Re: (1) Case 13-M-0412 – Petition of New York State Energy Research and Development Authority to Provide Initial Capitalization for the New York Green Bank, and (2) Case 03-E-0188 – Petition for NY-Sun Funding Considerations and Other Program Modifications

Dear Secretary Burgess:

I write to urge the Public Service Commission to consider the recommendations made in a recent comment submission to the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority's (NYSERDA) proposals regarding the New York Green Bank (NYGB) and the NY-Sun Initiative that would allow low-to-moderate income ratepayers (LMIs) to further participate in the renewable energy programs. Between 2005 and 2015, LMI ratepayers will have paid an estimated \$460 million to the Renewable Portfolio Standard, even though they are largely unable to afford to take advantage of the incentive programs funded by this surcharge. I believe that as long as LMI ratepayers are helping to financially support renewable energy programs, they should be enabled to fully participate if they desire.

This proposal would establish a pilot program targeted towards LMI ratepayers that would offer escalated incentives for the installation of 7 megawatts of solar energy capacity, and would also implement a public-private partnership with the NYGB to create a sustainable long-term financing mechanism that would more easily allow LMI ratepayers to afford the installation of solar infrastructure.

The Commission has already has demonstrated its commitment to expanding affordable energy programs to LMI households, through its Weatherization Assistance Program, Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, EmPower New York Program, and Assisted Home Performance with ENERGY STAR[®] Program. I believe that the implementation of these

recommendations is a logical step to foster increased participation of the LMI population in NYSERDA's existing and future programs.
