#### **IP Closure Task Force**

- Task Force established by statute, membership overlaps with DOB
- Addresses economic, employment impacts of IP plant closure
- Updates on Community and Environmental Fund
  - Sewer Project Inter-municipal agreement reached; \$250K adjustment
  - \$250K for Plumbers and Steamfitters Local 21 for welding training
  - \$500K for environmental assessment at BV Elementary



### **Decommissioning Oversight Board**

- The DOB provides venue for information exchange, oversight coordination, and public engagement
- Our goal is to help ensure that decommissioning is SAFE, PROMPT, AND THOROUGH
  - These were the key public interest principles that guided the agreement to approve the sale of the plant to Holtec
  - Agreement signed by State, AG, Westchester County, Cortlandt, Buchanan, Riverkeeper and others
- Our success is built on mutual respect and communication
  - All questions are answered; When facts show gaps, we seek to fill them



### Filling Oversight Gaps

- Comments to NRC opposing license exemptions
- State Resident Inspector
- Gas pipeline protections and protocols
- Enforceable dust mitigation conditions in local demolition permits
- Monitoring Work Group and Community Air Monitoring Plan
- Grant to School for BV environmental assessment



### **Water Discharge**

- Holtec's plans to continue past practice of discharging treated wastewater to Hudson has generated most public interest to date
- Recommend that we review issue through the lens of the core decommissioning principles: SAFE, PROMPT, AND THOROUGH
  - Riverkeeper suggestions in July does discharge meet drinking water standards?
  - Lochbaum options presentation in February, first review of historical data
  - Guest Presentations in February No safe level of radiation, concerned standards are outdated
  - Public Forum in March, Lochbaum's analysis of historical data
  - Holtec's announcements in April, pause for additional engagement
  - Public Statement Hearing on April 25
- Gaps identified: More information exchange; Independent sampling before discharges commence;
   NRC answers; Holtec engagement with Host Community's leaders




# Discharges from Indian Point



State Radiologic Surveillance



Monthly water samples are collected at three locations:

- the point of intake\*
- the point of discharge
- in Verplanck.(blue markers)

A weekly air sample is taken at a nearby meteorological tower. (yellow marker) •

Three quarterly ambient gamma measurements (purple TLD marker)



<sup>\*</sup> Once the reactors shut down, sampling at the intake stopped, and sampling upstream at Roseton started.

### Department of Health surveillance data

- The Department of Health's laboratory performs a comprehensive radiologic analysis of the water samples. This analysis will measure tritium, gross alpha, gross beta, and gamma emitting radionuclides.
- Samples taken at the Point of Discharge and Roseton are composites samples of water that are representative of the contaminant levels through out the month.

#### **Tritium measurements near Indian Point**

- Results are reported in picocuries per liter (pCi/l). The only isotope that
  has results above background levels is the monthly tritium. Background
  is that level of radioactivity which is seen in unaffected locations around
  the state.
- Most tritium results are consistent with measurements taken at background (unaffected) locations around the state but approximately 25% of them are elevated.
- The EPA's Maximum Contaminant Limit (MCL) for drinking water is 20,000 pCi/L. The highest result during plant operations over last 15 year period was 3,800 pCi/L at the point of discharge, which is less than 20% of the drinking water standard.

### **Future sampling**

- Working with other state agencies and Holtec, the Department of Health is planning to take split samples of water that Holtec intends to discharge. The protocol for sampling prior to release is under discussion with Holtec to confirm timing and logistics.
- These samples will be analyzed for tritium, gross alpha, gross beta, and fission products, and other non-radiologic elements.
- The Department of Health will review the results and share them with the Decommissioning Oversight Board so this information can be posted on the DOB's website.
- Department of Health measurements at end of discharge canal will continue.

## NYSDEC Jurisdiction over Wastewater Discharges from Indian Point

- Holtec operates pursuant to a NY SPDES Permit.
- SPDES permit governs non-radiological discharges from the facility.
- Current Status: The Indian Point SPDES Permit for Main Facility discharges expired on April 30, 2022. Holtec submitted a timely renewal application and facility continues to have coverage under the existing SPDES permit pursuant to the State Administrative Procedure Act.
- SPDES Permit Renewal Process:
  - NYSDEC will conduct a full technical review to determine if changes to the SPDES permit are necessary.
  - As part of this process, Holtec must submit to DEC comprehensive data, including identifying and characterizing the non-radiological waste stream.
  - DEC will review this information to determine appropriate effluent parameters and limits.
  - Once the application has been deemed complete, a draft SPDES permit will be noticed for public comment.




