitan Transit Authority.

- \$3.1 billion for Medicaid

- \$2.6 billion for colleges and universities

- \$418 million for airports

### Help for restaurants

New York restaurants would be able to apply for a portion of \$29 billion in federal grants.

The grants provide up to \$10 million per company with a limit of \$5 million per location and could be used to cover payroll, rent, utilities and other expenses.

The bill also provides \$7.25 billion for the Paycheck Protection Program, which provides loans to businesses, but a smaller allocation than previous stimulus packages.

There would also be \$1 billion available nationally to help performing arts centers, movie theaters and other venues tap into loans and grants to help them after largely being shuttered during the pandemic.

grossly inflated." Both the Common Council and the city IDA have filed motions to dismiss the lawsuits brought by the developer.

The project stalled several years ago when Bonura proposed adding apartments to an already agreed upon proposal that only included office and retail space.

Bonura has consistently said stated to the Journal he's willing to move forward without the apartments, but would like to sit down and talk with councilmembers about what the project could look like. He also said he's open to renegotiating the PILOT agreement.

Menist said the council can not speak with Bonura due to the ongoing litigation. He said he met with Bonura last summer and was told the developer wanted "a special deal" to build luxury apartments.

### Task force to pitch development ideas

While neither side says the Poughkeepsie Landing development will not happen, the council is preparing for alternatives.

The task force is being asked to provide long-term recommendations for what should be built on the property given that the last request for proposals was put out more than 15 years ago.

While the Common Council said this will provide Bonura the opportunity to speak about his vision for the property, it is also open to hearing ideas from anyone interested in the property's future.

The property was formerly home to a massive industrial complex, the site of the DeLaval Separator Co., and millions have already been invested into the cleanup of the site. Assessed at roughly \$2.6 million, the city-owned property has been off the tax roll for about 50 years.

"I'm open to any and all possibilities that can make sense, but (the council) needs to come to the table and talk," Bonura said.

who led Poughkeepsie to a Section 9 boys basketball championship in 2017. "This decision came from my friends and roommates telling me I should go for it."

Dickens became enamored with designer brands and coordinated outfits after graduating high school, his mother said. But, more than once, he quietly opined, "They charge so much for this stuff when I could probably make most of it myself."

Those whispers turned eventually into conversations with his friends at Hudson Valley Community College, whom he said often complimented his style. They convinced him two years ago to give it a shot. Of course, back then there was little more than a few unrefined ideas and some unsubstantiated confidence. His first step was purchasing a \$300 sewing machine and watching instructional videos on YouTube to teach himself how to use it; reading tutorials about the selection of fabrics; then downloading graphic design programs.

From there, he pulled a plain black shirt from his closet and decorated it with artwork. That, he said, was sold to a friend for \$25. He made more shirts, emblazoned with cartoon rocket ships, and sold several to Hudson Valley Community College football players, who helped spread the word. The money made was spent on fabric and sewing materials, and so was born what was then his Starkraft New York label. "I got a lot of support in Troy and people kept telling me to make more," said Dickens, who was a sports management major. "I still wasn't all the way sure about it, but they kept encouraging me and people around campus liked it, so that made me want to take it seriously."

The brand name he eventually settled on, Niali, was the result of an hours-long brainstorming session with roommates which led to them searching the internet for "unique baby names." He scrolled to the "N" section and was struck.

After returning home last year during the COVID-19 pandemic, and with more free time than expected, Dickens figured he could further push his burgeoning business. He loaded up on

materials, bought blank hoodies and sweatpants wholesale, and redesigned them with his sartorial sauce infused.

The kids call it "drip." "It's great and I think it's something positive for the community, especially at a time when we need it," said Kenny Wallace, owner of Craft 302, who allowed the vendors use of the space toward the back of the restaurant. "They're bringing people in and it's a great scene."

Wallace said his uncle, Julius Browne, introduced him to Dickens last fall and they agreed to have his restaurant host the pop-up shops. Their first event was in December, which included a holiday clothing giveaway for the homeless.

The plan going forward, Dickens said, is to have at least one such event each month. And the long-term dream, of course, is for the brand eventually to become a known commodity stocking the shelves of retail stores.

"The fashion industry is dominated by foreign companies, so it would mean a lot if this became successful, coming from a Black kid in Poughkeepsie," Dickens said. "You don't hear about a lot of young people making it out of (tough) areas with clothing."

That attempt, Tiffanie Robinson said, is "a source of pride."

"A lot of us started our businesses in the last year, during the shutdown, and we're trying to make something good out of a bad situation," said Robinson, a Newburgh resident who sold accessories including tiaras and bonnets at the pop-up shop. "It's also great to see young Black people coming together and being business-minded."

Robinson is one of five women included in the clique of 11 salespeople whom Dickens recruited via social media and with the help of his dad, Moses. Most are from the mid-Hudson Valley, including Kingston and Cornwall. Trevor Forte, who traveled more than 100 miles from Long Island to promote his clothing brand, also praised Dickens' initiative.

"I'm proud that he found something he's passionate about and is pursuing it, and wasn't afraid to change directions," Smart said. "Too many young men from our city go after quick money, doing illegal things and get themselves in trouble. A lot of young people get frustrated and quit if an idea doesn't lead to success right away. I'm proud that my son is putting his all into this and hasn't given up."

concentrated in two dormitories, Marian and Champagnat, both freshman housing. He said there was “no evidence” the outbreak impacted anyone not associated with the Marist community.

Marist’s surveillance program calls for testing its entire on-campus population every two weeks, with 50% tested each week. Under state guidelines, any school that does not test at least 25% of its campus each week would face a mandatory shutdown if it has 100 positive cases in a two-week span. Schools that test more than that percentage can stay open as long as 5% of its on-campus population, including students and staff, do not test positive. For Marist, that would equate to roughly 300 cases.

The school announced the voluntary “pause” Wednesday, March 17, on the same day it instituted a temporary quarantine of Marian and Champagnat halls, both freshman dorms. Those stu-

dents were ordered to attend classes virtually and stay in their rooms for all activities except picking up food, or if there is a health or safety reason for leaving.

While students outside of those dorms last week were allowed to continue attending in-person classes and using the McCann Center on a reservation system, that changed Sunday. Students are still allowed to engage in outdoor activities with roommates or pods, while distancing. And the school Sunday said they could leave campus for “essential errands,” such as grocery shopping, attending medical appointments, internships and off-campus jobs.

Students are not allowed to have group gatherings outside their room or household, use the dining hall, or have visitors. Marist’s Division I sports programs and college-organized activities are suspended, with the exception of the women’s basketball team.

The school also noted other specific residence halls may also be put under extra individual measures.

The school noted surveillance testing will continue during the pause.
