

Monitoring Updates


- Continuous monitoring (15 second intervals)*
- Secure, closed data feed to County & State
- 16 monitors located near Indian Point site
- Monitoring program through spent fuel transfer (required under PSC Order 19-E-0730)
- Monitor Nos. 8 and 9 Approx. 1,200ft and 1,300ft from BV school

*Indian Point is one of only five US nuclear power plants with continuous radiation monitoring capability





Reuter-Stokes Map



 - Proof of Financial Protection 10 CFR 140.15 date December 12, 2022
 - Unit 2 License Amendment: Permanently Defueled Tech Specs to Modify Staffing Requirements following Transfer of Spent Fuel to Dry Storage dated August 2, 2022
 - Completed Joint Proposal compliance review for 2022
 - Reviewed containment hatch violation corrective actions
 - Reviewed corrective actions associated with Rad Worker Practices.
 - Reviewed Oak Ridge National Laboratory Updated Safety Review and Assessment publicly issued December 16, 2022
 - State regulators have been present at all Holtec monthly project meetings, and Holtec has provided the information required under the Joint Proposal at each meeting.

Federal Engagement

- Holtec exemption & license amendment request for Permanently
 Defueled Emergency Plan (PDEP) State comments submitted to NRC
 on November 22, 2022. NRC hosted a public Informational Webinar on
 November 30.
- Holtec license amendment request to eliminate cyber security plan requirements. <u>ML22140A126</u> State review is in progress.
- Holtec license amendment request to revise technical specifications following transfer of all spent fuel into dry cask storage. <u>ML22214A128</u> State review is in progress.



DEC Oversight Activities

Administrative Consent Order Requirements

Citizen Participation (CP) Plan

- Ensures public involvement in review of work plans and remedial action plans.
- Status: NYS DEC approved the CP plan on September 23, 2022.

Scoping Work Plan

- Outlines the overall program of remedial investigation.
- Status: NYS DEC approved the Scoping Work Plan on August 11, 2022.

Remedial Investigation (RI) Work Plans

- Investigations will be conducted in a series of RI Work Plans.
- Approved work plans will be announced via fact sheet distributed to the public.

DEC Oversight Activities – Facility Permits

State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES)

- SPDES # NY0004472 Governs Discharges from Main Facility
 - Expired on April 30, 2022. Holtec submitted a timely renewal application. Facility continues to have coverage under the existing SPDES permit pursuant to the State Administrative Procedure Law.
 - NYSDEC undertaking a review of the permit application to determine if a permit modification is necessary.
 - Once NYSDEC review is complete, a Draft SPDES Permit will be provided for public review and comment in accordance with NYSDEC regulations.



DEC Oversight Activities – Facility Permits

<u>SPDES # NY0250414 – Governs stormwater discharges from a transformer vault</u>

- Permit expires 3/31/23. Holtec submitted a timely renewal application.
- Draft renewal Permit was noticed in the Environmental Notice Bulletin for a 30 day public comment period ending on September 9, 2022.
- Based on the nature and volume of discharge, this permit is eligible for an administrative renewal, with no permit changes.
- NYSDEC's Policy on Environmental Justice and Permitting (CP-29) does not apply to administrative renewals of SPDES permits, where no material changes to the existing permit are proposed.
- This permit is separate and distinct from the more comprehensive facility SPDES permit (SPDES No. NY0004472).
- Based on the comments DEC received on SPDES permit No. NY0250414, DEC will combine both
 permits into a single SPDES permit. No further action will be taken on the administrative renewal of
 SPDES permit No. NY0250414 at this time. The permit renewal applications will be subject to all
 applicable public notice procedures and a comment period once DEC's review is complete.



DEC Oversight Activities – Facility Permits

Major Oil Storage Facility (MOSF) License

 DEC will oversee closure and assessment of all tanks associated with the MOSF license on site in accordance with relevant regulations

Air State Facility (ASF) Permit

ASF permit issued 11/21/2014 for two oil-fired combustion turbines, three
oil fired boilers and multiple internal combustion engines that provided
emergency power. Modification issued 3/10/22 for the installation of a
seasonal boiler to meet heating needs during the remaining stages of
decommissioning.



Indian Point Decommissioning

Dust Mitigation

Village Permitting:

- State regulations prohibit air pollution under 6NYCRR part 211.1, which set standards about dust (among other pollutants) that is generated from any activity including demolition;
- Village will directly incorporate the State standards described in part 211.1 into demolition permit process.

Community Air Monitoring:

 Request for proposals (RFP) issued January 9, 2023 seeking environmental consulting services to develop and implement a Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) to be in place during the heavy demolition phases of decommissioning at Indian Point

Employment and Labor Relations

New York State Department of Labor (NYSDOL) continues ongoing engagement with affected Entergy employees re: re-employment services, assistance with Unemployment Insurance questions and help navigating the process.

- Prior to the start of the decommissioning, 93 employees were provided re-employment services including dedicated workshops to help prepare employees with their job search efforts.
- To date, 14 employees have been provided Unemployment Insurance assistance.
- Additional outreach efforts by NYSDOL included:
 - Job placement services mailing was sent to all 308 affected employees.
 - Conducted calls and sent emails to connect and provide assistance if needed.
 - Updates:
 - 25 Interested in NYSDOL re-employment services
 - 16 Returned to work
 - **13** Retired



Employment and Labor Relations

- NYSDOL received a WARN for Holtec on 10/31/2022, indicating that layoffs for 30 employees will occur on February 15, 2023.
 - WARN: Indian Point Energy Center (IPEC) subsidiary of Holtec International;
 Holtec Decommissioning International, LLC Mid-Hudson Region
- NYSDOL worked with Holtec's HR Representative to schedule
 2 virtual Rapid Response Orientations for the affected employees.
- The orientations took place on January 25th at 9am and January 26th at 3pm to accommodate the employees' work schedules. Materials provided to HR Representative for affected employees unable to attend.
- NYSDOL continues to share virtual workshop information along with details on upcoming in-person and virtual career fairs. This information is being shared by Holtec with the employees directly

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
