



Wonder if they will ever get

Two weeks ago, the Yankees were in first place, for the second time this season. They had just won three out of four against the Red Sox. Even though they had a pitching staff that seemed to have been assembled off eBay, enough people seemed to think they were going to outscore their way back to the championship of the AL East, as if they were the \$200 million baseball version of the Indianapolis Colts. Even if that made them the opposite of the teams Joe Torre used to have.

For now that night in first place, their first since Opening Night, seems to be just another false turning point, in a season in which we have been told that any triumph for the richest team in the world, like the one last night against the Indians, with

those ninth-inning home runs from A-Rod and Jason Giambi, was not just a turning point but a clear example that the real Yankees were ready to play.

Except maybe the real Yankees are the up-and-down Yankees. These are the Yankees who lost the first two games to the Indians. The Yankees who have given up more runs than all but three teams in the league. These are the Yankees against whom opposing batters are hitting .280 this season. These are the Yankees not just fighting it out with the Red Sox for the East, the way they were supposed to, but with the

A's — and their \$56 million payroll — and the Indians and the Twins for the wild card.

It is why the rest of this season becomes the most interesting August-September, and the most compelling, since Torre be-

came the manager. Because of the stakes. Because of the payroll. Because the general manager, Brian Cashman, is nearing the end of his contract, because of the uncertainty about who will actually set the tone for this organization as George Steinbrenner continues to get older, and more distant.

"Screw the injuries," Cashman said yesterday. "They're

part of the game. We've got two months to find out what we're made of. The bottom line is that we have to find a way."

He knows the deal: The Yankees will overcome injuries and age and the way they constantly over-evaluate and overpay these new pitchers, or they won't.

"You're either a championship-caliber team or you're not," Cashman said. "Championship-caliber teams overcome things."

Then he said, "I know all the things we don't have. I know all the problems we've had. I'll still take my chances with what we've got. I'll go to war with Jeter and A-Rod and Posada and Randy Johnson and Mike Mussina and Tom Gordon and Tanyon Sturtze and Mariano Rivera. Guys like that know there's only one question to be answered the

rest of the way: Will we get it done or not?"

The Yankees will get out of this and still win the East or at least make the playoffs. They will have shown you something big and important about their ability to overcome the kinds of calamities that other teams do. And they will have done it this time without adding payroll. They won't have bought their way out of trouble.

Or they won't make it, and will be out of the playoffs in a full season of baseball, for the first time since 1993. It won't make them the most expensive postseason flop in sports history, just the most expensive flop, period.

Cable guy busted in scam

CABLE BILL TOO high? Who ya gonna call?

Well, if you're a Cablevision customer, Anthony Phillip was your guy.

The Brooklyn man, who worked out of Cablevision's Melville and Bronx customer calling centers, was nabbed for helping nearly 300 subscribers get free service for months, Nassau prosecutors said yesterday.

Phillip, 26, of Maple St. in Prospect-Lefferts Gardens cost the Long Island-based cable outfit more than \$150,000 in lost profits, according to Nassau District Attorney Denis Dillon.

Phillip pulled off his scheme by allegedly using the passwords of former co-workers to access Cablevision's computer server in Bethpage, where the company stores its data and records. He then adjusted subscribers' accounts, giving them unauthorized credit that allowed them to receive free cable service, some for longer than a year, prosecutors said.

The alleged scam was uncovered during a company audit in late May.

Phillip, hired by Cablevision through a Woodbury temp agency, United Staffing, was arrested when he showed up Wednesday night at the cable company's Bartow Ave. calling center in the Bronx. He had worked there since Dec. 27, following a six-month stint at Cablevision's Melville customer calling center that ended July 20, 2004.

Dillon said the cable provider's auditors "noticed an unusually high number of credits being given to several Cablevision customers."

When they probed further, they realized that all the "suspicious credits" were authorized by several Cablevision customer relation coordinators who no longer worked at the company.

Assistant District Attorney Stephen Treglia said the investigation led to Phillip because the former colleagues "were people he was working with" at one time. The Nassau district attorney is prosecuting the case because Cablevision's computer server — legally, the scene of the crime — is located in its jurisdiction.

During a press conference yesterday, prosecutors declined to provide a motive for Phillip's deeds and cited an ongoing investigation. But Treglia, chief of the DA's technology crime unit, did say that Phillip was no Robin Hood of the cable industry.

That "would assume that he was doing it for no good benefit to himself," Treglia said.

Phillip was charged with computer tampering in the first degree, a felony punishable by up to 15 years in prison.

Paddlers with purpose

Kayakers circle L.I. to raise Alzheimer's funds

TEXAS KAYAKERS Erin Magee and Richard Steppe became the first coed team to circle Long Island yesterday, and they raised more than \$15,000 for Alzheimer's research in the process.

"It was great," said Magee, as she stepped out of the kayak and onto the dock of Manhasset Bay Yacht Club in Port Washington yesterday. "Everybody should do it."

Steppe, who lost his father-in-law 15 years ago to Alzheimer's, and Magee, the first woman on record to circumnavigate Long Island in a kayak,

began the Long Island Alzheimer's Foundation (LIAF) Memory Paddle Challenge on Aug. 5.

The kayakers were greeted ashore by 20 cheering supporters, including members of LIAF and caregivers of Alzheimer's sufferers.

Magee and Steppe, both from Texas, are national paddling champions — though they noted that they are more accustomed to paddling through river waters, not the Atlantic Ocean.

Wendy Friedman of LIAF contacted Magee, 42, to participate in the event. Magee asked Steppe, 47, if he would be her partner.

Magee said the two have known each other since 1998 and have been racing together since 2002. This was the first time they've paddled together for a cause.

"It surely was a challenge. Some days were good. Some were hard," said Steppe, who added that the two switched between two boats, depending on the condition of the water they were paddling through.

They had to deal with the

rudder breaking on one of the boats, as well as brutal waves, headwinds, rain and boat traffic. They stopped at night to eat and sleep in motels.

Magee said they spent between six to nine hours a day in the boat, paddling an average of 40 miles per day over the 300-mile trip.

"It was an inspiring trip to do for this cause and this organization," said Magee, who added that Alzheimer's runs in the families of some of her friends. "To have Alzheimer's is like drowning," she said.

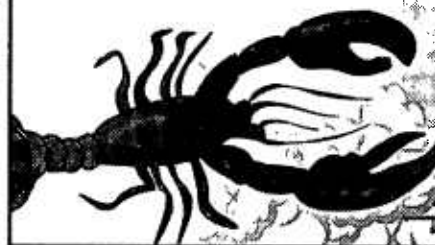

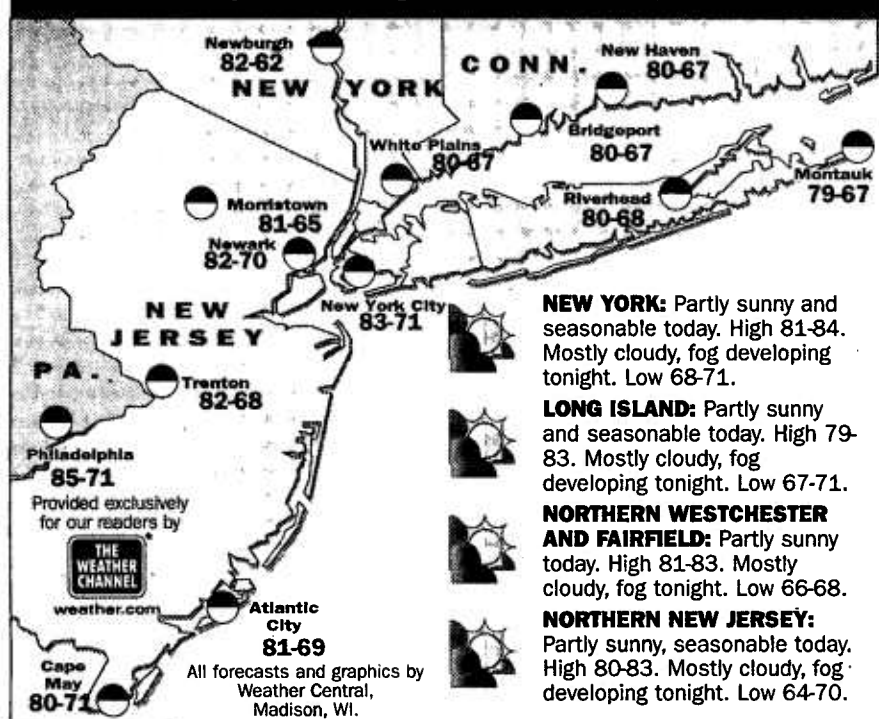

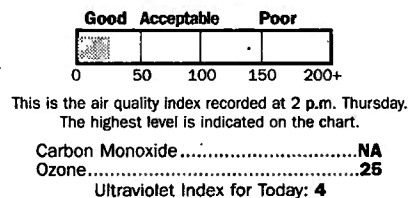

Credit card hawkers get wings clipped on campus

STUDENTS ATTENDING colleges in New York State will have one less temptation on campus this year.

There will be fewer solicitors offering T-shirts, coffee mugs, CDs and other free stuff in an effort to persuade them to apply for credit cards. On July 1, a new state law that regulates the marketing of credit cards on New York college campuses went into effect.

Credit card companies will only be allowed on campus to sign up students if the college has an official marketing policy. The policy must limit credit card companies to specific dates and locations, prohibit sign-up gifts and require the credit card companies to sponsor student education programs about credit management.

The law was designed to protect college students from the aggressive marketing of credit card companies — and minimize their risks of graduating with thousands of dollars in credit card debt.

Government regulators hope to replace the insistent marketing with equally aggressive education in the classroom. The Federal Trade Commission and Federal Reserve Bank of New York, for example, recently launched a credit education program in partnership with the City University of New York.

The program, Money Works, is de-

signed to educate city college students in personal finance and explore the distinction between using and abusing credit. It is modeled on an FTC-backed program in use at John Jay College.

The goal is to give students across CUNY's 20-school system information on topics like interest rates, hidden fees, teaser rates and grace periods.

An estimated 83% of U.S. college students have at least one credit card — and an average debt of \$2,327, according to figures provided the FTC by Nellie Mae, a national student loan financing group. By graduation, 20% are \$10,000 in credit-card debt, and 4% are likely to default, according to the FTC.

While it is prudent for students to have a credit card for emergencies, they should learn to limit its use, make each monthly payment before the due date, and pay off what they owe before adding new debts.

Parties get together to save the Catalpa Y

THE CATALPA YMCA, threatened with closure for the past two years, will remain open and continue to be a neighborhood Y, it was announced yesterday.

The Ridgewood facility was scheduled to close at the end of the month, but an agreement between the Y and elected officials will keep it open.

"The great passion that the community had for the Catalpa YMCA was part of the impetus behind the parties going the extra mile to make it work," said Jack Lund, president of the YMCA of Greater New York.

Financial and building difficulties had previously forced the YMCA to consider closing the facility.

In March 2003, the Y first announced plans to close the Ridgewood branch.

In June 2003, it received a one-year reprieve. Then the following year, it got another reprieve while elected officials looked to buy the building — a former courthouse — and turn it over to a local community group to run.

"Here at Catalpa, we are committed to providing strong leadership, to maintaining strong programs and to building a robust membership," Lund said in announcing the decision to remain at the building at 64th St. and Catalpa Ave., which the Y has owned since 1965.

Queens Borough President Helen Marshall allocated \$500,000 to keeping the Catalpa Y open, and Councilman Dennis Gallagher (R-Middle Village) committed another \$250,000. The Y has agreed to match that money.

Assemblywoman Catherine Nolan (D-Ridgewood) and State Sen. Serphin Maltese have promised state aid.

Working with the elected officials and business groups, "the YMCA will create a realistic plan to renovate the building, and to provide quality programs and services to Ridgewood and surrounding communities," said the Y president.

"The key is the difference in leadership between Jack Lund and his predecessor," added Gallagher.

Lund, the former president and CEO of the YMCA of Metropolitan Milwaukee, took over from Paula Gavin at the beginning of 2004.

Gavin had said that the Catalpa Y was too small and had to be closed.

'Saint' of cats dies

Famous pooch saved felines by hundreds

SHE WAS OLD and tired, could hardly walk and spent her last days flopped on a worn blanket.

Ginny, the little dog from Long Beach that rescued cats, was on her last leg.

The 17-year-old mixed breed, who saved some 900 cats and was immortalized in two books, died yesterday in the company of her owner and 18 cats she saved from certain death.

"She hasn't eaten in three days. She's suffering from old age right now," Ginny's owner, Philip Gonzalez, said yesterday, looking down at the Siberian Husky-Schnauzer mix's emaciated body as she took short, desperate breaths.

"I think she's going to go tonight."

And just three hours later, about 2:30 p.m., Ginny took her last breath.

The rescue dog's heartbroken owner fondly recalled the days when Ginny would sniff

out kittens in peril. Gonzalez, 55, of Long Beach remembered when younger Ginny yelped and ran to the second floor of a Long Beach building under construction to rescue five kittens trapped in a pipe. Ginny threw her furry body against the tall plastic tube sticking up from the floor, Gonzalez said. The pipe fell over, revealing the helpless felines.

"These kittens were maybe 3 weeks old. Someone must have thrown them in there," said Gonzalez, who lives alone with three other dogs and the 18 cats.

Ginny first gained relative fame in the 1990s when publisher HarperCollins learned of her story from a magazine article.

Gonzalez co-authored two books about Ginny and her rescues: "The Dog Who Rescues Cats" and "The Blessing of the Animals." Both were translated into numerous languages.

"They call her the Mother Theresa of cats," Gonzalez said.

In another memorable rescue, Ginny dug through a box of glass near a warehouse to save a trapped kitten. "She jumped out of the car and started digging into this box of broken glass, cutting her paws," Gonzalez said.

Ginny somehow sensed when cats were in trouble, then found them, cleaned them and carried them from danger in her mouth.

Gonzalez also tried to train Ginny to sniff out money, but to no avail.

"I said, 'You like these cats? You want to feed them all? Then you pay for it,'" Gonzalez said.

But in fact, she already had, because both books are best sellers.

"I think she was a cat lady in a prior life," Gonzalez said.


