## DECOMMISSIONING NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS – INDIAN POINT

Holtec must notify the Department of Public Service of various events occurring at Indian Point during decommissioning, site restoration, or spent fuel management operations. This document outlines the reporting requirements for Holtec to maintain compliance with the New York State Public Service Commission Order for Case 19-E-0730, issued May 19, 2021.

TYPE OF EVENT	HOW AND WHEN NOTIFICATIONS SHOULD BE MADE
<b>STATE MONITORING</b>	
Any accident directly related to decommissioning activities at Indian Point that results in a fatality.	A phone call is required within 1 Hour. Follow up with an email report.
Serious security threat to the Site.	
Nuclear Emergency (NRC Unusual Event or greater).	
Events likely to be reported immediately by news organizations.	
Spent Fuel Pool low level alarm.	
<b>PIPELINE SAFETY</b>	
Any remediation, excavation, or spent fuel management activity that may impact the gas transmission pipelines located within or in close proximity to the site.	Five (5) business days advance notice.
Any decommissioning activity involving a heavy load pipeline crossing (e.g. retired steam generators, transformers, large contaminated components, etc.).	Five (5) business days advance notice.
Any decommissioning activity involving the use of dredging, blasting, or other explosive demolition technologies.	Ten (10) business days advance notice.
