Program manufacturers continue to be excited about the increased program incentives. Fourteen (14) CFL promotions were approved in February throughout various parts of the State.

Since the Program's inception (April 1, 2009), 1,423,693 CFLs sold have been incentivized; 97,622 CFLs were incentivized in February (approximately 3% of 2010 incentivized sales goals). The recent additions of K-Mart and Duane Reade to the list of program retail partners is expected to result in a significant increase in promotions and sales.

Program staff is working with the Consortium for Energy Efficiency (CEE) to address the need for high power factor in the ENERGY STAR specification for CFLs. CEE maintains a list of ideal performance goals for CFLs that are used when products go through a new round of specifications.

Since its January launch, the Shining Example Campaign has seen a consistent increase of awareness and participation. Campaign media buys that began in January and continued in February included 30 and 60 second Television and radio spots, newspaper inserts and social media programming on Facebook and Twitter. The micro site, <u>www.ShiningExampleNY.com</u> is generally seeing between 1,000 - 2000 unique (not duplicated) visitors a day.

There have been 4,222 New Facebook Fans of which 879 were gained in February, 127 Followers on Twitter with 156 Tweets, 34 Contest Submissions with 17 new ones for February. Of the 4,222 Facebook Fans, 39% are Male and 61% are Female.

NYSERDA received its first proposal under PON 1816: Training Partner Agreement (TPA). A Technical Evaluation Panel (TEP) meeting was held to review the proposal against the approval criteria in PON 1816.
