NOTICE REQUESTING COMMENTS ON
WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION APPLICATION

(Issued April 29, 2024)

On November 30, 2021, the New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment granted Trelina Solar Energy Center, LLC (Trelina) a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need, with Conditions (Certificate) pursuant to Public Service Law §168.

The Certificate authorizes Trelina to construct and operate a solar electric generation facility with a generation capacity of up to 80 megawatts, consisting of commercial scale arrays of solar photovoltaic (PV) panels, together with associated facilities, that will occupy a fenced-in area of 418 acres within a 1,067-acre Project Area, in the Town of Waterloo, Seneca County (the Project). In addition to the PV panels, the Project will include inverters, fencing, access roads, collection lines, laydown/staging areas, a collection substation, and interconnection facilities. To supply electricity to New York State's bulk electric transmission system, the Project will interconnect with the existing, and adjacent, "Border City-Station 122" 115- kilovolt transmission line owned by the New York State Electric and Gas Corporation.

Pursuant to 33 U.S.C. §1341(a)(1), notice is provided that on March 12, 2024, Trelina filed an Application for a Clean

Water Act §401 Water Quality Certification (March 2024 Application for Water Quality Certification).
