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1.0 INTRODUCTION

Eight Point Wind, LLC plans to submit an application to construct a major electric generating facility, the Eight Point Wind Energy Center, under Article 10 of the Public Service Law (PSL). Pursuant to the rules of the New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (Siting Board), applicants proposing to submit an application to construct a major electric generating facility under Article 10 must submit a Public Involvement Program (PIP). The PIP must be submitted to the Department of Public Service (DPS) for review at least 150 days prior to filing a Preliminary Scoping Statement (PSS). This document is the PIP plan for the Eight Point Wind Energy Center (the Project), a wind energy facility described in Section 2.

As required by 16 NYCRR § 1000.4, this PIP includes the following elements:

- 1) consultation with the affected agencies and other stakeholders;
- pre-application activities to encourage stakeholders to participate at the earliest opportunity;
- 3) activities designed to educate the public as to the specific proposal and the Article 10 review process, including the availability of funding for municipal and local parties;
- 4) the establishment of a website to disseminate information to the public;
- 5) notifications; and
- 6) activities designed to encourage participation by stakeholders in the certification and compliance process.

2.0 APPLICANT AND PROJECT DESCRIPTION

2.1 Company Profile

Eight Point Wind, LLC is an affiliate of NextEra Energy, Inc., (NextEra) one of the largest clean energy companies in North America. NextEra is a utility-scale power producer developing clean energy projects in New York State, which operate under the supervision and regulatory authority of the New York State Public Service Commission (NYS PSC) and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). Headquartered in Juno Beach, Florida, NextEra is the world's largest generator of renewable energy from the wind and sun and owns and operates 110 wind farms in the United States and Canada. In addition, NextEra has two operating natural gasfired power plants in New York. NextEra provides wholesale electricity to the public using, amongst other sources, clean, renewable sources such as wind. This energy furthers the federal government's policy as articulated in 42 U.S.C. 9201 to "hasten the widespread utilization of [wind energy] systems," as well as the State of New York's Renewable Portfolio



Standard and other clean energy programs. Likewise, this energy promotes the Administration's landmark new energy policy, Reforming the Energy Vision (REV), which calls for the transition to an integrated energy network able to combine the benefits of a centralized grid with clean, locally generated power. The Eight Point Wind Energy Center would be compatible with these federal and state policies and renewable energy goals.

NextEra intends to construct, own, operate, and maintain all components of the Project, except for the interconnection switchyard. The switchyard facility will be constructed by NextEra, and then transferred to New York State Electric and Gas Corporation (NYSEG), which will own, operate, and maintain the switchyard.

2.2 Project Summary

Eight Point Wind, LLC is planning the Project to have a maximum generating capability of 103.4 megawatts (MW) of power from an estimated 32 wind turbines located on land leased from owners of private property located in the Towns of Canisteo, Greenwood, Hartsville, Hornellsville, Jasper, Troupsburg and West Union in Steuben County, New York (Figure 1). The Project is named the Eight Point Wind Project due to the eight points of the cardinal compass rose representing the seven local communities and the County. The modern compass rose has eight principal winds.

Project facilities will include commercial-scale wind turbines, access roads, buried (and possibly overhead) electric collection lines, a Project collection substation, meteorological towers, an operation and maintenance (O&M) building, and electrical interconnection facilities. Eight Point Wind, LLC anticipates the interconnection facilities will include a 115-kV switchyard built adjacent to NYSEG's 115-kV Bennett Substation (both located outside of the municipal boundary of the City of Hornell, entirely in the Town of Hornellsville), and an overhead 115-kV interconnection line approximately 9 miles long. With the entire Project subject to Article 10, the outreach activities described in this PIP will address both the transmission line and the wind energy facility.

The proposed Project will have positive socioeconomic impacts in the Project Area and beyond through employment opportunities, specifically by generating temporary construction employment. Based on similar Project experience elsewhere, Eight Point Wind, LLC estimates that approximately 150-200 temporary construction jobs will be generated during the 8 months of construction. Additionally, Eight Point Wind, LLC estimates that 8-10 permanent operation and maintenance jobs will be created and filled during the 30-year expected life of the Project. The majority of the temporary construction employment will likely be drawn from the Steuben County and the Southern Tier labor market. Local construction employment will primarily



benefit those in the construction trades, including equipment operators, truck drivers, laborers, and electricians. Eight Point Wind, LLC encourages local hiring to the greatest extent possible and workers from outside the area who fill specialized job functions will add to the regional economy by staying in area hotels, eating in the local restaurants and shopping in Steuben County stores.

Once operational, the Project is estimated to provide more than \$25 million in property taxes over the 30-year expected life of the Project to local governments to support schools, infrastructure and vital services such as fire departments and other emergency response entities. These extra tax dollars will be added to local government budgets without adding new infrastructure (roads, sewer, water, etc.), without adding new students to the school system, and without creating the need for additional police and fire service.

Payments to landowners are estimated to be more than \$24 million over the 30-year expected life of the Project.

2.3 Project Area and Study Area

Figures 1-3 show the regional Project location, the Project Area and the preliminary Study Area to be used for analysis. For purposes of this document, Eight Point Wind, LLC is defining these areas as follows:

- The Project Area is comprised of the locations being evaluated for placement of permanent Project facilities. As shown in Figure 2, the Project Area is approximately rectangular and includes 98,951 acres of land (exclusive of the Greenwood State Forest, Rock Creek State Forest and Turkey Ridge State Forest). None of the Project Area is proposed to be located inside the State Forest areas.
- Consistent with 16 NYCRR § 1000.2(ar), the Study Area (as shown in Figure 3) is all areas within at least 5 miles of the current planned location of Project generating facility components, interconnections and related facilities and alternative location sites, and includes approximately 324,510 acres of land (inclusive of the 98,951 acre Project Area).

The Project Area and Study Area are based on preliminary estimates of where facilities could be located. The PSS and Application will further define the Study Area as well as discuss alternatives.



3.0 PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

3.1 PIP Goals

Eight Point Wind, LLC developed this PIP to ensure that comments of individuals and groups with a potential interest in the Project are objectively considered in the Project design and review. Specific PIP goals are to:

- Identify groups and individuals with a potential interest in the Project, i.e., "stakeholders;"
- Ensure stakeholders are aware of the Project;
- Ensure stakeholders can access information on the Project and the Article 10 review process in a relatively convenient manner;
- Engage stakeholders to understand their interests related to the Project and seek input as to how to best address their interests and concerns as the Project moves forward;
- Gather specific information from stakeholders that can be used to design objective and useful studies to be defined in the PSS and included in a complete Application for the Project.

3.2 PIP Schedule

Eight Point Wind, LLC began conducting PIP activities during the pre-application phase in October 2015, and these public involvement activities will continue throughout the Article 10 process until the Project begins commercial operation. Specific PIP activities and their schedules are discussed in Section 5.

4.0 STAKEHOLDERS

Eight Point Wind, LLC has identified several categories of stakeholders. Overall, Eight Point Wind, LLC relied on its experience in developing other projects, review of PIPs filed for other projects, discussions with local officials, and the knowledge of its local representatives to identify potential stakeholders. The identification of stakeholders was based on DPS guidance, conducting internet research, site visits to the Project Area and Study Area, review of GIS records, tax records, and consultation with environmental/regulatory counsel.

Descriptions of stakeholder categories are located in the following sections below, and Appendix A contains the preliminary Project stakeholder list and the current known contact information for each stakeholder. A mailing list will be developed based on the stakeholders listed below and addresses solicited from public meetings and the Project website. The Applicant anticipates that the mailing list will be updated as necessary based on information



received during PIP activities and these updates will be provided to DPS along with the PIP tracking submissions.

Project outreach materials will contain instructions on how to be added to the stakeholder list. Individuals or organizations will be able to be added to the stakeholder list by calling a Project representative, mailing a letter to a Project representative, calling a local number, visiting the local office, or by sending an email to Eight Point Wind, LLC through the Project website.

4.1 Host Communities

For the purposes of this PIP, host communities refers to those municipalities that currently include the Project Area and are anticipated to include Project components. Town boards and county legislators representing any portion of the host communities within the Project Area were identified by review of town and county boundary maps and are considered stakeholders. Points of contact (POC) will be the Town Supervisors, County Administrator and the appropriate Town or County Clerks. Notices will be addressed to the full board, care of the POC and the appropriate Clerk, with language clearly stating the expectation that the notices and information should be distributed to the full board. Eight Point Wind, LLC will meet with the POCs prior to submittal of the PSS and will offer to meet with the full boards, along with the County Legislature.

4.2 County Agencies

County agencies, other than the county legislature, with areas of responsibility potentially affected by the Project were identified by review of the county websites, calls to county personnel, and/or county GIS data. Note that the County Emergency Response Coordinator and Sheriff are identified as stakeholders and are listed under the category of "Emergency Responders."

4.3 State Agencies

Departments of New York State and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania governments were identified using Eight Point Wind, LLC's experience in developing utility projects in the region, as well as those agencies specifically identified in 16 NYCRR § 1000.5 and 1000.6.

4.4 Federal Agencies

Agencies of the U.S. government were identified using Eight Point Wind, LLC's experience in developing wind projects in the United States, review of previous PIP submittals, and DPS guidance.



4.5 Legislative Representatives

Offices of the New York State Legislature, the U.S. Senate, and U.S. Congress representing the Study Area were identified by review of on-line district maps.

4.6 Highway Departments

County and town departments responsible for managing roads in the Study Area were identified by review of town and county boundary maps, and online research.

4.7 Schools

School districts serving parcels in the Study Area and school districts adjacent to these districts were identified by review of county tax maps and online research.

4.8 Emergency Responders

Fire departments, emergency responders and police or sheriff departments serving parcels in the Study Area were identified by review of county tax maps and online research.

4.9 Adjacent Municipalities

Towns, villages, or other municipalities that are not host communities but are in the Study Area were identified by review of municipal boundary maps and GIS mapping.

4.10 Utilities

Companies that own gas, electric, or communications infrastructure in the Project Area were identified by available local and state geographic information databases (e.g., Ventyx), online research, and previous PIP submittals. Utility companies will be contacted concerning location of facilities, design standards for construction near existing infrastructure, facility design and safety considerations.

4.11 Public Interest Groups

Organizations that serve interests of the public in the Study Area were identified from the 2015 list of county officials that includes county and town historians, and online research. This category includes business organizations, county and town historians, conservation or environmental organizations, and organized groups focused on use of the Project Area for outdoor recreation.



4.12 Airports and Heliports

Organizations operating FAA-registered airfields within 12 miles of the Project Area were identified by searching the FAA's database on licensed airports and heliports.

4.13 Participating Landowners

Real property owners that have entered into lease, easement, purchase option, or setback agreements with Eight Point Wind, LLC that will allow construction of Project facilities on their property are considered "participating landowners".

Participating landowners are included in the stakeholder list as one group. Eight Point Wind, LLC 's private contracts with these landowners contain provisions for Eight Point Wind, LLC and landowners to work together on Project plans. These consultations are confidential discussions outside the scope of this PIP. In addition to confidential communications with Eight Point Wind, LLC, participating landowners living in the Project Area will be notified of Project milestones and events in the same manner as all residents of the Project Area.

4.14 Adjacent Landowners

Owners of properties that abut or are within 500 feet of parcels where Project facilities are planned, but who are not participating landowners, are considered "adjacent landowners." Although the Project layout will continue to evolve throughout the preliminary scoping process and will not be considered final until the Article 10 process is completed, Eight Point Wind, LLC anticipates that the development of a Project layout will be substantially complete and available for discussion prior to the submittal of the Application. Potential adjacent landowners will be identified based on the preliminary Project layout and notified via mail. As the Project layout evolves, some stakeholders identified as adjacent landowners may recede while others may be added in response to changes in land acquisition and facilities siting. While all Study Area residents will be initially notified and have the opportunity to join the stakeholders list (see 4.15 below) once a Project layout is developed, Eight Point Wind, LLC will identify these adjacent landowners by review of tax records and will add the adjacent owners individually to the stakeholder list. These owners will receive mailings or emails notifying them of Project milestones and events.

4.15 Area Residents

Residents of the Study Area who are not participating landowners or adjacent owners are included in the stakeholder list as one group. Eight Point Wind, LLC plans to notify these residents of the Project individually by mailing an informational flyer announcing open houses



and providing general Project information to all unique addresses in the voting rolls for the Study Area. At the open houses, attendees will be encouraged to join the stakeholder list if they wish to continue to receive notice of future Project milestones (e.g., availability of the PSS, public hearing, etc.). After the open houses, Eight Point Wind, LLC does not plan additional broad mailings to area residents that do not register as stakeholders. But these residents would still likely hear more of the Project through public outreach activities, notices in area newspapers, and updates on the Project website.

5.0 PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PROGRAM ELEMENTS

The overall objective of the PIP, which is inherent in each of the following elements, is to engage with all stakeholders in order to understand their varied interests and concerns as they relate to the Project, to seek their input and to gather specific, objective information that can be utilized to inform the detailed study plans that will make up the PSS, and to explain methods Eight Point Wind will use to keep stakeholders informed throughout the entire Article 10 process. To that end, the PIP will involve the program elements outlined in the sections below.

5.1 PIP Activities, Schedule, and Goals

Appendix B lists the PIP activities Eight Point Wind, LLC plans to conduct, and the schedule and goals for each activity. Public involvement activities will be conducted throughout the Article 10 process, including post PSS phases and Application submittal. Materials to encourage public involvement throughout the Article 10 process such as fact sheets covering topics listed in Section 5.4 below, newsletters, and the presentations from town board meetings and open house events are currently being prepared, and will be available on the Project website by April 2016. Throughout each stage of the Article 10 process, Eight Point Wind, LLC will actively engage stakeholders through open dialogue with town boards, establishing and maintaining a local office presence, and stakeholder mailings and emails as necessary to keep the public informed and involved.

5.2 Consultation with Affected Agencies and other Stakeholders

At any stakeholder meetings or conference calls, Eight Point Wind, LLC will be represented by one or more of the representatives identified in Section 5.3.3.

Each consultation meeting will include an overview of the proposed Project and the Article 10 review process. Additional topics covered during stakeholder consultations will vary depending on the stakeholder's role and potential impact. Examples of possible topics are the availability of funding for municipal and local parties, payment in lieu of tax agreements, highway



agreements, local laws, emergency response requirements, identification of consistency or conflicts with plans, planning documents or other development or preservation goals, opportunities for advancing goals (e.g. coordination of planned road repaving or possible colocation of transmission cables in existing utility corridors), and environmental impacts. Stakeholder consultation meetings will be documented in the PIP Tracking Report and comments received will be recorded (as discussed in Section 5.7 below).

As appropriate, Eight Point Wind, LLC will conduct subsequent meetings to answer specific questions, and to discuss studies, mitigation, or other strategies that could address stakeholder concerns. A key to these interactions, and a core of the PIP, is receiving information from the stakeholders.

A schedule of initial consultations is provided in Appendix B.

5.2.1 Stakeholder Notifications

Eight Point Wind, LLC will notify stakeholders of the following important Project milestones, except as discussed in Section 4.15 for area residents.

- Open House(s)
- Preliminary Scoping Statement (PSS) Submittal
- Application Submittal
- Public Hearing(s)
- Siting Board Decision
- Commencement of Construction
- Commercial Operations Date

Stakeholder notifications will be made 14 or more days prior to each of these important Project milestones, by letter and email. In addition to the letters and emails providing notification to stakeholders, the Applicant will also publish the notice in the local newspapers, the Hornell Evening Tribune, the Genesee Valley Pennysaver and the Tioga Publishing Community Newspapers. Lastly, notifications will also be provided on the Project website (www.EightPointWind.com). The website is discussed in more detail in Section 5.5 below.

5.2.2 Collection of Stakeholder Input

For stakeholder groups, Eight Point Wind, LLC will identify and contact the group's POC to introduce the Project and offer to meet with the stakeholder group or POC. At stakeholder meetings Eight Point Wind, LLC will introduce NextEra, the Project, and the Article 10 review



process, and Eight Point Wind, LLC will solicit specific feedback on issues that stakeholders want considered in the Project design or review. This feedback will be tracked in a comment log as discussed in Section 5.7 below.

Depending on the number of individual stakeholders, it may not be practical to contact each individually. Regardless, individual stakeholders will be notified of several opportunities to learn about the Project and submit input, including on the Project website or visiting the Project local office as described below.

5.2.3 Distribution of PSS and Application Documents to Stakeholders

Stakeholders will be made aware (via mail and email) of PSS and Application availability on the Project website, the DPS website and at various public document repositories. Eight Point Wind, LLC does not intend to provide individual hard copies of these documents to stakeholders, except as required under 16 NYCRR § 1000.5 and 1000.6.

5.3 Pre-Application Activities to Encourage Stakeholders to Participate at the Earliest Opportunity

5.3.1 Town Board Meetings

Eight Point Wind, LLC has arranged to present at regularly scheduled monthly board meetings of the Canisteo Town Board, Greenwood Town Board, Hartsville Town Board, Hornellsville Town Board, Jasper Town Board, Troupsburg Town Board, and the West Union Town Board. As detailed in the PIP Meeting Log (see Appendix C) Eight Point Wind, LLC representatives have conducted initial presentations at several of the Towns' town board meetings including: Hornellsville (2/9/16), Jasper (3/8/16), Hartsville (3/9/16) Troupsburg (3/9/16) and Canisteo (3/14/16). Presentations have been scheduled for the upcoming board meetings in Greenwood (4/14/16) and West Union (4/21/16).

As part of the presentation given at each meeting Eight Point Wind, LLC representatives will discuss the Project, and the Article 10 process, and respond to questions and receive input from the board and members of the public. Eight Point Wind, LLC representatives will be available to attend future town board meetings as requested by the boards. Eight Point Wind, LLC plans to give a brief Project update at a town board meeting for each town that requests one shortly after the PSS is filed. The above meetings and any future presentations at town board meetings will be documented in the PIP tracking report.



5.3.2 Open House

Eight Point Wind, LLC will hold at least two open house style public meetings during early summer 2016 at two locations that will maximize coverage for the largest number of municipalities and residents. An additional open house may be scheduled at an alternative location and/or time depending upon stakeholder input and interests. At least three representatives of Eight Point Wind, LLC 's development team will be present at the meetings. The meetings will feature a brief opening overview presentation by Eight Point Wind, LLC representatives, followed by a continually looping presentation and poster displays on the Project, wind energy, and the Article 10 review process (including intervenor funding availability and application process). One-on-one and small group informational discussions will take place throughout the duration of each open house, providing opportunities for attendees to gain information on the Project, have their questions addressed, and provide input to Eight Point Wind, LLC representatives. As part of the open house discussions, Eight Point Wind, LLC representatives will emphasize the role of stakeholders and encourage interested area residents to join the stakeholder list.

5.3.3 Local Access to Project Representatives

Eight Point Wind, LLC will have at least three representatives available to implement this PIP and answer questions from stakeholders:

Contact information for local representatives will be posted at the respective town halls, the local office, once established, and the Project specific website (described below in Section 5.5). Additionally, this information will be made available at stakeholder consultations, town board meetings and open houses. Although not permanently stationed at the local office, the Project



Representatives listed above will periodically be available for in-office meetings by appointment. The local office will be manned by knowledgeable local staff.

5.3.4 Local Telephone Number

Eight Point Wind, LLC will maintain a local telephone number, (607) 301-3994, that will be answered at the local office during posted office hours and connected to an automated voicemail at all other times. The phone number will be advertised on the Project website and will be monitored for questions on the Project. Eight Point Wind, LLC will endeavor to respond to questions within 2 business days of receipt.

5.3.5 Local Office

Eight Point Wind, LLC intends to open a local office in the Project Area in summer 2016 in a convenient location for residents to pick up printed materials or review documents such as the PIP, Project maps, PSS, and the Article 10 Application. The opening of the Project office (location, date of opening and regular office hours) will be announced through paid newspaper advertisements, email notices to stakeholders and posting on the Project Website. Until the local office is established in the Project Area, mail and email inquiries can be sent to:

Eight Point Wind, LLC's local representatives will manage the local office and will be able to answer questions on the Project. The office will have posted regular hours, and a local phone number will be posted outside the office that can be used to set up special appointments outside of the office hours. Office hours will be adjusted to match community interest and any new hours will be posted at the local office.

5.4 Activities Designed to Educate the Public on the Proposal, the Article 10 Review Process, and Funding

Town Board meetings and the open houses (as described above) provide multiple opportunities for Eight Point Wind, LLC to disseminate information to the public concerning Project specifics, the Article 10 process, and the availability of funding for municipal and local parties as well as receive information from the public. As described above in Section 5.3.1, initial meetings with town boards began in February 2016 and will continue until presentations have been held with the town board in each of the Host Communities. Subsequent meetings will be held at the



request of the Towns. Educational materials will be available at all meetings including handouts on Project specifics and the public's role in the Article 10 process. In addition, the local Project office will have written handouts available to the public covering each of these topics, along with local representatives available to provide information, answer questions, and receive public input. All public meetings and written educational materials will also encourage interested parties to visit the Project website (described below) for information and updates. Materials and presentations will be posted on the Project website as they become available, with most anticipated to be completed by April 2016.

Presentations will contain maps, timelines, and other Project specific material developed by Eight Point Wind, LLC. Presentation materials will be made available on the Project website.

Residents of the Study Area are familiar with wind turbines, as the area hosts over 85 wind turbines, with 50 of these installed during 2009 and another 35-plus being installed in 2011-2014. Therefore, Eight Point Wind, LLC materials presented to the public will be focused on unique aspects of Eight Point Wind, LLC and the Project, the Article 10 review process, and how the wind technology used in the Project will compare to the turbines already in the area.

At the open houses, Eight Point Wind, LLC plans to have poster board displays covering topics such as:

- Recent growth trends in the wind industry;
- Environmental, emission offset, and fuel offset benefits of wind energy;
- Expected changes in turbine dimensions and technology during the period when the Project will be in development;
- Comparisons of sound emission specifications from turbines operating in the area and possible turbine models for the Project;
- Eight Point Wind, LLC operations and maintenance (O&M) capabilities and plans for staffing a local O&M facility in the Project Area;
- Project schedule;
- Project Safety;
- Intervenor funding and Article 10 process (including Pre-Application stakeholder involvement and scoping process);
- Studies expected to be required for permitting of the Project; and
- Economic benefits of the Project to the local economy.



Eight Point Wind, LLC will develop materials on the above topics using information from its wind turbine suppliers, its knowledge of the Article 10 process, and industry sources such as the American Wind Energy Association (AWEA), the Alliance for Clean Energy New York, Inc. (ACENY), and the Department of Energy (DOE). Versions of these materials will be available on the Project website.

5.5 Website

In order to disseminate information, Eight Point Wind, LLC has established a user-friendly website (www.EightPointWind.com) dedicated to the Project and written in plain English. Eight Point Wind, LLC will update the website as the Project develops and more information becomes available.

When available, the following items will be posted on the website:

- Project description and location;
- Estimated project timeline;
- Project benefits and need;
- Project safety
- Project maps;
- Project contact information, including an email address and a telephone number local to the Project Area, as well as the address and hours of operation for the local Project office (when available);
- Summary of the Article 10 process;
- Summary of the intervenor funding process with instructions on how to apply;
- Addresses of local public document repositories;
- Links to the Article 10 Siting Board webpage and to case-specific documents filed for the Project;
- Schedule (with notices describing the purpose and goals as applicable) for public outreach events, opportunities for public participation, filings, and public hearings;
- PIP tracking report;
- Community presentation materials;
- Publications or educational materials presented at the open house or distributed to stakeholders; and
- Instructions on how to join the stakeholder list.



5.6 Notifications

As noted previously, Eight Point Wind, LLC plans to individually notify residents of the proposed Project by mailing informational flyers (via First-Class US Postal Service) announcing the open houses and general project information to all unique addresses in the voting rolls for the Study Area. In addition, the open houses will be properly advertised (with sufficient lead time) at town board meetings, by mailings or emails to stakeholders (including to all Study Area residents as described above), on the Project website, and in the newspapers listed below. It is anticipated that the open houses will be advertised at least two weeks prior to the event.

As part of its mailing to stakeholders on the open houses, Eight Point Wind, LLC will include instructions on how to contact Eight Point Wind, LLC if a stakeholder is unable to attend the open houses and would like to schedule a one-on-one meeting or a webinar.

Eight Point Wind, LLC will publish notices as required by the Article 10 regulations. Notices of PSS and Application filings will be published on the Project website and in the following papers:

- The Evening Tribune, a paid-subscription, daily newspaper with the largest circulation in Steuben County and the newspaper of record for host community towns. http://www.eveningtribune.com/.
- Genesee Valley Pennysaver, a free, weekly advertising paper available at local stores and widely read in the Study Area. http://www.gvpennysaver.com/.
- Tioga Publishing Company publishes two, paid subscription, weekly newspapers

 serving Potter County, PA) that will provide coverage in the Pennsylvania portions of
 the Study Area. http://www.tiogapublishing.com.

In addition to the newspaper notices the stakeholder list will be notified via email or mail (depending on their stated preference) when the PSS and Application filings will be available for review. Copies of the PSS and Application will be distributed to the local repositories and the Project office, in addition to being posted on the Project website.

5.7 Activities Designed to Encourage Stakeholder Participation

All of the activities described above, including the open houses and various forms of stakeholder outreach, have been designed to provide opportunities for stakeholders to participate in the Article 10 certification and compliance process. Consultations will be considered successful if information about the Project and the Article 10 process (including PSS and Application submittal milestones and document availability) was provided to stakeholders in an appropriate and timely manner (as described above), relevant information requested



from the Applicant was gathered and utilized to help advance the PIP process and preparation, submittal and review of the Application, and if follow-up meetings or consultations were scheduled or undertaken, if necessary.

Eight Point Wind, LLC will file the PIP tracking report with the Secretary to the Commission and post it on the Project website, as necessary (likely every one – two months).



6.0 ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE AREAS

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) provides map files of Potential Environmental Justice Areas it identifies as census block groups with populations that meet one or more of the following thresholds:

- 51.1% or more of the population in an urban area reported themselves to be members of minority groups; or
- 33.8% or more of the population in a rural area reported themselves to be members of minority groups; or
- 23.59% or more of the population in an urban or rural area had household incomes below the federal poverty level.

According to a review of NYSDEC's website (www.dec.ny.gov/public/899.html accessed 12/21/15) which utilizes the 2000 Census as its most up to date data source, the closest Potential Environmental Justice Areas to the Project Area are located in Alfred in Allegany County and Hornell in Steuben County – neither of which fall within the Project Area.

- Census Block Group ID 360039508002 is located approximately 1.5 miles west / northwest of the Project Area (at the closest point). This area is in Allegany County in and near the Village of Alfred. It is categorized as a rural area, where 9.87% are minorities and 28.76% are below the federal poverty level.
- Census Block Group ID: 361019609003 is located approximately 0.5 miles north of the Project Area's proposed interconnection point at the existing Bennett Substation. This area is in Steuben County in the city of Hornell. It is categorized as an urban area, where 10.76% are minorities and 30.94% are below the federal poverty level.
- Census Block Group ID: 361019609001 is located approximately 1.0 mile north of the Project Area's proposed interconnection point at the existing Bennett Substation. This area is in Steuben County in the city of Hornell (contiguous with census block 361019609003 above). It is categorized as an urban area, where 5.3% are minorities and 27% are below the federal poverty level.
- Census Block Group ID: 361019608002 is located approximately 1.0 mile north of the Project Area's proposed interconnection point at the existing Bennett Substation. It is in the western portion of the city of Hornell in Steuben County and is categorized as an urban area. The 2000 census statistics show 5.42% are minorities and 31.73% are below the federal poverty level.



Because the areas above are outside of the Project Area, the Project is not expected to negatively impact these or any other environmental justice areas.¹

7.0 LANGUAGE ACCESS

Article 10 regulations require the PIP to identify any language other than English spoken (1) by 5,000 or more persons, according to United States Census data, residing in any 5-digit zip code postal zone in which any portion of such zone is located within the Study Area; and (2) by a significant population of persons residing in close proximity to the proposed facility, alternative locations, or interconnections. Table 1 lists the 5-digit zip codes extending into the Study Area and the most prevalent non-English languages spoken (per US Census Bureau 2010-2014 American Community Survey 5 year estimates). Total population numbers according to the 2010 Census are provided for context, however it should be noted that discrepancies exist between the Total Population figure in some zip codes with the estimated numbers of English / Non- English speaking residents due to population changes over the course of the 5 year estimated period beginning in 2010 and ending in 2014. As shown by Table 1, there are no zip codes touched by the Study Area where 5,000 or more people do not speak English.







