Re: Case 22-E-0236 - Proceeding to Establish Alternatives to Traditional Demand-Based Rate Structures for Commercial Electric Vehicle Charging.

Dear Carlos Gavilondo:

I received your letter dated February 28, 2023, filed on behalf of the Joint Utilities,¹ requesting a 60-day extension to comply with the directives set forth in the Commission's *Order Establishing Framework for Alternatives to Traditional Demand-Based Rate* (Order), issued January 19, 2023, in the above-referenced proceeding. The filing is currently due March 20, 2023.

The Commission's Order directs the Joint Utilities to file a new program to incentivize EV charging demand management technologies within 60 days of the Order's issuance, or by March 20, 2023. You state that the Joint Utilities are requesting additional time in order to develop the many details and requirements of the new and innovative program. You advise that this extension will not impact the filing of other materials required by the Order.

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The Joint Utilities are Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corporation, Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc., New York State Electric & Gas Corporation, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid, Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc., and Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation.
