NOTICE REQUESTING COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCING  
PUBLIC STATEMENT HEARING AND PROCEDURAL CONFERENCE

(Issued November 4, 2025)

Comments are requested concerning a petition filed by Moraine Solar Energy Center, LLC (the Petitioner), pursuant to Public Service Law §68, seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity and lightened regulation as an electric corporation. The Petitioner seeks authorization to construct, own, and operate an up to 94-megawatt solar electric generating facility in the Town of Burns, Allegany County.

Construction and operation of the solar electric generating facility will be subject to the terms and conditions of the Siting Permit for a Major Renewable Energy Facility issued by the Office of Renewable Energy Siting (ORES) on May 18, 2025. The scope of the Public Service Commission's (Commission) review of this petition will not duplicate the issues that were previously decided by ORES.

**Any person wishing to provide a public statement on the record during the virtual public statement hearing must register to do so by 4:30 p.m. on Monday, November 17, 2025.**

**To register and provide a statement electronically:**

Participants who would like to provide a statement and will log in to the hearing electronically must register by the date and time indicated above by visiting <https://dps.ny.gov/calendar>, where they should (1) click on the "View DPS Calendar Listings" option, (2) scroll to and click on the Petition of Moraine Solar §68 Public Statement Hearing on November 18, 2025, (3) click the "Register" button, and (4) provide all requested information. After registration is complete, registrants will receive a confirmation email with instructions on how to join the event.

When logging in to participate in the hearing on the appropriate date and time, participants will be asked to "select audio system." It is recommended that participants opt to have the system "call me" or "call using computer." The "call me" option will require participants to enter their phone number.

**To register and provide a statement by phone:**

Any participant who is not able to log in to the virtual public statement hearing electronically may participate by phone. Call-in participants wishing to make a statement at the hearing must register to do so by the date and time indicated above by calling **1-800-342-3330**, following the prompts to the appropriate hearing, and then providing the following information: first name and last name, address, and phone number.

On the date and time of the hearing, dial **1-929-251-9612** and enter the access code and phone-in password, listed above.

**To listen to the hearing without making a statement:**

Any interested person may listen to the hearing by calling **1-929-251-9612** and entering the access code and phone-in password listed above.

All participants will be muted upon entry into the hearing. Each person who registered to speak will be called upon to make a statement. The ALJ will continue the hearing until everyone wishing to speak has been heard or other reasonable arrangements to submit comments into the record have been made. Reasonable time limits may be set for each speaker as necessary to afford all attendees an opportunity to be heard. It is recommended that lengthy comments be submitted in writing and summarized for oral presentation. A verbatim transcript of the hearing will be made for inclusion in the record of this case.

Written comments will be posted on the Department's website and can be accessed by searching the case number, as described above, and clicking on the "Public Comments" tab.

**Toll-Free Opinion Line:** Individuals may submit comments by calling the Commission's Opinion Line at 1-800-335-2120. This number is set up to take comments about pending cases from in-State callers 24-hours a day. These comments are not transcribed verbatim, but a summary is provided to the Commission.

**PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE** that a virtual procedural conference will be held immediately following the public statement hearing, as part of the same teleconference.

The principal purposes of the procedural conference are to identify any potential parties and to provide an opportunity for parties to discuss whether circumstances exist that require additional procedures including, but not limited to, whether any issues of fact have been presented by the petition or by the public comments that warrant an evidentiary hearing. Other procedural issues also may be addressed.
