		Review of predicted areas of visibility in the Preliminary Viewshed Analysis provided with your April 8, 2019 correspondence, there appear to be at least some limited areas of visibility in several of the NYS DOS-designated Scenic Areas of Statewide Significance (SASS). DPS recommends review of those areas, and in particular the SASS Sub-units where visibility, even if limited, should be assessed. These include the following: CGN-28 Stottville Farms Subunit This area has potential facility visibility in the Stockport Flats and Middle Ground Flats areas as well as the area near Lorenz Park and The Hudson Junior/Senior High School. Views from the subunit are extensive due to the large, sweeping, uninterrupted farm fields. The breadth of views extends greater than 180 degrees. The Hudson River is prominent in the middle ground, while the Catskill Mountains provide a dramatic backdrop to the west and southwest. Within the subunit, the highly varied, broad views are framed by woodlands. Farmhouses, barns and individual significant trees provide focal points." 		CGN-29 Stockport Creek Subunit The subunit has wide, full views of the Hudson, up to 180 degrees in breadth. They are of moderate length, extending one to three miles up and downstream. The variety and dynamic balance of the landscape's visual elements, together with the background provided by the unspoiled west shore of the Hudson and the distant looming Catskills to the southwest, yield many unique and outstanding compositions. Several small wooded islands and navigational lights on the river provide focal points within the viewshed. Along the Stockport Creek the views are of a meandering water body with tumbling waterfalls and sheer cliffs. The perspective is narrow and intimate, except at the mouth of the creek where the water surface 75 broadens and encircles islands and the footings of the railroad bridge. Rowboats tied along the shore are the only reminders of man's presence in the surrounding area." (page 74 – NYSDOS Hudson River SASS) Harrier Hill Park has scenic trails, picnicking and nature watching. "A short, universally accessible trail leads from the parking area past a farm pond to the pavilion. 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		<p>CO-6 Olana Subunit</p> <p>The meadows extending down the steep hill from the mansion were designed by Church to frame the dramatic views of the Hudson River and Catskill Mountains to the southwest and west. The views extend 102 over five miles down the Hudson and over twenty miles to the Catskill Mountains. Although distant, the Hudson River plays a major role in the setting, its broad expanse and undulating shoreline adding variety and ephemeral qualities of ever changing reflected color and light. Originally, views were also available to the west, north and northwest, and future restoration of the designed landscape may once again open these views.</p> <p>The dense woodlands now surrounding the mansion to the east, north and west shelter the estate grounds from views of recent development surrounding the subunit. Carriage roads and trails provide intimate views of the landscape and constantly changing compositions featuring the mansion, the pond and landscape outside the property. Views of orchards and farm fields to the west are framed by the woodlands. The mansion is oriented to take advantage of the views, and their compositions are artfully framed by ogee curves, stained glass and decorative borders of windows and doorways of the mansion."</p> <p>(pages 100-101—NYS DOS Hudson River SASS)</p> <p>The Olana Trail Map marks areas with scenic views particularly along the Carriage Road trail which is for "Foot Traffic Only." ("Scenic Hudson") supports the designation of a 5-mile visual impact study area, and the use of the cited methodology. We also appreciate the extensive list of stakeholders included in this information request. Additionally, Scenic Hudson has the following specific comments: National Historic Landmarks should be listed separately. National Historic Landmarks are historic places that hold national significance and are held in greater esteem than other sites designated on the National Register.1 The Secretary of the Interior designates these places as exceptional because of their abilities to illustrate U.S. heritage. This list should include Olana (officially listed as the Frederic E. Church House) and "Bronson, Dr. Oliver House and Stables." The Thomas Cole House, also a National Historic Landmark, should be added to the list. To be more complete, the list of Public Lands and Recreational Resources should be expanded to include the newly created Charles A. Flood Wildlife Management Area.2 To be more complete, the list of Public Lands and Recreational Resources should be expanded to include the Vosburgh Swamp Wildlife Management Area.3	Emailed receipt of correspondence. As President of the Greene County Historical Society, which operates the Bronckck Museum and Vedder Research Library at 90 County Route 42 in Coxsackie, NY, I want to express two concerns. First, I attended a meeting held by Flint Mine Solar at Pegasus Restaurant a few months ago. At that meeting I expressed concern about the property directly south of the Society property, owned by Sbarboro. The map I received prior to the meeting showed solar fields being located on that property directly south of the Society property. The response was that the map was out of date and they were no longer considering locating solar panels there. The map in your letter of April 8 shows the Sbarboro property included. Which is it, the Sbarboro property is included or is not included. If included what mitigating steps are planned? Second, I asked at that meeting at Pegasus about Flint Mine Hill Archaeological District, which is listed as a National Historic Site. The response was that they would have to do some kind of protection but were not aware of the listing. Clearly it is listed and has been since 1978. Yet you don't have it on the list. Will the list be amended to include the Flint Mine Hill Archaeological District and appropriate measures for mitigation be undertaken?
