Good afternoon and welcome. We are here today for a public statement hearing that was noticed on May 23rd, 2024. This public statement hearing concerns the proposed changes in the electric and gas delivery rates and practices of Orange and Rockland Utilities.

Orange and Rockland filed amendments to its electric and gas tariff schedules on January 26th, 2024, proposing to increase its annual electric and gas delivery revenues effective January 1st, 2025. More specifically, the Company seeks to increase its electric delivery revenues by approximately 18.1 million dollars or a three point seven one percent increase in total revenues and its gas delivery revenues by approximately \$14.4 million dollars, or a six point three percent increase in total revenues.

These increases would result in total monthly bill increases for the average residential customer of approximately \$8.81, or six percent for electric, and \$12.73 for gas, or eight percent.

The Company states that the proposed

6/17/2024 - Orange & Rockland - 24-E-0060, 24-G-0061 increases will enable it to, among other things, make investments in critical energy infostructure and develop and implement initiatives that advance the goals of the New York State Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act. Currently the rate case parties have entered into settlement discussions regarding the Company's filings.

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My name is Erika Bergen. I'm an Administrative Law Judge for the Department of Public Service. With me on my right is Chief Administrative Law Judge Dakin Lecakes. We are presiding over the hearings in this case and the development of the record on behalf of the New York State Public Service Commission. At the conclusion of this process, we will make recommendations to the Commission, which is the ultimate decision maker in these cases.

The Commission, in making its decision, must consider the Utility's proposal and may adopt or reject, in whole or in part, or modify it. The Public Service Commission will decide what the Company's terms and conditions of service will be.

The Public Service Commission has currently seven members. The Chairperson, Rory

It is part of a statutory process that the Department of Public Service and the Public Service Commission has used for decades to consider rate proposals. I would like to just take the opportunity to very briefly tell you how important this component of this process is, and by this

It is critically important for us as Commissioners, for our Administrative Law Judges, to hear directly from you. But we can and will -- will take comments, either online at our website, which is dps.gov, or by regular postal service mail, or by a toll free telephone line, up until November 29th. So again, if, as you are having conversations with others in the community and you know of people who are interested in participating in this process, I would encourage you to encourage them to reach out to us and -- and -- and give us their thoughts as well. Thank you again.

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afternoon, everyone. Thank you very much for joining us today. I want to add my thanks to Judge Bergen and to Judge Lecakes, who are overseeing this process. I -- you know, Commissioner Valesky pretty much said everything I would say, but I do want to just add my thanks that you're here, that you're here to provide comment. It's important to us in the decision making process to hear from the public on your concerns with respect to the proposal from Orange and Rockland.

We, as part -- as Commissioners, fundamentally the decision will come to us about what's been proposed, but we want to hear from you. This is part of the process and it's a really critical, important part. So thank you in advanced for joining us today and for sharing your thoughts and concerns. So, thank you.

A.L.J. BERGEN: Thank you, Commissioners.

So again, as the Commissioners stated, the purpose of today's hearing is to provide the public with an opportunity to share with the Commission your thoughts on the rate filings.

Statements that you make today will become part of

But today's hearing is not a question and answer session, but a forum, again, to hear your comments on the -- on the Company's proposal. If you do have questions, however, related to your account, Orange and Rockland has provided assistance in the form of consumer services and outreach of members so that if you do have questions, again, about your -- your account, you can see Enver Acevedo, who's counsel, and he'll point you in the right direction to one of their representatives to help you with your -- your concerns.

If you don't want to speak today at the hearing, as Commissioner Valesky noted, there are

other ways to comment. Again, they are in the press release. I think we have a copy of that here with us, but it's also -- the press release is available on the website. And you can do so by submitting them through the website, through D.M.M., through -- by regular mail or by phone. Regardless of how comments are submitted, they are all given equal weight. So don't feel that if you submit them online or via phone or mail, that they're given less weight than comments today. They're all considered equally. And again, the deadline for comments to ensure Commission consideration is November 29th, 2024.

Those of you who wanted to make a statement today have filled out a card. This is not your only opportunity. If you didn't fill out a card and you later want to make a statement, you can get up and fill out a card at any time, that's fine. And I'll call the cards as they were received, so in order.

Please speak slowly and clearly so we can capture your statement for the court reporter.

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I've noticed a lot of changes within O and R, and so
the \$8.81, six percent electric change, would cause
great grief to me. I've made all of the necessary
changes within my home. My home was built in 1939,
so I have added insulated doors, insulation all
throughout the house, new windows, new finish -appliances that are energy efficient and I'm still
not seeing any changes within O and R itself.

So my average -- my average bill runs,

I would say, \$139, my budget. My average bill is approximately \$19 a month, with a \$72 service delivery charge. My actual bill was \$1,677.98, used. My delivery charged was \$1,005.82, actual energy use was \$672.16. So the -- the six percent electricity would increase my bill, not only for my electric, but for the delivery charge itself. So I am here today because I feel that the increase would -- would hurt my family. Okay. I thank you very much.

A.L.J. BERGEN: Thank you for your comment. The next speaker is Danielle Gibson.
Welcome.

MS. GIBSON: Hi.

A.L.J. VALESKY: Hi.

I've been a customer of Orange and Rockland Utilities for 37 years. A little over a year ago, I 6 7 called Orange and Rockland to discuss my utility bill. I was told by the representative that I was 8 9 speaking with that perhaps I should reduce my energy usage. It was at that very moment I realized the 10 11 delivery charges on my energy bill were insanely 12 higher than the actual amount of my usage. 13 At that time, my usage for electricity 14 was \$37.50, with a delivery fee of \$90.14. And my 15 actual usage for natural gas was \$3.82, with a 16 delivery fee of \$31.54. I began to monitor my bills. 17 December 2023 through January 2024, my electric usage 18 was \$73.52. My electric delivery was \$92.59. My 19 natural gas usage, \$148.25, with a \$312.27 in 20 delivery. 21 January '24 through February '24, my 22 electric usage, \$53.24. My electric delivery, 23 \$76.63. Natural gas usage, \$109.96, with a \$280.28 24 delivery. February '24 through March '24, my

electric usage, \$47.26. My electric delivery,

6/17/2024 - Orange & Rockland - 24-E-0060, 24-G-0061 \$92.59. My natural gas usage, \$61.66, with a \$213.98 delivery fee. In March 2024 to April 2024, my electric usage was \$39.51, with an electric delivery of \$87.68. Natural gas usage, \$45.45, with \$173.55 in delivery. April 2024 to May 2024, my electric usage was \$45.79, with an electric delivery of \$109.01. My natural gas usage was \$8.65, with a \$55.24 delivery fee, which is 630 percent more than my actual usage.

I'd also like to point out that both my December '23/January '24 and my March/February '24 bills, the electric portion shows both of them have a delivery charge of \$92.59. With different supply charges, respect -- respectfully, \$73.52 and \$47.26 for actual usage. But for those both actual usages, I was charged the same amount for delivery, \$92.59.

In the last five months, I have paid \$259.32 for actual usage, with a delivery fee of \$458.50. I paid \$373.97 for actual natural gas usage, with a delivery fee of \$1,035.32. Combined, I have paid \$1,493.82 for delivery of \$633.29 of the actual commodity.

I understand that the utility companies are looking to increase -- for the

6/17/2024 - Orange & Rockland - 24-E-0060, 24-G-0061 increases to update their infrastructure, knowing that New York State has mandated public schools to have all electric fleets by 2035. The grids don't have the ability to support that, but at who's expense? The residential customers of Orange and Rockland Utilities. These are the same people whose school taxes are going to go up to comply with those -- with those rules.

The property taxes will increase because the counties will be requiring more funds based on the need to establish resources and accommodate potential public safety issues that may arise by everything being electric. New construction is going to be all electric. Cars are turning all electric.

Then our State tax will increase to continue to put funds into programs such as HEAP, where people who can't afford their utility bills, get help. So perhaps if we were not feeding Orange and Rockland so well, every day residents might be able to afford their utility bills, minus the very high delivery charges because then these increases trickle down to the renter. There's no rent stabilization here. Just more people that this will

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Then it effects the grocery stores, production increases. It needs a pause. A regroup, if you will. Everyone has to understand that there's an action and that has the consequences, and we're talking about thousands of households that will be impacted.

In addition to the increases that

Orange and Rockland is asking for, how is it that the

average Orange and Rockland residential customer is

expected to absorb all of these costs with minimal

effect on their own families and their own lives?

In the big picture, if every household paid \$100 in delivery fees on one street of 20 houses, that's \$2,000 a month in delivery fees. If there are 200 streets in one town, that is \$400,000 per month, from one town, in delivery fees. That is \$4.8 million dollars in one year in delivery fees.

My delivery fees don't really go under \$100.

We are truly feeding the beast of greed, either out of our own pockets or through agency's such as HEAP, which, again, ripples down to the New York State resident and taxpayer who, on an average, does not receive a three point seven to an
