Dear Secretary Phillips:

Danskammer Energy, LLC (“Danskammer Energy”) is the owner and operator of the Danskammer generating facility, a four-unit, conventional steam electric generating facility with a total capacity of 532 MW that is located in Newburgh, New York, New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (“NYISO”) Zone G (“Facility”). The Facility is interconnected to the 115 kV system in the Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corporation (“CHG&E”) service territory.

In its order adopting generator retirement notice requirements, the New York Public Service Commission (“Commission”) established that generating facilities must provide notice to the Commission, the NYISO and “any affected T&D utility” prior to deactivation.¹ The timing of such notice is based on the size of the facility.² Given the Facility’s size, the 180-day notice provision applies.

Danskammer Energy filed a generator deactivation notice application with the NYISO in accordance with the requirements of Attachment FF to the NYISO’s Open Access Transmission Tariff (“DAN Application”) on December 17, 2025. On January 12, 2026, the NYISO posted a notice that the Facility’s DAN Application was deemed complete. The NYISO will accordingly determine if the Facility’s deactivation produces any reliability needs in its Q1 2026 Short Term Assessment of Reliability Study (“STAR”), which will commence tomorrow, January 15, 2026.

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Following the NYISO course of study, this assessment is expected to be completed by no later than April 14, 2026. While Danskammer Energy designated the full one-year retirement notice period in the Facility's DAN Application as required by the NYISO's tariff, it also notified the NYISO of its intent to retire the Facility as of the beginning of HB 1 on August 1, 2026 if the NYISO and CHG&E find its retirement does not raise bulk system or local reliability needs.

Pursuant to the Generator Retirement Notice Requirement Order and NYISO Technical Bulletin No. 185, Danskammer Energy is contemporaneously sending a copy of this Notice to the NYISO via email directed to the NYISO designated web address. While the Generator Retirement Notice Requirement Order did not define the term "affected T&D utility," Danskammer has also contemporaneously sent a copy of this Notice to its connecting Transmission Owner, CHG&E.

Upon its deactivation, Danskammer Energy will submit a letter to the Commission in this proceeding confirming the Facility's permanent retirement. Should you have any questions about this Notice, please call or e-mail me.
