Dear Gregory Feeney:

I received your letter dated August 13, 2024, on behalf of Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (Con Edison), requesting an extension of time to comply with Ordering Clause 21 of the Commission's *Order Establishing Updated Energy Storage Goal and Deployment Policy* (Order), issued June 20, 2024, in the above-referenced proceeding. The filing is due August 19, 2024.

In accordance with Ordering Clause 21, Con Edison was directed to submit a filing that details the Rider Q Program within 60 days of the issuance of the Order. You state that, among other things, a methodology to perform complex analyses of current network load data and anticipated future changes in network load shapes must be established to determine appropriate super-peak periods and network groupings for Rider Q rate implementation. You advise that customer load data analyses are required to establish revised Rider Q rate design billing determinants based on the proposed super-peak periods, and that these analyses are sequential, and cannot be properly performed by the required filing date. Therefore, you are requesting a 60-day extension to complete and file the Company's Rider Q Proposal.

Based upon the information provided, an extension until October 18, 2024, is granted to Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. to file its Rider Q Program. This extension is granted to promote the fair, orderly, and efficient conduct of this proceeding.
