NEW YORK (AP) — The struggling New York Yankees might have more than just a losing streak to worry about.

Örlando Hernandez, who gave up nine runs in two-thirds of an inning in Sunday's 17-4 loss to the Chicago White Sox, was taken to Beth Israel North after the game.

X-ravs and an MRI test revealed that the 30-year-old right-hander has an elbow sprain.

The team said the injury will be treated with rest and that Hernandez will be evaluated on a daily basis prior to the scheduling of his next start.

"Records are great, but you don't really pay attention to that," Woods said. "The only thing I know is I got the trophy sitting right next to me. To perform the way I did, and on one of the greatest venues in golf, it doesn't get much better than that."

thanks to three strong performances at Conseco Fieldhouse, they know the Lakers are nowhere close to unbeatable.

Even the most confident teams can be turned fragile in the heat of the playoffs, but the Pacers insist they're the team to mount one of the most remarkable finals upsets in history.

"It's tough trying to make history. We're probably the biggest underdogs in history," Rose said. "Any time you beat a team by 30 you have momentum, but any time you're the team with three wins you have the cards in your favor.

"We need to find a way to turn the tide, and once we get into a Game 7 anything can happen.'

The Lakers were the NBA's most consistent team during the regular season, losing consecutive games only three times on the way to a league-best 67-15 record. But during the playoffs, the Lakers have routinely taken nights off --- particularly when the final victory of a series was in sight.

Their most recent subdued performance came on Friday night in Game 5, the Pacers' 120-87 thrashing of Los Angeles.

"I don't know why we couldn't come back on them," the Lakers' Robert Horry said. "They just kept shooting the ball so well for so long. We never had that killer instinct to get back in it that we had the first two games out there.'

The Lakers wouldn't be the first champions to struggle like this. Even Michael Jordan's final Bulls championship team was beaten soundly at home by the Utah Jazz in Game 5 of the 1998 finals, forcing Jordan to play the final game of his career in Salt Lake City instead of Chicago.

But the Lakers don't have the championship history of the Bulls or the undeniable will of Jordan, who won every finals series he ever played in. What the Lakers do have is several discouraging performances under pressure in the past two months.

"This team is still finding out how tough it can be," Lakers coach Phil Jackson said. "We've had some serious ups and downs in just the last two weeks or so."

Hewitt upset second-seeded Sampras 6-4, 6-4 Sunday to win the Queen's Club, the major men's warmup for Wimbledon.

"It gives me a lot of confidence going into Wimbledon," Hewitt said. "I couldn't be hitting the ball much better. It's a great feeling and a selfbelief on grass to have a victory like that."

Hewitt beat Sampras for the first time in four meetings and won his fourth title of the season. He served nine aces to only five for Sampras.

"It's a dream come true," Hewitt said. "To be out there playing a guy that I've looked up to for so many years and have so much respect for, and to have won in straight sets in the final of a great event is a dream."

AMSTERDAM. The Netherlands (AP) — With England threatened with expulsion for its fans' misconduct, Euro 2000 is fixated less on will win than on how to keep the

away.

he threat from the European soccer federation (UEFA) came after a weekend of hooliganism by British fans, who smashed stores and bars, bashed up cars, hurled racial taunts and picked fights with German supporters and Belgian police.

Police said 56 people were injured and some 850 detained for deportation, nearly all Britons.

After an emergency meeting, UEFA's executive committee said England — seeking a berth in the quarterfinals of the European championships — would be thrown out of the championship if such behavior was repeated before or at Tuesday's match against Romania.

"UEFA will have to consider the future presence of the English team if there is any more violence," said UEFA chief executive Gerhard Aigner.


