The OPRHP responded on September 10, 2024 determining that the Facility will have an adverse impact to above ground historic resources and requested that a Cultural Resources Mitigation and Offset Plan be prepared for the Facility.  An Archaeological Site Avoidance Plan was submitted to the OPRHP on September 19, 2024. The OPRHP responded on October 8, 2024 recommending one additional protective measure, and otherwise concurring with the avoidance and minimization measures outlined in the plan, and the preparation of a CRAMMP prior to construction. #### (b) Other Applications or Filings

The Applicant does not have, nor are they aware of others having, any other pending applications or filings for any federal or federal-delegated, federal or state recognized Indian Nation, state or local permit, consent, approval or license that concern the subject matter of this Application before ORES other than those noted in Exhibit 25(a).

For a discussion on road permits and approvals associated with oversize/overweight vehicles and deliveries, highway work permits, and associated use and occupancy approvals as needed to construct and operate the Facility see Exhibits 16 and 24. The Applicant is requesting that the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) retain the authority for NYSDOT to administer permits associated with oversize/overweight vehicles and deliveries, highway work permits, and associated use and occupancy approvals as needed to construct and operate the facility in accordance with 16 NYCRR Section 1100-6.1(d)(2) and Section 1100-10.2(e)(8). The NYSDOT permits that are anticipated to be needed include the following:

- Special Use Permit for Oversize/Overweight Vehicles, (New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law § 385) with respect to loading along the horizontal width and vertical heigh restrictions for hauling routes.
- Highway Work Permit (New York State Highway Law, Article 3, §52) for temporary road improvements in New York State highway right-of-ways (ROWs); and
- Highway Use and Occupancy Permit (17 NYCRR Part 131) for the installation of utility facilities, including collection lines, in New York State highway ROWs.
