Dear Ms. Brillling,

I am writing to urge the Public Service Commission to continue its support of renewable energy by increasing the net metering limit of PVC generated electricity from 1.2 MW to 3.0 MW when it reviews Case #PSC-18-07-00011-P and to please make sure this case is reviewed at the Commission's next meeting.

Renewable energy technologies are an important piece of the governor's stated energy policy and economic development strategy for many counties in New York, several in Central Hudson's territory. The solar electric industry has been expanding steadily as interest and opportunity grows. When interested consumers learn however that net metering has been suspended, it discourages and destabilizes the emerging market. We need to be encouraging and supporting all efforts at moving away from fossil fuel energy sources. Time for change is upon us. And now, the New York State Assembly & Senate have approved legislation that would help expand the net meter limit even further – a very good step in the right direction.

By supporting the increased net metering limit (and ultimately, no limit at all), the PSC is also supporting the governor's energy policy as well as a growing base of eager consumers and informed voters who believe in an expanded renewable energy future.
