

PURPOSE: NOTICE OF PUBLIC STATEMENT HEARINGS ON NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION'S GAS MULTI-YEAR AND RESTRUCTURING PLAN.

TEXT: The New York State Public Service Commission will hold public statement hearings before Administrative Law Judge Walter T. Moynihan for public comment on the petition on Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation (Niagara Mohawk) for approval of a multi-year gas rate and restructuring proposal. Niagara Mohawk and other parties are seeking approval of a Settlement that involves changes in rate design, practices, and economic arrangements affecting natural gas. Some of the key elements of the Settlement include.

1. A gas revenue requirement freeze at levels in effect as of October 31, 1999 for the full three years and ten months of the Settlement.
2. Unbundling revisions to rate design for gas service effectuated on an overall revenue-neutral basis
3. Implementation of various provisions to improve retail access to a competitive gas market.
4. Financial incentives to Niagara Mohawk related to customer service quality, gas safety, reliability, etc.
5. Programs to reinforce the cathodic protection of wrapped steel distribution main, and to assess the accuracy of their billing factors.

The Commission may adopt in whole or part the terms of the proposed Settlement or may reject them all in favor of a solution not proposed by any party. To help guide its decision-making process, the Commission is eager to receive the views of the public. The public statement hearings will be held:

Speakers will be called after completing a card requesting time to speak. Each public statement hearing will remain open for at least one hour and will continue until all persons wishing to comment have been heard, or other reasonable arrangements are made.



And to me, as a person growing up, and all the times that I had questions in life and all the guidance that he's given me," the younger Woods said.

"My dad always took me out and we practiced and played and had a lot of fun competing against each other. Those are the times you look back on and you reminisce and you miss."

Woods was so far in front of the field, he might as well have been playing by himself. Leading by a record 10 strokes at the start of the day, he had four birdies in a span of five holes on the back nine Sunday while relentlessly marching to his third major title.

Woods' 15-stroke margin not only shattered the Open mark of 11 set by Willie Smith in 1899, but was the largest in any major championship — surpassing the 13-stroke victory by Old Tom Morris in the 1862 British Open.

Woods, the first player in Open history to finish 72



PURPOSE: NOTICE OF PUBLIC STATEMENT HEARINGS ON NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION'S GAS MULTI-YEAR RATE AND RESTRUCTURING PLAN

TEXT: The New York State Public Service Commission will hold public statement hearings before Administrative Law Judge Walter T. Moynihan for public comment on the petition of Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation (Niagara Mohawk) for approval of a multi-year gas rate and restructuring proposal. Niagara Mohawk and other parties are seeking approval of a Settlement that involves changes in rate design, practices, and economic arrangements affecting natural gas. Some of the key elements of the Settlement include:

1. A gas revenue requirement freeze at levels in effect as of October 31, 1999 for the full three years and ten months of the Settlement.
2. Unbundling revisions to rate design for gas service effectuated on an overall revenue-neutral basis.
3. Implementation of various provisions to improve retail access to a competitive gas market.
4. Financial incentives to Niagara Mohawk related to customer service quality, gas safety, reliability, etc.
5. Programs to reinforce the cathodic protection of wrapped steel distribution main, and to assess the accuracy of therm billing factors.

The commission may adopt in whole or part the terms of the proposed Settlement or may reject them all in favor of a solution not proposed by any party. To help guide its decision-making process, the Commission is eager to receive the views of the public. The public statement hearings will be held:

Lansing hits for the cycle

Mike Lansing got the hard part of the cycle out of the way early. In fact, the whole thing only took four innings.

Lansing tripled in the first inning, homered in the second, doubled in the third and finished the cycle in the fourth with a single as the Colorado Rockies routed the Arizona Diamondbacks 19-2 Sunday.

"I never had a cycle, never at any time," said Lansing, who went 4-for-5 with five RBI. "It's particularly satisfying to have a big game when we needed it."

Colorado, which had 23 hits and moved into first place in the NL West for the first time in four years, tied its record for runs, set against Atlanta on June 7, 1996.

Chicago White Sox are proving they're for real. And they don't plan on going away any time soon. The White Sox knocked out Orlando Hernandez in the first inning and extended their season-high winning streak to seven games with a 17-4 rout of the New York Yankees on Sunday.

Jose Valentin's fifth career grand slam highlighted a nine-run first inning as Chicago improved its major league-leading record to 44-24.

"We realize that at any given time, this could all crumble," winning pitcher Jim Parque said. "But that's only if you let it crumble. That's not going to happen to this team. We're just staying focused."

Chicago completed an undefeated seven-game road trip against Cleveland and the Yankees, including a four-game sweep of the defending World Series champions.

"We knew it was going to be tough, and we were going to face good teams," Valentin said. "We didn't come out expecting to sweep them."

Valentin and Carlos Lee each had four RBI as the White Sox tied a team record with their 11th straight road victory.

NEW YORK (AP) — The struggling New York Yankees might have more than just a losing streak to worry about.

Orlando Hernandez, who gave up nine runs in two-thirds of an inning in Sunday's 17-4 loss to the Chicago White Sox, was taken to Beth Israel North after the game.

X-rays and an MRI test revealed that the 30-year-old right-hander has an elbow sprain.

The team said the injury will be treated with rest and that Hernandez will be evaluated on a daily basis prior to the scheduling of his next start.

White Sox, who became the first visitors to score at least 17 runs at Yankee Stadium since Cleveland on Aug. 4, 1990.

Chicago got to work quickly against Hernandez (6-6), who allowed all nine first-inning runs in his worst outing of the season. He got just two outs, threw 49 pitches, gave up six hits and walked three.

It was the most Chicago scored in an opening inning since a nine-run first in a 10-3 victory at Minnesota on April 19, 1962.

Even the most confident teams can be turned fragile in the heat of the playoffs, but the Pacers insist they're the team to mount one of the most remarkable finals upsets in history.

"It's tough trying to make history. We're probably the biggest underdogs in history," Rose said. "Any time you beat a team by 30 you have momentum, but any time you're the team with three wins you have the cards in your favor."

"We need to find a way to turn the tide, and once we get into a Game 7 anything can happen."

The Lakers were the NBA's most consistent team during the regular season, losing consecutive games only three times on the way to a league-best 67-15 record. But during the playoffs, the Lakers have routinely taken nights off — particularly when the final victory of a series was in sight.

Their most recent subdued performance came on Friday night in Game 5, the Pacers' 120-87 thrashing of Los Angeles.

"I don't know why we couldn't come back on them," the Lakers' Robert Horry said. "They just kept shooting the ball so well for so long. We never had that killer instinct to get back in it that we had the first two games out there."

The Lakers wouldn't be the first champions to struggle like this. Even Michael Jordan's final Bulls championship team was beaten soundly at home by the Utah Jazz in Game 5 of the 1998 finals, forcing Jordan to play the final game of his career in Salt Lake City instead of Chicago.

But the Lakers don't have the championship history of the Bulls or the undeniable will of Jordan, who won every finals series he ever played in. What the Lakers do have is several discouraging performances under pressure in the past two months.

"This team is still finding out how tough it can be," Lakers coach Phil Jackson said. "We've had some serious ups and downs in just the last two weeks or so."

In the opening round, Jimenez shot a 5-under 66 to keep Woods within sight, only one shot ahead. But the Spaniard slumped to a 74 the following day, dropping five more shots to the leader. By nightfall Saturday, Jimenez had no chance after a wind-swept 76.

Earlier that day, Els pushed his way near the top of the leaderboard with a brilliant 68, somehow managing to blast through the gusts that sent many players spiraling into the 80s. His only reward, however, was getting to play with Woods in the final pairing of the day.

By then, Tiger had a 10-stroke lead, with Sunday set aside as his coronation. Els failed to challenge his playing partner in the least, struggling to a 72. Not that it mattered.

"My putter kind of let me down today," Els said. "My whole game is not quite there. I threw away a lot of shots around the green this week."

Jimenez, nicknamed "The Mechanic" in a misguided reference to his love of driving high-speed cars, had a chance to finish second all by himself. But he took a bogey at the final hole after dumping his

third shot into a bunker in front of the green. He missed a 15-footer to save par and settled for a closing 71.

Els and Woods came along next at the 543-yard hole. The South African went for the green in two and wound up in the right rough. There was a slight delay while he re-spotted his ball, which someone had stepped on.

Els flopped a shot onto the green and putted out for par, leaving the stage to Woods.

"I don't know how much more there is to say," Els said. "We've been talking about him for two years. I guess we'll be talking about him for the next 20 years. We're not in the same ballpark right now. When he's on, you don't have much of a chance."

Well, there was one, last chance to beat Tiger. He could have been disqualified for signing the wrong scorecard.

"I said to Tiger that he better check his card," Els said. "Otherwise, me and Jimenez have to have a playoff."

Maybe. Maybe not.

"I learned the hard way, I guess," said the 49-year-old driver, who has two career victories on the mountaintop. "I wrecked here in '79 and broke a collarbone and bruised my heart. In '82, I wrecked here and broke my leg."

The only thing Tony Stewart has broken in his 1½ seasons are records. He got them by winning three times, and posting a fourth-place finish in points last season — now the standards for rookies.

Along the way, he had finishes of fourth and sixth at difficult Pocono, the ultra-flat track with three extremely sharp turns through differing degrees of banking. But he says rain the last two days should mean a feeling-out process early in the race.

"For the first 10 laps it will be just the way it was after Happy Hour on Saturday," Stewart said. "The track will be green."

By that he means there will be no

rubber on the asphalt. After two days of practice and the ARCA race the track had been seeded.

UEFA could expel England

AMSTERDAM, The Netherlands (AP) — With England threatened with expulsion for its fans' misconduct, Euro 2000 is fixated less on who will win than on how to keep the away.

The threat from the European soccer federation (UEFA) came after a weekend of hooliganism by British fans, who smashed stores and bars, bashed up cars, hurled racial taunts and picked fights with German supporters and Belgian police.

Police said 56 people were injured and some 850 detained for deportation, nearly all Britons.

After an emergency meeting, UEFA's executive committee said England — seeking a berth in the quarterfinals of the European championships — would be thrown out of the championship if such behavior was repeated before or at Tuesday's match against Romania.

"UEFA will have to consider the future presence of the English team if there is any more violence," said UEFA chief executive Gerhard Aigner.

Sampras falls in Queens final

LONDON (AP) — Beating six-time Wimbledon champion Pete Sampras in the Queens' Club tournament gives Australian teen-ager Lleyton Hewitt a good shot at winning his first Grand Slam event.

Hewitt upset second-seeded Sampras 6-4, 6-4 Sunday to win the Queen's Club, the major men's warmup for Wimbledon.

"It gives me a lot of confidence going into Wimbledon," Hewitt said. "I couldn't be hitting the ball much better. It's a great feeling and a self-belief on grass to have a victory like that."

Hewitt beat Sampras for the first time in four meetings and won his fourth title of the season. He served nine aces to only five for Sampras.

"It's a dream come true," Hewitt said. "To be out there playing a guy that I've looked up to for so many years and have so much respect for, and to have won in straight sets in the final of a great event is a dream."
