NOTICE EXTENDING COMMENT PERIOD

(Issued July 29, 2026)

On June 24, 2026, a Notice Soliciting Comments was issued (June 24 Notice). The June 24 Notice requested comments on (1) the Coordinated Grid Planning Process (CGPP) Cycle 1 Report, as corrected;¹ (2) the request to develop local transmission projects; and (3) whether the Public Service Commission (Commission) should identify any Public Policy Requirements that drive the need for transmission and should be referred to the New York Independent System Operator, Inc. (NYISO) to solicit and evaluate potential solutions. Comments in response to the June 24 Notice were requested by August 10, 2026.

¹ The Joint Utilities are Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corporation; Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc.; Long Island Power Authority; New York State Electric & Gas Corporation; Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid; Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc.; and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation. On June 3, 2026, the Joint Utilities filed limited corrections to the CGPP Cycle 1 Report. The CGPP Cycle 1 Report as corrected is referred to as the Report.

By letter dated July 20, 2026, the New York Power Authority (NYPA) requested an extension of time to file comments.² NYPA asserts that the requests for comments raise significant and complex issues that require additional time for stakeholders to adequately address. NYPA notes that the NYISO recently issued its Short-Term Assessment of Reliability (STAR) Report. NYPA contends that the STAR Report provides additional information that could be relevant for the Commission's consideration, but stakeholders have not had an opportunity to review and compare its findings to those made in the Report. NYPA asserts that the Commission's decisional process would be aided if additional time were provided to stakeholders to properly review and evaluate the materials and thereafter provide comments.
